# FDEM Disaster Grant Management



## Overview of Disaster Declarations

## FDEM is managing FEMA Public Assistance grants for 26 disaster events from 2004-Current

- 3 FEMA Emergency Declarations (Limited to Emergency Response)
- 20 FEMA Major Disaster Declarations (August 2004 Current/COVID)
- 3 Fire Management Assistance Grants (2020 Season)



## Overview of Terminology

#### **Terminology**

- Obligated: Funds awarded to an applicant by FEMA for an approved project scope of work. (For purposes of this presentation, State match is included in any figures, if applicable.)
- De-obligated: Funds denied, disallowed, or reduced by FEMA from a previous award
  - May result in a receivable (or money owed) if award was previously paid out by FDEM
- Paid: Obligated, validated funds resulting in payment reimbursement by FDEM
- Offset: The process of paying back a receivable from another eligible obligation.
- Management Costs: Any indirect cost, direct administrative cost (DAC), or other administrative expense associated with administering and managing the Public Assistance (PA) award. Captured as a Category Z project for events declared in 2017 and beyond.



## Public Assistance Grant Program

- Federal disaster assistance provided upon receipt of a presidential declaration
- State & Local Governments, Tribal Governments & certain Private
   Non-Profits, including Houses of Worship, eligible to receive funding
- Cost-share normally 75% Federal/25% Non-Federal
- Reimbursement based



## Public Assistance Categories of Work

- Emergency Work Work that must be done immediately to save lives, protect improved property, protect public health and safety, or avert or lessen the threat of a major disaster. Includes Categories A & B.
- Permanent Work Restorative work that must be performed through repairs or replacement to restore an eligible facility based on its pre-disaster design and current applicable codes and standards. Includes Categories C-G.

#### **Emergency Work**

Address an immediate threat:

- A Debris removal
- B Emergency protective measures

#### **Permanent Work**

#### Restoration of:

- C Roads/bridges
- D Water control facilities
- E Buildings/equipment
- F Utilities
- **G** Parks, recreational, and other facilities



## Public Assistance Process Changes Since Jan. 2019

#### Large Project Validation

- -Moved from 100% validation prior to payment. Partial payments now allowed
- -Pay obligated funds based on validation performed jointly by FEMA & DEMpreventing duplication of effort
- -For debris and emergency work projects, DEM pays 50% immediately upon obligation.

#### • Small Project Certification

- -Small projects only need self-certification for payment.
- -Less document intensive.

#### Funding Agreement

- -No longer waiting until first project is obligated to execute.
- -One agreement per applicant- no amendments needed per project

#### Expedited Projects

- -50% of estimated project costs.
- -Ready for State to pay out upon obligation.
- -Get funds to affected communities quicker.



## Closeout Overview & Financial Progress:

### **Closeout Overview**

- 1. ALL projects must be reconciled and closed before an Account (Applicant) can be closed
- 2. ALL Accounts must be reconciled and closed
- Once ALL Accounts are reconciled and closed, the Disaster can be reconciled and closed

## **Solutions for Closeout:**

## How do we close???

- 1. Offsets The process of paying back a receivable from another eligible obligation (i.e., another project, a new disaster).
- 2. Repayment Plan The process of returning funds over a period.
- Legislative Appropriation An approved appropriation to satisfy the Applicants debt.
