This pathway will provide hands-on, rigorous career and technical education (CTE) where students earn industry certifications and prepare for the growing, everchanging workforce. Numerous partners will be involved such as the city of DeFuniak Springs, Lowes, South Bay Lumber, Emerald Coast Technical College, Triumph Gulf Coast, and School Advisory Committees.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This program offers a sequence of courses that provide coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare for further education and career in the building and construction career cluster.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The content includes but is not limited to instruction in career and technical education; employability skills; mathematics; basic science; communication; and human-relation skills.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population includes students in the Walton County School District. 401 - 800 students are projected to be served by this CTE over the next decade.
