#### **CS/CS/HB 1365, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Health & Human Services Committee, Judiciary Committee, Representative Garrison and others—**

**Unauthorized Public Camping and Public Sleeping;** Prohibits counties & municipalities from authorizing or otherwise allowing public camping or sleeping on public property without certification of designated public property by DCF; authorizes counties to designate public property for such uses for specified time period; requires counties to establish specified standards & procedures relating to such property; authorizes DCF to inspect such property & to issue notice; provides exception during specified emergencies. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

### **SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR TUESDAY, MARCH 5, 2024**

#### **SB 1396 (SO) by Senator Gruters and others—**

**Security for Jewish Day Schools and Preschools;** Subject to and consistent with funds appropriated from the General Appropriations Act, requiring the Department of Education to establish a program to provide funds to full-time Jewish day schools and preschools for specified security purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

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#### **CS/SB 1466 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Grall—**

**Residential Tenancies;** Defining the term “Florida financial institution” for purposes of part II of ch. 83, F.S., etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/HB 1305(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

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#### **CS/CS/SB 1474 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Health Policy and Senator Trumbull—**

**Chiropractic Medicine;** Revising the definition of the term “practice of chiropractic medicine” to include a specified treatment; revising education requirements for licensure as a chiropractic physician; requiring the Board of Chiropractic Medicine to establish minimum standards of practice for the performance of dry needling by chiropractic physicians, including specified education and training requirements and restrictions on such practice, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

*Identical to CS/CS/HB 1063, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/CS/SB 1486 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Collins—**

**Permanency for Children;** Requiring the Department of Children and Families to conduct a criminal history records check of certain persons; authorizing specified persons to initiate a proceeding if both parents of a child are deceased or the last known living parent is deceased and a legal custodian has not been appointed for the child through a probate or guardianship proceeding; authorizing certain persons to remove a child from a court-ordered placement under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

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**CS/SB 1492 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Trumbull—**

**Employment Regulations;** Prohibiting a political subdivision from requiring employers to meet or provide heat exposure requirements beyond those required by law; prohibiting a political subdivision from giving preference to or considering or seeking information from an employer in a competitive solicitation based on or relating to an employer's heat exposure requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/CS/SB 1544 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Regulated Industries and Senator Hooper—**

**Department of Business and Professional Regulation;** Requiring persons or entities licensed or permitted by the department's Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco, or applying for such license or permit, to create and maintain an account with the division's online system and provide an e-mail address to the division; expanding an exemption from certain engineering licensing requirements under ch. 471, F.S., to include regular full-time employees of certain business organizations, rather than regular full-time employees of certain corporations licensed under ch. 471, F.S.; revising the requirements for the issuance of a license under the Beverage Law, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/SB 1624 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Collins—**

**Energy Resources;** Providing that resilience facilities are a permitted use in certain land use categories in local government comprehensive plans and specified districts if certain criteria are met; prohibiting amendments after a specified date to a local government's comprehensive plan, land use map, zoning districts, or land development regulations if such amendments would conflict with resiliency facility classification; requiring the Department of Management Services to develop a Florida Humane Preferred Energy Products List in consultation with the Department of Commerce and the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; including development districts as a type of political subdivision for purposes of preemption over utility service restrictions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

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**CS/CS/SB 1656 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice and Senator Martin—**

**Child Exploitation Offenses;** Creating the offense of lewd or lascivious grooming; ranking the offense on the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code; revising the ranking of specified child exploitation offenses for purposes of the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 1798 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Trumbull—**

**Home Health Care Services;** Authorizing advanced practice registered nurses and physician assistants to order or write prescriptions for certain Medicaid services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/CS/SB 7042 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Avila)—**

**Commodities Produced by Forced Labor;** Prohibiting a company on the forced labor vendor list from taking certain procurement actions; requiring a company to provide a certain notification to the Department of Management Services within a certain timeframe; requiring the department to create and maintain a forced labor vendor list; providing a process for the department to place a company on such list, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**SB 7058 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Avila)—**

**Criminal History Checks for the Florida State Guard;** Requiring applicants for the Florida State Guard to submit a complete set of fingerprints to the Division of the State Guard or other specified entity, vendor, or agency; requiring that the division or such entity, vendor, or agency forward the fingerprints to the Department of Law Enforcement for processing and that the department forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check; requiring the Department of Military Affairs, and authorizing the division, to review certain results and make a specified determination, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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**SB 7068 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice (Bradley)—**

**Pretrial Detention Hearings;** Authorizing a court to base certain orders of pretrial detention solely on hearsay, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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**CS/HB 347 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary Committee and Representative Truenow—**

**Exemptions from Products Liability Actions;** Specifies circumstances under which products liability actions may not be brought against agricultural employers, distributors, dealers, or applicators. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

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**CS/SB 84 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Book and others—**

**Transportation Facility Designations/Jimmy Buffett Highway;** Providing an honorary designation of a certain transportation facility in specified counties; directing the Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 266 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Transportation, Senator Hooper and others—**

**Transportation;** Prohibiting the Department of Transportation from annually committing more than a certain percentage of revenues derived from state fuel taxes and motor vehicle license-related fees to public transit projects; authorizing the Department of Transportation to enter into comprehensive agreements with private entities or the consortia thereof for the building, operation, ownership, or financing of transportation facilities; prohibiting a local governmental entity from adopting certain standards or specifications concerning asphalt pavement material; requiring the department to receive three letters of interest before proceeding with requests for proposals for certain contracts, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

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**SB 436 (SO) by Senator Grall—**

**Pregnancy and Parenting Resources Website;** Requiring the Department of Health, in consultation with the Department of Children and Families and the Agency for Health Care Administration, to maintain a website that provides information and links to certain pregnancy and parenting resources; requiring each department and the agency to provide a clear and conspicuous link to the website on their respective websites; requiring the Department of Health to contract with a third party to develop the website by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to **CS/HB 415(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 516 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Rodriguez—**

**Emergency Refills of Insulin and Insulin-related Supplies or Equipment;** Authorizing pharmacists to dispense an emergency refill of insulin and insulin-related supplies or equipment a specified number of times per year, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 201(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 574 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Burgess—**

**In-store Servicing of Alcoholic Beverages;** Authorizing the in-store servicing of distilled spirits sold by a distributor to a vendor; defining the term “in-store servicing”, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 709(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 658 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator DiCeglie—**

**Cybersecurity Incident Liability;** Providing that a county, municipality, other political subdivision of the state, commercial entity, or third-party agent that complies with certain requirements is not liable in connection with a cybersecurity incident; requiring certain entities to adopt certain revised frameworks or standards within a specified time period; specifying that the defendant in certain actions has a certain burden of proof, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 796 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Criminal Justice, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Avila and others—**

**Anti-human Trafficking;** Extending the future repeal date of the direct-support organization for the Statewide Council on Human Trafficking; revising the hotline telephone number to be included in human trafficking awareness signs; revising applicability of provisions governing the employment of minors by vendors licensed under the Beverage Law; requiring that contractors with governmental entities attest that they do not use coercion for labor or services; prohibiting the employment of persons younger than 21 years of age in adult entertainment establishments, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

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**CS/CS/SB 830 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Health Policy, Senator Collins and others—**

**Student Cardiac and Medical Emergencies;** Citing this act as the “HeartCharged Act”; requiring each public school to have at least one automated external defibrillator on school grounds; encouraging each public school to establish public and private partnerships and seek gifts, grants, and other donations for specified purposes; providing immunity from liability for school employees and students under the Good Samaritan Act and the Cardiac Arrest Survival Act; revising the requirements for certain athletic coaches to include certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, first aid, and the use of an automatic external defibrillator, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 846 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator DiCeglie—**

**Risk Retention Groups;** Revising the definition of the term “motor vehicle liability policy” to include policies of liability insurance issued by certain risk retention groups, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/SB 896 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Martin—**

**Health Care Practitioners and Massage Therapy;** Requiring that a certain annual report required of the Department of Health include specified data; requiring the department to immediately suspend the license of massage therapists and massage establishments under certain circumstances; revising quorum requirements for the Board of Massage Therapy; prohibiting sexual activity and certain related activities in massage establishments; revising advertising requirements and prohibitions for massage therapists and massage establishments; requiring the department’s investigators to request valid government identification from all employees while in a massage establishment, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

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## **SB 910 (SO) by Senator Rouson—**

**Public Records/Veterans Treatment and Mental Health Court Programs;** Providing public records exemptions for specified veterans treatment court program records and mental health court program records, respectively; authorizing disclosure of confidential and exempt information under certain circumstances; providing for future legislative review and repeal; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

*Identical to **CS/HB 715(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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## **CS/CS/SB 954 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Regulated Industries and Senator Gruters—**

**Certified Public Accountants;** Authorizing certain certified public accountants to apply to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to place their licenses on retired status; providing that a licensee loses retired status; authorizing a retired licensee to accept certain reimbursements or per diem amounts; prohibiting a retired licensee from offering or rendering certain professional services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

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## **CS/CS/SB 964 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Calatayud—**

**Coverage for Biomarker Testing;** Requiring the Department of Management Services to provide coverage of biomarker testing for specified purposes for state employees' state group health insurance plan policies issued on or after a specified date; requiring state group health insurance plans to provide enrollees and participating providers with a clear and convenient process for authorization requests for biomarker testing; authorizing the Agency for Health Care Administration to pay for biomarker testing under the Medicaid program for specified purposes, subject to specific appropriations; requiring that Medicaid recipients and participating providers be provided a clear and convenient process for authorization requests for biomarker testing, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

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## **CS/CS/CS/SB 996 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Education, the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 and Senator Burgess—**

**Education;** Providing that an annual application for exemption on property used to house a charter school is not required; prohibiting members of the board of trustees of a Florida College System institution or a state university, respectively, from doing business with or having any business affiliation with any institution under their purview during their membership; authorizing private schools to use or purchase specified facilities; establishing the Purple Star School District Program; providing requirements for such program; requiring school districts and charter schools to provide certain students with an opportunity to take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery and consult with a military recruiter; prohibiting a public postsecondary institution from implicitly or explicitly prohibiting specified students from being employed, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

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## **CS/SB 1000 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator DiCeglie and others—**

**Public Records/Recording Notification Service;** Providing that certain information submitted to the clerk of the circuit court or property appraiser for the purpose of registering for a recording notification service or a related service is confidential and exempt from public records requirements; providing for retroactive application; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **CS/CS/HB 285, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/CS/SB 1006 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Perry—**

**Nicotine Products and Dispensing Devices;** Requiring nicotine product manufacturers who sell nicotine dispensing products in this state to execute and deliver a form, under penalty of perjury, to the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation for each dispensing device sold within this state which meets certain criteria; providing penalties for certain violations by manufacturers; prohibiting the sale, shipment, or distributing of certain nicotine dispensing devices from being sold for retail sale in this state; providing criminal penalties for the unlawful sale or dealing of unlisted nicotine dispensing devices; providing for the seizure and destruction of unlawful nicotine dispensing devices in accordance with the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

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**CS/SB 1074 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Calatayud—**

**Debt Relief Services;** Providing an exception from specified provisions for telemarketers and sellers who provide debt relief services under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Commerce and Tourism reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*
