a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Career and job skills experiences for high school and college students interested in biomedicine and conservation. Veterinarians and scientists will supervise students in a service-learning setting emphasizing animal care and conservation medicine working with nonhuman primates (NHP). Demand for NHP is surging in biomedicine and from competition from China, increasing the need for a skilled and compassionate workforce in the lab, zoos and native habitats to provide care and conserve species.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Under the supervision of and collaboration with veterinarians and faculty, work plans and instructional and training materials will be developed; students will be recruited and work directly with the animals and receive instruction on their care, welfare, and conservation; and students will receive exposure to career opportunities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This is a hands-on, service-learning opportunity, working alongside experienced professionals, in the high demand fields of animal care and medicine and the related field of conservation focused on nonhuman primates. The services shall be utilized to attract the maximum amount of at-risk youth participants from the community possible.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

High school and college students as well as at risk youth. The number of individuals to be served is expected to range between 51 and 100.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will improve the ability of Florida students to compete for jobs in the biomedical, zoo and conservation fields through training experiences focused on the care of nonhuman primates. The outcome will be measured by the roster of students who successfully complete service learning programs and of those who go on to related jobs in industry, zoos, etc., or to higher level education.
