I. Summary:

SB 360 requires the Florida Department of Education to conduct a comprehensive study of states with high-performing students in grades 6 through 8 in reading and mathematics, based on the states' performance on the National Assessment of Educational Progress; and report findings of the study to the Governor, the State Board of Education, and the Legislature by December 2017. Specifically, the study must review, at a minimum:

- Academic expectations and instructional strategies.
- Attendance policies and student mobility issues.
- Teacher quality.
- Middle school administrator leadership and performance.
- Parental and community involvement.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2017.

II. Present Situation:

Florida's student assessment program for public schools specifies school district and student participation in certain state and national assessments.¹

Public School Student Assessment Program

The primary purpose of the student assessment program is to provide student academic achievement and learning gains data to students, parents, teachers, school administrators and

district staff.² The program must be designed to:³

• Assess the achievement level and annual learning gains of each student in English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics and achievement level in all other subjects assessed.

- Provide data for making decisions regarding school accountability, recognition, and improvement of operations and management.
- Identify the educational strengths and needs of students and the readiness of students to be promoted to the next grade level or to graduate from high school.
- Assess how well educational goals and curricular standards are met at the school, district, state, national, and international levels.
- Provide information to aid in the evaluation and development of educational programs and policies.
- When available, provide instructional personnel with information on student achievement of standards and benchmarks in order to improve instruction.

Statewide, Standardized Assessment Program

The Commissioner of Education (commissioner) is required to design and implement a statewide, standardized assessment program that is aligned to the core curricular content established in the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards.⁴

The statewide, standardized assessment program consists of:

- Statewide, standardized comprehensive assessments:⁵
 - o ELA
 - o Mathematics and
 - Science
- End-of-Course (EOC) assessments:⁶
 - o Civics
 - o U.S. History;
 - o Algebra I;
 - o Algebra II:⁷
 - o Geometry; and
 - o Biology I.

All statewide, standardized assessments and EOC assessments must use scaled scores and achievement levels. Achievement levels must range from 1 through 5, with level 1 being the lowest achievement level, level 5 being the highest achievement level, and level 3 indicating satisfactory performance on an assessment. 9

National and International Assessments

In addition to the administration of statewide, standardized assessments, Florida school districts are required to participate in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), or similar national or international assessments, ¹⁶ both for the national sample and for any state-by-state comparison programs, as directed by the commissioner. ¹⁷

National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)

The NAEP is the largest continuing, nationally representative assessment of students' knowledge and performance in a variety of subject areas, including but not limited to mathematics, reading, and writing. The NAEP provides results on subject matter achievement for student populations, subgroups of student populations, and under certain circumstances, by selected large urban schools districts. The NAEP in reading and mathematics is administered to a representative sample of students in grades 4 and 8 every two years. The NAEP reports assessment results using three achievement levels: 1

• Basic – A student achieving the Basic level demonstrates a partial mastery of prerequisite knowledge and skills that are fundamental for proficient work at each grade.

• Proficient – A student achieving the Proficient level demonstrates solid academic performance at the grade assessed.²²

• Advanced – A student achieving the Advanced level demonstrates superior performance.

Participation in the NAEP provides a basis for comparing the knowledge and skills of Florida students with students in other states, jurisdictions, and with the nation as a whole.²³

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

SB 360 requires the Florida Department of Education (DOE) to conduct a comprehensive study of states with high-performing students in grades 6 through 8 in reading and mathematics, based on the states' performance on the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). Specifically, the study must review, at a minimum:

- Academic expectation and instructional strategies, including:
 - Alignment of elementary and middle grades expectations with high school graduation requirements;
 - Research-based instructional practices in reading and mathematics, including those targeting low-performing students;
 - o The rigor of the curriculum and courses and the availability of accelerated courses; and
 - o The availability of student support services.
- Attendance policies and student mobility issues.
- Teacher quality, including:
 - Teacher certification and recertification requirements;
 - o Teacher preparedness to teach rigorous courses;

- o Teacher recruitment and vacancy issues; and
- o Staff development requirements and the availability of effective training.
- Middle school administrator leadership and performance; and
- Parental and community involvement.

The comprehensive study would involve a review of factors that may contribute to student success. The findings and recommendations may assist the state in considering policy options to improve instruction and student performance in Florida based on a review of best practices of states with high-performing middle grade students in reading and mathematics. The bill indicates:

- Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, Connecticut, and New Jersey as the top
 performing states in the percentage of student in grades 4 and 8 who score at or above
 proficiency on the NAEP reading assessment; and
- Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, and Washington as the top
 performing states in the percentage of student in grades 4 and 8 who score at or above
 proficiency on the NAEP mathematics assessment.

The bill requires the DOE to submit a report on its findings, as well as recommendations to improve middle school student performance, to the Governor, State Board of Education, President of the Senate, and Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 2017. The bill provides for expiration of the provisions related to the comprehensive study of states after the submission of the final report.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2017.

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE - Technical Changes

I. Summary:

CS/SB 392 creates the "Personal Financial Literacy Education Act" to specify financial literacy standards and instruction for students entering grade 9 in the 2017-2018 school year. Specifically, the bill revises:

- The Next Generation Sunshine State Standards to establish requirements for financial literacy distinct from the existing financial literacy requirements specified under the economics curricular content within the standards for social studies; and
- The requirements for a student to earn a standard high school diploma by:
 - o Establishing a separate one-half credit requirement in personal financial literacy;
 - Deleting the requirement for financial literacy from the required three credits in social studies; and
 - o Reducing the number of required elective credits from eight to seven and one-half.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2017.

II. Present Situation:

Florida law requires the adoption of standards for core content of the curricular taught in public schools and specifies the requirements that students must meet to earn a standard high school diploma.¹

Next Generation Sunshine State Standards

Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (NGSSS) establish the core content of the curricula to be taught in Florida and specify the core content knowledge and skills that K-12 public school students are expected to acquire prior to graduation.² The standards must be rigorous and relevant to incrementally increase a student's core content knowledge and skills over time.³ The curricular content for each subject must integrate critical-thinking, problem-solving, and workforce literacy skills; communication, reading, and writing skills; mathematics skills; collaboration skills; contextual and applied-learning skills; technology-literacy skills; information and media-literacy skills; and civic-engagement skills.⁴ The standards applicable to high school students in grades 9 through 12 may be organized by grade clusters that include more than one grade level, except as otherwise provided for visual performing arts, physical education, health, and foreign language standards.⁵

The State Board of Education (SBE) is responsible for adopting the NGSSS and subsequent revisions, if any, to such standards in rule. The NGSSS must meet the following requirements:

- English Language Arts must establish specific curricular content for, at a minimum, reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language.
- Science standards must establish specific curricular content for, at a minimum, the nature of science, earth and space science, physical science, and life science.
- Mathematics standards must establish curricular content for, at a minimum, algebra, geometry, statistics and probability, number and quantity, functions, and modeling.
- Social Studies standards must establish curricula content for, at a minimum, geography, U.S. and world history, government, civics, humanities, and economics, including financial literacy.
- Visual and performance arts, physical education, health and foreign language standards must establish specific curricular content and include distinct grade level expectations for the core content knowledge and skills that a student is expected to have acquire by each individual grade level from kindergarten through grade 5. The standards for grades 6 through 12 may be organized by grade clusters of more than one grade level.

Financial Literacy

Specifically, curricular content for financial literacy includes the knowledge, understanding, skills, behaviors, attitudes, and values to enable a student to make responsible and effective financial decisions on a daily basis. Financial literacy instruction should be an integral part of instruction throughout the entire economics course and include information regarding earning income; buying goods and services; saving and financial investing; taxes; the use of credit and credit cards; budgeting and debt management, including student loans and secured loans;

Credits Required to Earn a Standard High School Diploma

To graduate from high school with a standard high school diploma, a student must successfully complete 24 credits, an International Baccalaureate curriculum, or an Advanced International Certificate of Education curriculum.¹³

A student must successfully complete 24 credits in the following subject areas: 14

- Four credits in English Language Arts (ELA) I, II, III, and IV.
- Four credits in mathematics, including one each in Algebra I and Geometry. Industry certifications earned by students may substitute for up to two mathematics credits, except for Algebra I and Geometry.
- Three credits in science, including one credit in Biology I and two credits in equally rigorous courses. ¹⁵ Industry certifications earned by students may substitute for one science credit except for Biology I.
- Three credits in social studies, including one credit each in U.S. history and World history; one-half in credit in economics, which must include financial literacy; and one-half credit in U.S. Government.
- One credit in fine or performing arts, speech and debate, or practical arts that incorporates artistic content and techniques of creativity, interpretation, and imagination.
- One credit in physical education that must include the integration of health.
- Eight credits in electives. School districts are required to develop and offer coordinated electives to enable a student to develop knowledge and skills in his or her area of interest and these electives must include opportunities for students to earn college credit.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

CS/SB 392 creates the "Personal Financial Literacy Education Act" to specify financial literacy standards and instruction for students entering grade 9 in the 2017-2018 school year. Specifically, the bill revises:

- The Next Generation Sunshine State Standards to establish requirements for financial literacy distinct from the existing financial literacy requirements specified under the economics curricular content within the standards for social studies; and
- The requirements for a student to earn a standard high school diploma by:
 - o Establishing a separate one-half credit requirement in personal financial literacy;
 - Deleting the requirement for financial literacy from the required three credits in social studies; and
 - o Reducing the number of required elective credits from eight to seven and one-half.

Next Generation Sunshine State Standards

The bill clarifies that the current requirements for financial literacy, embedded within the social studies standards, do not apply to students entering grade 9 in the 2017-2018 school year and thereafter. Additionally, the bill revises the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (NGSSS) to establish requirements for financial literacy distinct from the existing financial literacy requirements specified under the economics curricular content within the standards for social studies, beginning with students entering grade 9 in the 2017-2018 school year. The financial literacy standards must establish specific curricular content that must include, but is not limited to, personal financial literacy and money management. Accordingly, the NGSSS may need to be revised to include an understanding of how to balance a checkbook and the implications of receiving an inheritance. In addition, CPALMS may need to be updated to the financial literacy standards that apply to students entering grade 9 in the 2017-2018 school year. The Course Code Directory may also need to be updated to include personal financial literacy courses.

Credits Required to Earn a Standard High School Diploma

The bill requires that in order to receive a standard high school diploma, beginning with students entering grade 9 in the 2017-2018 school year, students must earn one-half credit in personal financial literacy in addition to the required three social studies credits. Currently, students are not required to complete a separate course in financial literacy to graduate from high school with a standard diploma. ¹⁹

The bill requires financial literacy instruction to include:

- Types of bank accounts offered, opening and managing a bank account, and assessing the quality of a depository institution's services.
- Balancing a checkbook.

• Basic principles of money management, such as spending, credit, credit scores, and managing debt, including retail and credit card debt.

- Completing a loan application.
- Receiving an inheritance and related implications.
- Basic principles of personal insurance policies.
- Computing federal income taxes.
- Local tax assessments.
- Computing interest rates by various mechanisms.
- Simple contracts.
- Contesting an incorrect billing statement.
- Types of savings and investment.
- State and federal laws concerning finance.

Additionally, the bill reduces the current elective credits required to earn a standard high school diploma from eight to seven and one-half. As such, the bill maintains the total number of credits (i.e., 24) that students must successfully complete to earn a standard high school diploma.

The bill may increase high school students' personal financial literacy, which may help high school students to acquire the knowledge and skills to effectively manage personal finances and plan for pursing higher education or entering the workforce.

This bill takes effect July 1, 2017.

According to the Florida Department of Education (DOE), the implementation of a new course in financial literacy may result in expenses associated with instructional materials and professional development for teachers.²⁰ The DOE projected four cost scenarios for implementing a required financial literacy course. The scenarios are based on a cost analysis that the DOE submitted to the legislature on October 1, 2013.²¹

- Scenarios one and two assume that teachers who are currently employed by the district are trained to teach the financial literacy course.²²
 - Scenario one assumes one set of textbooks per classroom, amounting to an estimated implementation cost of \$3,086,512 for the first year and a total cost of \$4,899,568 for the first five years.²³
 - Scenario two assumes an individual textbook used by each student in the course, amounting to an estimated implementation cost of \$9,440,776 for the first year and a total cost of \$15,021,064 for the first five years.
- Scenario three assumes that financial literacy instruction is taken electronically through an online course, amounting to an estimated implementation cost of \$160,792 for the first year with no additional cost after the first year for teacher training and travel.²⁴
- Scenario four assumes that financial literacy instruction is obtained through a free curriculum, amounting to an estimated first year implementation cost of \$140,296, with no additional costs after the first year.²⁵

I. Summary:

SB 436 creates the "Florida Student and School Personnel Religious Liberties Act," and specifies that a school district may not discriminate against a student, parent, or school personnel on the basis of a religious viewpoint or religious expression. Specifically, the bill:

- Authorizes a student to:
 - Express his or her religious beliefs in written and oral assignments free from discrimination.
 - Wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol to the same extent as secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted.
 - Pray or engage in and organize religious activities before, during, and after the school day to the same extent that student engagement in secular activity or expression and the organization of secular activities and groups are permitted.
- Requires a school district to:
 - Comply with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and specifies that a school district
 may not prevent school personnel from participating in religious activities on school
 grounds that are student-initiated at reasonable times before or after the school day.
 - Give a religious group access to the same school facilities for assembling as given to a secular group without discrimination and authorizes such a religious or secular group to advertise or announce its meetings.
 - Adopt a policy that establishes a limited public forum for student speakers at any school event at which a student is to speak publicly.
- Requires the Florida Department of Education to develop and publish on its website a model policy regarding a limited public forum and the voluntary expression of religious viewpoints by students and school personnel in public schools. The model policy must be adopted and implemented by each district school board.

The bill takes effect on July 1, 2017.

II. Present Situation:

Federal and State Law Regarding Religion

The relationship between religion and government in the United States is governed by the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which both prevents the government from establishing religion and protects privately initiated expression and activities from government interference and discrimination.

The First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution states:

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

Similarly, article I, section 3 of the Florida Constitution states:

There shall be no law respecting the establishment of religion or prohibiting or penalizing the free exercise thereof. Religious freedom shall not justify practices inconsistent with public morals, peace or safety.

Both the U.S. Constitution and the Florida Constitution contain an Establishment Clause, Free Exercise Clause, and protect individual freedom of speech and expression.²

Establishment of Religion

The Establishment Clause of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution requires the government, including public school officials, to maintain neutrality in its treatment of religion.³ Accordingly, teachers and other school personnel, as government officials, may not lead students in prayer, devotional readings from religious texts, or other religious practices.⁴

Free Exercise of Religion

The protections of the Free Exercise Clause direct that no law may discriminate against some or all religious beliefs or regulate or prohibit conduct undertaken for religious reasons.⁵ Florida courts have generally interpreted Florida's Free Exercise Clause as coequal to the federal clause.⁶

Students may pray, read religious texts, or study religious materials in a non-disruptive manner when not engaged in school activities or instruction. School authorities are permitted to regulate such activities, but must do so in a manner that does not discriminate against religious expression.

Additionally, the Florida Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) specifically protects a person's right to the free exercise of religion. The RFRA provides that government cannot burden the exercise of religion unless there is a compelling government interest and it is the least restrictive means of accomplishing that interest. 10

Free Speech and Expression

Both the U.S. Constitution and Florida Constitution provide that every person may speak, write, and publish sentiments on all subjects.¹¹

However, an individual's freedom of speech or expression may be limited by the government if the speech or expression occurs on government-owned property, such as a public elementary, middle, or high school or public university. ¹² Such limitations are determined by the type of public forum created on government property. ¹³ There are three types of public fora: ¹⁴

- A "traditional" or "open public forum" is a place with a longstanding tradition of freedom of expression, such as a public park or street corner. In an open public forum, the government may only impose content-neutral time, place, and manner restrictions on speech and expression. 16
- A "designated" or "limited public forum"¹⁷ is a place with a more limited history of expressive activity, usually only for certain groups or topics. Examples may include a university meeting hall.¹⁸ Such limitations must serve a compelling state interest.¹⁹
- A "closed public forum" is a place that is not traditionally open to public expression, such as a military base. ²⁰

Generally, student speech and religious expression are protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.²¹ However, such rights may be limited.²² A student's right to freedom of speech and expression is protected to the extent it does not "materially and substantially interfere with the requirements of appropriate discipline in the operation of the school and without colliding with the rights of others."²³

Florida law authorizes a district school board to adopt a policy allowing an inspirational message by students at a student assembly.²⁴ The policy must provide that students who are responsible for organizing any student-led portion of a student assembly must:²⁵

- Have sole discretion in determining whether an inspirational message is to be delivered.
- Choose the student volunteers to deliver the message. The student volunteers must be solely responsible for the preparation and content of the inspirational message.

School district personnel are prohibited from participating in, or otherwise influencing, the determination of whether an inspirational message is to be delivered or selecting the student volunteers to deliver the inspirational message.²⁶ Additionally, school district personnel may not monitor or otherwise review the content of a student volunteer's inspirational message.²⁷

The Civil Rights Act of 1964

Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, prohibits employment discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, and national origin.²⁸ As such, a school district may not discriminate against an employee on the basis of his or her religion. For purposes of the Civil Rights Act, the term "religion" includes all aspects of religious observance, practice, or belief.²⁹

The Equal Access Act

The Equal Access Act³⁰ makes it unlawful for any public secondary school that receives federal financial assistance and maintains a limited open forum³¹ to deny equal access or fair opportunity to, or discriminate against, any students who wish to conduct a meeting within that limited open

forum on the basis of religious, political, philosophical, or other content of speech at such meetings.³²

A public secondary school is deemed to offer a fair opportunity to students who wish to conduct a meeting within its limited open forum if such school uniformly provides that:³³

- The meeting is voluntary and student-initiated;
- There is no sponsorship of the meeting by the school, the government, or its agents or employees;
- Employees or agents of the school or government are present at religious meetings only in a nonparticipatory capacity;
- The meeting does not materially and substantially interfere with the orderly conduct of educational activities within the school; and
- Nonschool persons do not direct, conduct, control, or regularly attend such activities of student groups.

The U.S. Supreme Court has held that the Equal Access Act does not violate the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.³⁴ The Equal Access Act applies to public secondary schools³⁵ and does not address the applicability of the Act to elementary or middle schools.³⁶

School District Responsibility

A school district is responsible for the operation, control, and supervision of all public schools within the school district.³⁷ As a condition of receiving federal funds, a school district must certify in writing to the Florida Department of Education (FL DOE) that the school district has no policy that prevents, or otherwise denies participation in, constitutionally protected prayer in public schools.³⁸

Guidance on Religious Expression In Public Schools

The FL DOE is required to annually distribute the federal guidelines on "Religious Expression in Public Schools" published by the U.S. Department of Education to all district school board members, district superintendents, school principals, and teachers for informational purposes.³⁹

Standard Student Attire

Florida law requires each district school board to adopt a code of student conduct for elementary schools and a code of student conduct for middle and high schools, and distribute the appropriate code to teachers, school personnel, students, and parents at the beginning of each school year. The code of student conduct must include, but is not limited to, an explanation of the responsibilities of each student with regard to appropriate dress and prohibit clothing that exposes underwear, body parts in an indecent or vulgar manner or that disrupts the orderly learning environment.

Additionally, each district school board is authorized to adopt policies requiring students to wear uniforms or impose other dress-related requirements, if a district school board finds that the policies are necessary for the safety and welfare of the student body or school personnel.⁴²

In 2016, the Legislature enacted the Students Attired for Education (SAFE) Act to create an incentive payment for school districts and charter schools that implement a standard student attire policy for all students in kindergarten through grade 8.⁴³ The standard attire policy must:⁴⁴

- Apply to all students in kindergarten through grade 8 in the school district or charter school, regardless of individual school grade configurations.
- Prohibit certain types or styles of clothing and requires solid-colored clothing and fabrics for pants, skirts, shorts, or similar clothing and short-or-long sleeved shirts with collars.
- Allow reasonable accommodations based on student's religion, disability, or medical condition.

A district school board or charter school governing board that implements a districtwide or schoolwide standard attire policy, respectively, is immune from civil liability resulting from adoption of the policy in accordance with Florida law.⁴⁵

- Authorizes a student to:

 - Wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol to the same extent secular types of clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display messages or symbols are permitted.

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 Pray or engage in and organize religious activities before, during, and after the school day to the same extent that student engagement in secular activity or expression and the organization of secular activities and groups are permitted.

- Requires a school district to:
 - Omply with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits an employer from discriminating against an employee on the basis of religion and specifies that a school district may not prevent school personnel from participating in religious activities on school grounds that are student-initiated at reasonable times before or after the school day.
 - Give a religious group access to the same school facilities for assembling as given to a secular group without discrimination and authorizes such a religious or secular group to advertise or announce its meetings.
 - Adopt a policy that establishes a limited public forum for student speakers at any school event at which a student is to speak publicly.
- Requires the Florida Department of Education (FL DOE) to develop and publish on its
 website a model policy regarding a limited public forum and the voluntary expression of
 religious viewpoints by students and school personnel in public schools. The model policy
 must be adopted and implemented by each district school board.

Religious Expression by Students

The bill authorizes voluntary expression of religious viewpoints or religious expression by students in public schools. Such expression may be through written and oral presentation, clothing and accessories, and prayer and religious activities.

Written and Oral Expression

The bill authorizes a student to express his or her religious beliefs via homework, artwork, and other written and oral assignments free from discrimination based on the religious content. This authority appears to be consistent with federal guidance on "Religious Expression and Prayer in Class Assignments." Such assignments must be evaluated based on relevant academic standards, and neither penalized nor rewarded on account of religious content. 47

Attire

In addition to permitting written and oral religious expression, the bill authorizes students to wear clothing, accessories, and jewelry that display a religious message or symbol⁴⁸ to the same extent that students are permitted to wear secular clothing, accessories, and jewelry.

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Accordingly, a district school board that has adopted a standard student attire policy may need to modify its policy to reflect permissible clothing, accessories, or jewelry authorized under the bill.

Prayer and Religious Activities

The bill also authorizes a student to pray or engage in and organize religious activities before, during, and after the school day to the same extent that students may engage in secular activities, expression, or groups. Further, the bill authorizes a group that meets for prayer or religious speech to advertise or announce its meetings to the same extent that a secular group may advertise or announce its meetings. This right appears to be consistent with the federal Equal Access Act, which applies to public secondary schools.⁴⁹ Students at such schools may organize during noninstructional time. 50 The bill appears to extend this right to students in public elementary and middle schools.

Responsibility of School Districts

The bill specifies certain requirements for school districts regarding religious expression in public schools. Specifically, the bill requires school districts to comply with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits an employer from discriminating against an employee on the basis of religion.

In addition, the bill provides that a school district may not prevent school personnel from participating in religious activities on school grounds that are initiated by students at reasonable times before or after the school day if such activities are voluntary and do not conflict with the responsibilities or assignments of such personnel. Pursuant to the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, teachers, school administrators, or other school employees generally may not actively participate in prayer or similar religious activities with students on school grounds, unless the overall context makes clear such employees are not participating in their official capacity.⁵¹

The bill also requires a school district to adopt a policy that establishes a limited public forum for student speakers at any school event at which a student is to speak publicly. The policy must require the school district to:

- Provide the forum in a manner that does not discriminate against a student's voluntary expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject;
- Provide a method based on neutral criteria for the selection of student speakers at school events, activities, and graduation ceremonies;
- Ensure that a student speaker does not engage in obscene, vulgar, offensively lewd, or indecent speech; and

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• State in written or oral form that the student's speech does not reflect the endorsement, sponsorship, position, or expression of the school district. The school district must deliver this disclaimer at all graduation events and any other event at which a student speaks publicly.

Additionally, the bill requires that a limited public forum may not exclude student expression of a religious viewpoint on an otherwise permissible subject. Currently, district school boards have the discretion to decide whether or not to establish a limited public forum.⁵² Consequently, a district school board that has not yet adopted such a policy may need to adopt a policy establishing a limited public forum for student speakers to meet the requirements of this bill.

Responsibility of the Department of Education

The bill requires the FL DOE to develop and publish on its website a model policy, which each district school board must adopt and implement, regarding a limited public forum and the voluntary expression of religious viewpoints by students and school personnel in public schools. Such policy may assist the school districts in adopting a uniform policy regarding religious expression in public schools, which may facilitate consistency in implementation of such policy.

The bill takes effect on July 1, 2017.
