

What was mandated?



Why only at UF/IFAS facilities?

State statute and FDACS-DPI permitting structure pointed to significant pilot project risks and liability on the University of Florida.

Risks include...

- Seed import and transportation
- THC testing and "hot plant" issue(s)
- Proper seed/plant material documentation and disposal
- Biosecurity and invasion potential
- Lack of registered crop protection products
- Personal security, theft, and law enforcement
- Bond requirements and financing




