14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Amplify Community Resources (ACR) developed a novel approach to address the concerns of relations between Law Enforcement Agencies and Officers, and Community Youth from high crime communities. To address the gap between local police and youth, mental health and wellness, nutrition, and etiquette and life skills training.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Participant will demonstrate improved knowledge in the area of health and wellness. Participants will learn how to contact emergency mental health services if in crisis. Participants will learn how to identify symptoms of anxiety, stress, and depression and how to access services if needed.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Workshops seminars, expert consultant speaker series, information on website. the measure of benefit will be monitored by attendance and participation along with the survey data results.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Teen youth.

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e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Pre/ post surveys will provide data on the variance of knowledge of health and wellness from start to finish. Attendance will be a level of measurement along with the survey and analytic data captured by our social media and website to assess participation levels.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The options for describing penalties for failure to meet deliverables are as follows:

- 1. Offer an extension to meet the deliverables if over 50% done.
- 2. Work with agency to address the block or barriers to achieving deliverable goals.
- 3. If 40% or less of the deliverable are reached by the time of closeout, return unused portion of appropriation proceeds.
