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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of this funding will be to provide Year 1 foundational support for direct assistance and outreach to vulnerable populations in STAC's service area; to build strong foundations of community support in local rural communities, especially in those outside Leon County in DCF Region 2 (Liberty, Wakulla, Franklin, Gadsden, Jefferson) and to tailor support for human trafficking survivors and communities so as to sustain long term success.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This proposed program will fund STAC to provide needed holistic, trauma-informed, and survivor-centered case management services to survivors of sex and labor trafficking and to those at severe risk. STAC will support youth and adults who have been sex or labor trafficked as well as those who are at risk and have multiple vulnerabilities. Funds will establish first year of programming for case management services to connect clients with the wide range of services that they need, including legal assistance, healthcare, housing, food, clothing, transportation, cell phone services, and many more. Essential to identifying survivors and providing case management services to them is to establish a presence and rapport with individuals throughout the service area. This includes direct and regular outreach by STAC's Community Services Advocates to vulnerable populations, particularly those in the outlying rural areas which rightly require a response specific to their needs and populations.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

STAC will: conduct intake and assessments of clients' long and short-term needs and ongoing concerns; develop and provide ongoing individualized safety plans for all sex and labor trafficking survivors and those at risk; provide individualized, trauma-informed, survivor-centered case management services for all clients who are identified as sex or labor trafficked; refer and connect those who are not trafficked with other community services; embed with and provide value-added services to community partner agencies that request in-person and regular presence of STAC's Advocates; and conduct site-specific group and individualized outreach. STAC will meaningfully participate in local events and help establish a local coordinated and networked response to human trafficking throughout the service area.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are persons who are vulnerable to being trafficked and those who have been victims of human trafficking. This includes children and adults, persons with disabilities, the economically disadvantaged, homeless and atrisk youth, drug users and offenders, victims of crime, elderly, homeless, people with substance use disorders, mentally ill persons and others who have a vulnerability that traffickers can exploit. The goal of this project is to directly assist at least 25 victims of human trafficking and those at severe risk, and to provide direct training and education to at least 1,000 persons while building a foundation for growth and support in future years..

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits to this project are the safety and support services provided to at least 25 survivors of sex or labor trafficking, and to those at risk of being trafficked, which will help them to be safe and free of human trafficking and assist them as they rebuild their lives. This will be measured through monthly client reports. STAC will also seek to build a core of community "champions" and local residents who will promote greater education and safe responses, fortifying communities throughout the area and building support for future funding. The educational and training program outcomes will be measured by attendance records and evaluations submitted by attendees.
