The Rolling Oaks neighborhood has only one entrance and exit: SW 178th Avenue. This roadway is prone to flooding, which creates emergency hazards for the approximately 350 homes in the neighborhood. When the only roadway into the neighborhood is under water, it delays response times for emergency services thereby placing lives at risk. The purpose of this project is multi-faceted, with one objective set to reduce stormwater staging on SW 178th Avenue, and the other to significantly increase water quality by reducing the amount of nutrients that get introduced into our primary and secondary canals.

### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The project goal is to provide flood relief and improved water quality to all our constituents. This project is part of the Town's overall resiliency efforts to create a healthy community while improving water quality. This project will remove flood waters from roads in this heavily traveled area. It will provide critical drainage capacity for storm-water runoff, thereby reducing roadway flooding (both volume and duration), and the frequency of property damage and personal injury.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

The Stormwater Master Plan recommends adding a drainage trunkline along SW 178th Avenue between SW 52nd Court and the canal at 5450 SW 178th Avenue. The trunkline will be constructed along approximately 1,000 linear feet of SW178th Avenue. The proposed project includes the conveyance, trunkline and outfall pipes with 21 proposed structures. All existing swales are to be regraded. Concrete aprons on both existing and proposed drains are to be renewed or designed to mitigate the surrounding landscaped area's impedance of roadway runoff flow.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

The Rolling Oaks neighborhood has only one entrance and exit: SW 178th Avenue. This roadway is prone to flooding, which creates emergency hazards for the approximately 350 homes in the neighborhood. The project will remove flood waters from the roadway. It will provide critical drainage capacity for storm-water runoff, thereby reducing roadway flooding and the frequency of property damage and personal injury to motorists and pedestrians.

The execution of this project will provide flood relief to all of our constituents. It is a highly traveled area that serves as an emergency access route during evacuations and other emergency purposes.

The purpose of this project is multi-faceted, with one objective set to reduce stormwater staging in the basin and the other to significantly increase water quality. The outcomes will be measured through water quality testing and basin capacity reports.
