HBI requested and received \$3,352,100 in Federal Stimulus Funds in fiscal year 2020. Those funds were used to protect company payroll and ensure no layoffs were necessary during a time of revenue uncertainty. In June 2021, the Small Business Administration provided a determination letter that HBI utilized the funds for their intended purpose and the entire loan balance was "forgiven."

#### 14. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose is to increase in public safety and reduction in recidivism by offering vocational certifications, job readiness, and placement services to offenders on community supervision. The goal is to increase in public safety and reduction in recidivism by offering vocational certifications and job readiness to inmates/prisoners in correctional institutions. Split funds and sérvices, as well as fees for services, as follows:

- Four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000): offenders on community supervision
- o Program Participation: \$6,500/participant,
- o OSHA 10: \$150/participant,
- o Employment Placement: \$3,600/participant,
- o Raise/Promotion in Employment: \$2,400/participant, o Post-Secondary Education: \$2,500/participant, and
- o Administrative Fee: \$193,500.
- Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000): inmates/prisoners in correctional institutions
- o Program Participation: \$6,500/participant

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Participants will be provided with orientation, assessment, individualized career plan, employment skills, job search development, and vocational services. In addition, for offenders on community supervision, job placement assistance, job retention and follow-up services, progress reports, and discharge summaries will be provided.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

HBI prepares individuals with the skills and experience needed for successful careers through pre-apprenticeship training, certification programs textbooks and curricula, and job placement services. The program will provide offenders on community supervision and inmates/prisoners in correctional institutions a chance to learn about careers in the construction trades and earn an industry recognized pre-apprenticeship credential. In addition, for offenders on community supervision, the program will assist with job placement linkages.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Adult offenders on community supervision and inmates/prisoners in correctional institutions who are within 180 days of release from prison. Between 100 and 200 are expected to be served.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve quality of education through vocational skill completion and training completion; measured by the number of industry-recognized credentials earned as a result of the training and the number of post-secondary education placements (for offenders on community supervision). Increase or improve economic activity by adding skilled labor to the workforce; measured by the number of employment placements (for offenders on community supervision). Enhance specific individual's economic self-sufficiency by ensuring gainful employment of program participants; measured by the number of participants placed in employment and initial wage earned (for offenders on community supervision). Divert from Criminal Justice system by providing gainful employment of program participants; measured by the number of participants placed in employment and initial wage earned (for offenders on community supervision).

### f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Financial consequences may be imposed in the amount of one percent (1%) of the total allocation for each Performance Measure not achieved by the end of the agreement period.
