

Total Budget \$91.3 Billion General Revenue \$33.8 Billion



Governor's Recommended Budget Fiscal Year 2019-20 Environment over \$4 Billion



\$625M for Everglades and Protecting Water Resources \$2.5 billion over 4 years

- A record \$360 million for Everglades Restoration
 - \$140.5 million for C-43
 - \$107.8 million for the EAA Reservoir
 - \$40 million for Tamiami Trail through DOT's work program
- \$150 million for Targeted Water Quality Improvements
- \$50 million for Springs Restoration
- \$40 million for Alternative Water Supply

\$625M for Everglades and Protecting Water Resources

\$2.5 billion over 4 years

- \$25 million for Blue-Green Algae and Red Tide
 - \$10.8 million for Water Quality Enhancements and Accountability
 - \$10 million for Innovative Solutions to Algae
 - \$4.2 million for the Center for Red Tide Research in FWC
- \$1 million in Department of Health's budget for a study of the long-term health impact of blue-green algae and red tide
- Transfer Environmental Crimes Enforcement Unit from FWC to DEP
 - 19 FTE and \$1.9 million

Protecting our Coasts and Lands

- \$154 million for Florida's Prized Properties

Investing in a Clean Environment

- \$125 million for the cleanup of contaminated sites
 - \$110 million for Petroleum Tank Cleanup Projects
 - \$8.5 million for Dry Cleaning Site Cleanup
 - \$5.5 million for Hazardous Waste Cleanup
 - \$600,000 for Cleanup of State-owned properties
- \$10 million for the Volkswagen settlement

Investing in our Citrus Industry

- \$20 million for our citrus industry:
 - \$8 million for citrus research to find solutions to citrus greening
 - \$4 million in additional funding to support
 Department of Citrus consumer awareness efforts
 - \$8 million for the Citrus Health Response Program


