## Senate Bill 1326 (2020) Outline

- Codified DCF's first Quality Office.
- Enhanced duties of community alliances.
- Outlined collaborative efforts between DCF and its contracted partners, including sheriffs' offices.
- Directed DCF to develop a statewide accountability system to assess the health of the child welfare system by circuit.
- Implemented child welfare pilot projects in circuits 6 and 13.
- Strengthened DCF's contract monitoring.
- Required DCF to establish a career ladder and wellness program for child protective investigators.



# Establishing the Quality Office

- Senate Bill 1326 (2020) created section 402.175, Florida Statutes, directing DCF to establish a department-wide Office of Quality.
- 2020 proviso language allocated \$5.35 million to establish the Quality Office by reassigning up to 125 positions from within DCF.

## Sixth and Thirteenth Judicial Circuit Pilot Projects

- Pilot Project Goals:
  - Reduce the current workload on existing case managers;
  - Provide increased support, oversight and assists to case management to increase performance; and
  - -Improve direct supervision support.
- Pilot Changes to Circuits 6 & 13:
  - Add support staff to Case Management Organizations (CMOs)
  - Hire Court Liaisons
  - Develop and maintain Assessment Support
  - Add Teen Units and Reunification Units
  - Contract for home/child studies
  - Change supervisor ratio
  - Outsource Operation Specialists to CMOs
  - Additional support staff and Background Screening Unit positions

## Pilot Project Appropriations and Outcomes

- Specific Appropriation 330, provided \$3,863,739 to the Sixth Judicial Circuit Pilot and \$4,371,313 to the Thirteenth Circuit Pilot Programs.
  - DCF has provided advance incentive funding

• Circuit 6: \$1,092,828

Circuit 13: \$965,934

Earned funding based on 1st Quarter performance data

- Circuit 6: \$275,012

- Circuit 13: \$138,903

- 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Outcomes:
  - Circuit 6 met or exceeded five out of the six performance goals.
  - Circuit 13 met or exceeded four out of the six performance goals.



## Early Achievements

- Built the Quality Office and began real-time case reviews
  - Reviewed more than 2,400 cases to date.
  - Collaborating to build the child welfare accountability system.
  - Held first Quarterly Quality event for child welfare.
  - Provided real-time feedback to operations on 300 cases in which immediate action was needed to ensure child safety.
  - Near completion of the first statewide performance improvement project.
- Deployed pilot projects in circuits 6 and 13.



# Review Findings in Action



Performance improvement team was deployed.





16 cases resulted in removal of children from unsafe settings



Insufficient supervisory consultation is 6x more likely to result in a case that requires immediate safety action
