Keystone Point and Sans Souci are the two subdivisions located along the City of North Miami's eastern shoreline. When these subdivisions were developed, the canal ends were constructed to prevent soil erosion, not designed as seawalls therefore structural integrity was not considered at the time. In 1998, the city received a Federal Emergency Management grant to reconstruct nineteen (19) of the twenty-eight (28) seawalls. There are seven (7) retaining walls that need reconstruction to ensure structural integrity in the event of storm-related tidal surges. This project will elevate the seven (7) retaining walls, providing structural integrity.

The proposed project aims to reduce flooding by ensuring the structural integrity of this flood mitigation infrastructure and critical underground utilities that are in close proximity to the seawalls.

The project will elevate seven (7) retaining seawalls to protect against storm-related tidal surges and the growing impacts of climate change.

The proposed project's expected outcome is the rehabilitation of seven (7) seawalls, mitigating storm surge risk.
