14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose and goal of the requested funds is to startup and implement an ongoing after-school and weekend program that nurtures, mentors, advises, and provides tutoring services to high school students (i.e. foster children, economically disadvantaged, at risk) while concurrently introducing the disadvantaged students to education and career opportunities in STEM professions. There is an ongoing need for STEM professionals and there is an equal need to increase the number of minorities in the STEM profession.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Workshops will be conducted after-school and on weekends using video conferencing technology and in person meetings will be conducted weekly to introduce high school students in urban and inner city communities to career and educational STEM opportunities. All activities and services will be designed to increase the number of high school students pursuing STEM studies and careers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The High School Students enrolled in the S.T.E.M. and Vocational Trades Learning Zone afterschool and weekend program will be provided tutoring, coaching, homework assistance, academic counseling, mentoring, and hands on exercises at workshops that will nurture and encourage students to pursue higher education S.T.E.M. studies and high paying careers in S.T.E.M. and vocational trade jobs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is high school students that are children in foster homes, children in care of the Florida Department of Children and Families, economically disadvantaged youth, at risk youth living in urban and inner city communities, homeless youth.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The students enrolled in the program will be tutored, mentored, quizzed, and tested monthly, report and progress reports from their high school will be collected, a database will be set up and used to track the student's progress and need for assistance and remedial assistance.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
