





# District Workforce Education Funding & FTE \$ *Millions*








#### Community College System Funds Per FTE State, Local, and Federal Funds




### Community College FTE by Program Type 2013-14 through 2015-16








# State Student Financial Assistance FY 2016-17 Highlights

- **Bright Futures** \$217.3 from the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund (Lottery and Slots). Key changes to the program in recent years include a fixed award per credit hour and higher academic standards. These changes were phased in over the several years, with the final change impacting 2013-2014 high school graduates.
- Need-based Aid (FSAG) \$148.4 million average award is \$1,100; maximum award is \$2,610.
- Florida Resident Access Grants (FRAG) \$115.3 million \$3,000 per student at all eligible non-profit institutions.
- Access to Better Learning and Education (ABLE) Grants- \$5 million
  \$1,500 per student at participating for-profit institutions.
- Benacquisto Scholarship Program \$12.9 million approximately \$17,500 per student.

# Florida Student Assistance Grant (FSAG) -Funding History (in millions)




# Florida Student Assistance Grant (FSAG) -Funded and Unfunded Student History




## Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program – Total Initial Awardees and SAT/ACT Requirements (Florida Medallion Scholars)

- Provide flexible funds to university presidents and local boards of trustees

## Policy and funding strategies to help <u>improve the 4-year graduation</u> <u>rates</u> at universities

- Increase Scholarships and Financial aid
  - Bright Futures Scholarships Changes increasing Florida Academic Scholars award to 100% of tuition/fees and providing a \$300 a semester book stipend
  - Increased funding for FSAG (Need-Based Aid)
