The citizens of Jefferson County and surrounding counties with special medical needs will be able to shelter safely in a disaster situation. They will not need to travel all the way to Leon County which is now the closet special needs shelter in the area.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This is Jefferson County's first special need shelter. With a generator, this facility would be able to serve as a shelter location for citizens with special medical needs following a disaster and also help special needs of others from surrounding counties. Approximately 78 - 100 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

During a disaster situation, individuals will not need to travel all the way to Leon County which is now the closet special needs shelter in the area. Jefferson county is a rural, very poor area with limited transportation. It would be beneficial if individuals with disabilities, and income restrictions did not have to travel so far.

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
