The City received \$150,000 from the CARES Act which reimbursed out-of-pocket expenditures related to the response to the pandemic such as legal time, masks, temperature scanners, etc. Additionally, the City has received public safety grants for the purchase of ATVs, UTVs, and smart boards in the amount of \$115,000. Finally, Panama City Beach has received the first half of the American Infrastructure Funds totaling \$3,151,120 which will likely be spent on utility infrastructure projects.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The Panama City Beach Police Department (PCBPD) will enhance their capabilities in training K9/handler teams in the areas of patrol (including officer protection, suspect apprehension, area or building clearance, etc.), detection (finding narcotics or explosives), and tracking missing/endangered persons by constructing a dedicated facility for training and safely boarding K9s. This facility will also host training for other agencies' K9s and handlers from throughout the State of Florida.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The proposed K9 Training facility will bring a new level of excellence to the Panama City Beach Police Department's K9 unit and serve as a hub for regional K9 training efforts. The facility will include state-of-the-art kennels and training spaces, as well as dedicated classroom space for personnel training.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed K9 Training facility will be a catalyst for excellence in K9 training and a boon to public safety. Through the funding requested, the Panama City Beach Police Department's K9 unit will have access to FDLE certified patrol K9 schools, providing new K9 teams with the comprehensive training they need to effectively serve the community.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

General. (The majority of funds will benefit no specific group). More than 800.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The specific measure of the benefit or outcome of the K9 Training facility project would be improved public safety as a result of a more highly trained and effective K9 unit and improved K9 capabilities across the region through hosted training sessions for other agencies. Monitoring changes in crime rates and incidents that the K9 unit was involved in solving can provide a quantitative measure of the unit's effectiveness. Regular evaluations of the K9s' performance in areas such as patrol, detection, and tracking can further reinforce this measurement.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard Contract penalties are sufficient.
