

Solvable








Question #1: What is FDC's bed capacity?




Question #2: What are your considerations for closing a prison?

Current Capacity and Staffing



Previous Solutions to Fiscal Constraints

- Outsourcing
- Program and education reductions
- Vacant FTE reductions
- Deferred maintenance and repair
- Deferred capital investment
- Reorganization (12-hour shifts)
- Prison consolidation



Considerations for Closing a Prison

Primary Considerations:

- Does FDC have the available appropriate bed space in facilities with appropriate mission sets to absorb the inmates currently assigned to the prison considered for closure?
- Does FDC have the ability to adjust missions and bed type distributions in other facilities to accommodate inmates transferred from a prison considered for closure?

Secondary Considerations once primary considerations are satisfied:

- FDC's ability/inability to properly staff specific prisons (Vacancy Rates)
- Age and condition of physical plant and associated maintenance and repair costs
- Prison proximity to other prisons (Enabling staff transfers)
- Distance of receiving prisons from the transferring inmates' "counties of intake" (Visitation consideration)
- Community impact (Employment Opportunities, Inmate Labor, etc.)




Question #3: Do we use the same menu of strategies, or do we take a different approach?



Near-Term Solution: Get Healthy

(Get to a "Solid Satisfactory" by 2024)

- Reduce staff attrition and vacancy rates
- Reduce inmate violence, addiction, and idleness
- Enhance cooperation through positive choices
- Maximize efficient and effective healthcare
- Address aging infrastructure





Long-Term Solution: A Systems Approach

(From a "Solid Satisfactory" to Excellence, 2025 -)

What's truly cost effective for Florida in the long-run?

- Demographics:
 - ✓ Where will the inmates come from?
 - ✓ Where will the staff come from?
- Economics:
 - ✓ Employment competition
 - ✓ Infrastructure
 - ✓ Inmate vocational opportunities
 - ✓ Financial forecasting

- Physical geography:
 - ✓ Transportation infrastructure
 - ✓ Utility systems
 - ✓ Environmental considerations
- Corrections best practices
- Statutory compliance or change
- Contractual obligations
- Additional considerations



Conclusion: The Purposes of Corrections

- Retribution Justice rendered as punishment
- Incapacitation Preventing further criminal activity
- Deterrence Theoretically discouraging future crime
- Rehabilitation Supporting real change in attitude and capacity
- Restoration Connecting returning citizens with communities
