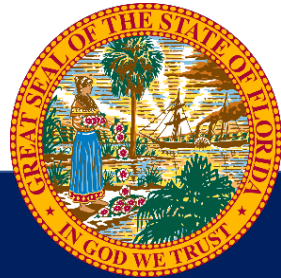

Overview of FDEM Core Programs

Mitigation

- State Coordinating Agency of the National Flood Insurance Program
- Administers FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.
- Administers FEMA's Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities Program
- Provides technical assistance to counties developing and implementing local mitigation strategies

Preparedness

- Administers Florida's All-Hazards planning programs to ensure the State Emergency Response Team (SERT) is prepared:
 - For prompt and efficient response and recovery
 - To protect lives and property impacted by disasters
 - Coordinate training courses for counties and first responders

Response

- Monitors incidents that may require State response
- Manages 24/7 State Watch Office
- Oversees Logistics vendor management and resource deployment
- Supports State Emergency Response Commission through Tech Hazards Unit– *Nuclear Power Plants*

Recovery

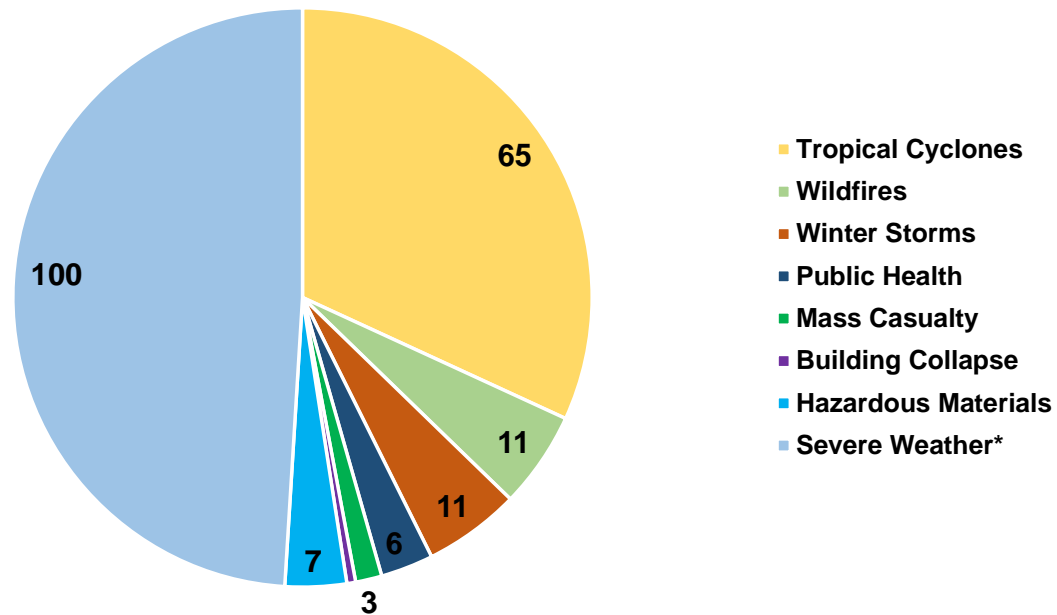
- Works to maximize federal disaster assistance to eligible public-sector partners and residents.
- Administers recovery funding such as Public Assistance, Individual Assistance, CARES Act and American Recovery Plan Act.
- Paid out nearly \$6 billion in recovery funding to local governments in less than three years

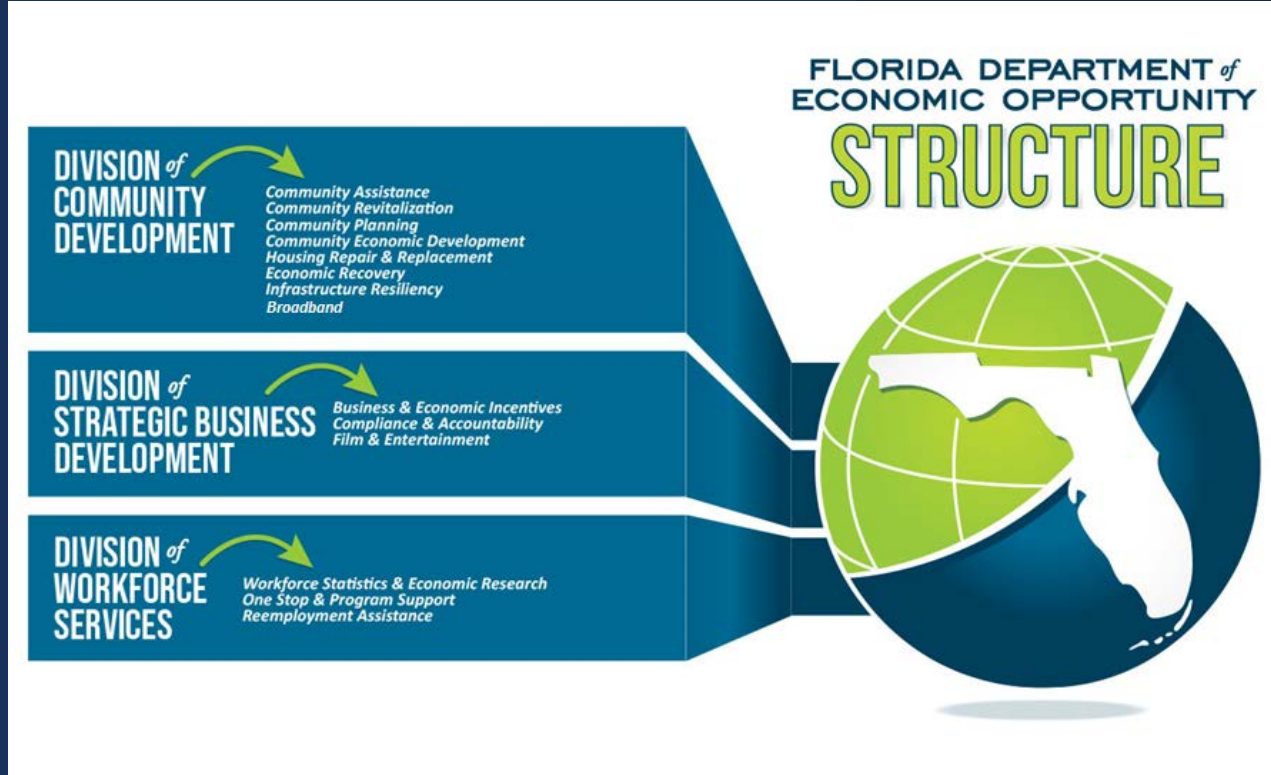

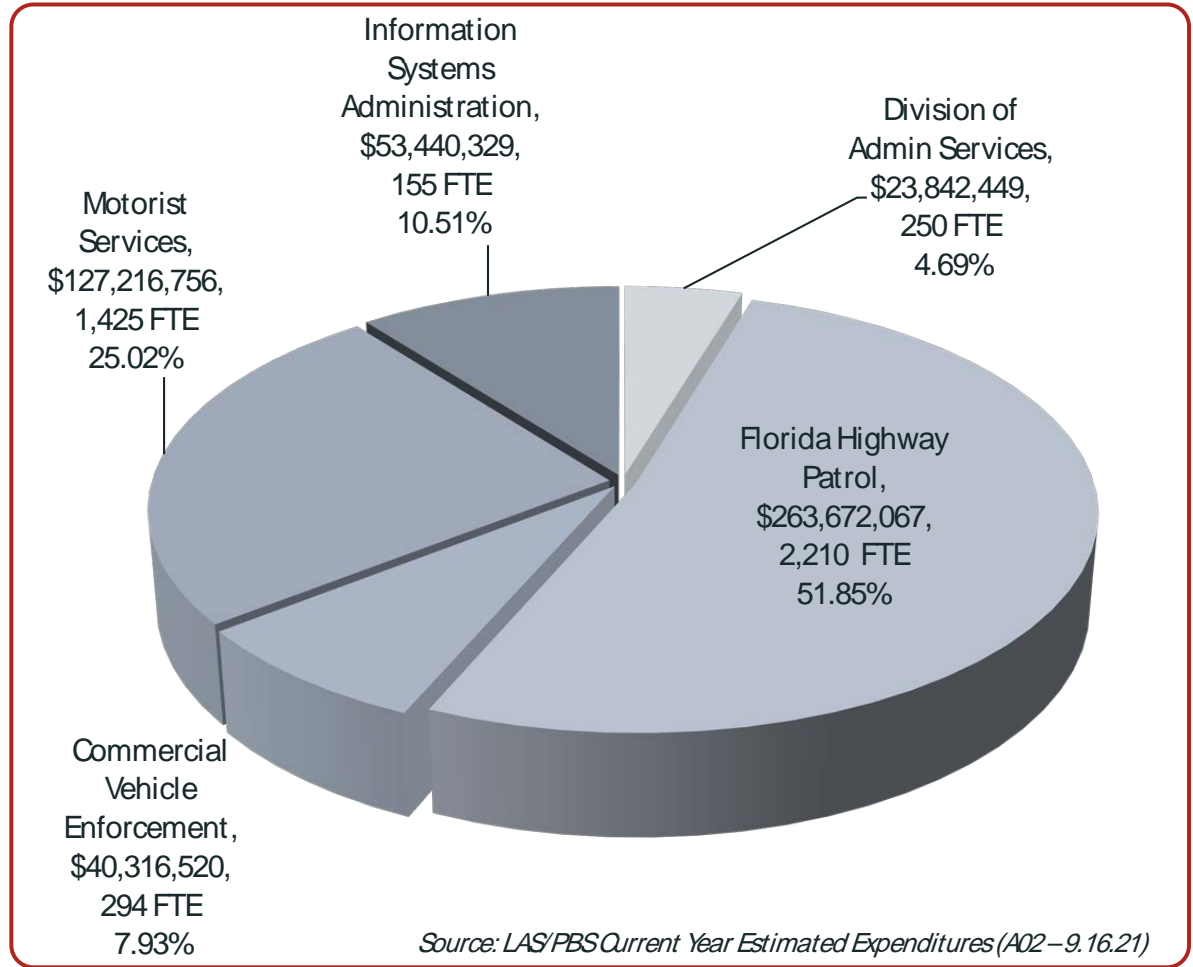

Priority #1

Florida Highway Patrol Recruitment & Retention - \$24.4M

- Implement a Comprehensive Career Development Plan based on Tenure, Merit and Achievement
 - Recognize FHP member experience, education and contributions to the Patrol
 - Directly address core issues related to recruitment and retention by defining a career path for members as their level of experience increases
 - Will allow FHP to be competitive with other law enforcement agencies throughout members' careers
 - Help retain highly valued and qualified employees
 - Reduce costs associated with recruitment, training, risk management, and civil litigation
 - Enable FHP to recruit more highly qualified new members



Priority #2

Motorist Modernization Phase II— \$10.0M

- Phase II of Motorist Modernization is the second step in the modernization effort and represents the re-engineering and redevelopment effort of the systems and processes supporting motor vehicle systems.
 - Titles, Registrations, International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA), International Registration Plan (IRP), vehicle inspections, parking permits and database re-design.
 - Enterprise Content Management Study (ECM)
 - Mobile Driver License (mDL) or Florida Smart ID
- Phase II will achieve the goal of creating one comprehensive system that handles driver and motor vehicle issuance for the State of Florida.

Priority #3

Critical Market
Pay (CMP)
Additive –
\$3.5M

- **Florida Highway Patrol Sworn Law Enforcement Officers**
 - CMP pay additives of \$5,000 annually are currently authorized in 23 counties for sworn members who work and reside in specified counties
 - \$415K of budget authority is requested to add 4 additional counties - Seminole, St. Lucie, Martin and Indian River
- **Florida Highway Patrol/Non-Sworn Personnel/Regional Communication Centers**
 - \$910K of budget authority is requested for a \$5,000 pay additive for Regional Communication Centers in Duval, Hillsborough, Lee, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach and Seminole counties.
- **Division of Motorist Services Driver License Examiners**
 - \$2.2M of budget authority is requested for a \$5,000 pay additive for Driver License Examiners and Florida Licensing on Wheels personnel
- In addition to budget authority in the Salary and Benefits Category – Section 8 authority in the General Appropriations Act is also needed

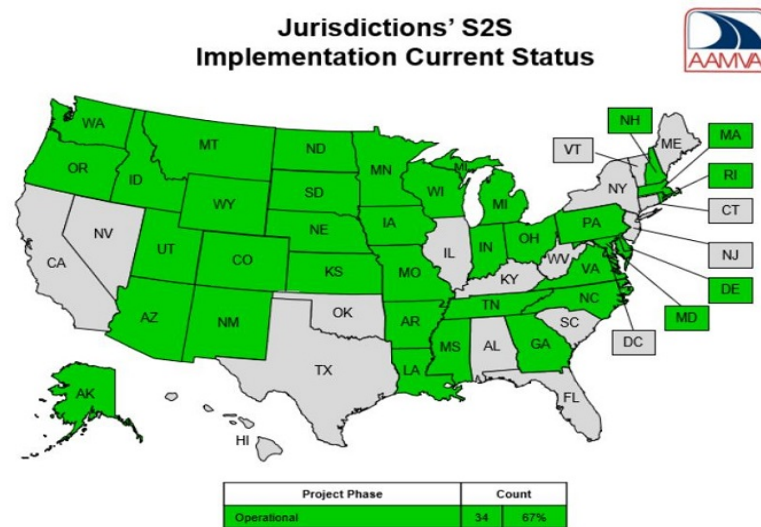
Priority #4

Recruitment and Retention Driver License Examiners – \$1.2M

- The department currently provides driver license services in Broward and Miami-Dade counties
- The workforce serving Miami-Dade and Broward has remained the same over the last 20 years although the population continues to grow
 - Attrition in both counties in previous year – 20%
 - Employees who leave indicate salary is too low for workload and stress
 - Customers are experiencing long lines and lengthy wait times
- Increasing rate of pay for Driver License Examiners will help fill vacant positions and retain qualified personnel
 - Salary Increase for 366 FTE – Driver License Examiners and Florida Licensing on Wheels (FLOW) Highway Safety Specialist
 - Current Salary - \$27,040
 - Requested Salary - \$31,200/\$15 Per Hour

Priority #8

State to State (S2S) Verification Subscription Service – \$1.6M



- Facilitate compliance with the One Driver-One License requirement of the Real-ID Act
- Provide a way to electronically cancel the other jurisdiction’s credential when a Florida credential is issued; and
- Electronically transfer driver history records; and electronically transmit traffic offense convictions between states.
- 34 states currently participate in S2S and Florida is scheduled to go live in January 2023

Other Priority Issues – \$4.9M

- **Relocation of Venice Station - \$325K**
 - FHP Venice Substation is leased facility owned by County and will not be available after lease expiration.
- **Replacement of Conducted Electrical Weapons (CEWs) - \$3.8M**
 - Current CEW's were purchased in 2015 with a 5-year warranty that included replacement of inoperable devices. The warranty has expired with no options to extend.
 - Replacing CEW's will circumvent the expense of ongoing replacements and mitigate safety issues
 - Requested budget will replace all out of warrant CEW's and includes a new 5-year extended warranty.
- **HireBack/Patrol Operations - \$800K**
 - Address increases in multiple contracts for FDOT HireBack operations

Division of Motorist Services

Other Priority Issues – \$1.7M

- **Relocation of Pembroke Pines Driver License Office- \$292K**
 - Request to lease a larger office space due to limited lobby space in current building.
- **Commercial Driver License/Third Party Administrators Audit Functions - \$570K/6 FTE**
 - Recurring funding to ensure monitoring activities are conducted timely and properly documented.
- **Fleet Replacement/Bureau of Dealer Services - \$265K**
 - Funding to replace vehicles that exceed the Department of Management Services replacement criteria of 12 years old, or 120,000 miles
- **Purchase of License Plates - \$550K**
 - Increase in budget authority due to forecasted increase in license plate replacements

Information Systems Administration

Other Priority Issues – \$5.6M

- **Application Cloud Environment - \$4.8M**
 - FLHSMV was appropriated \$5.8M of nonrecurring funds in FY 21-22 to migrate its applications systems and networks to a private cloud environment. This is a continuation of prior year funding to fully support FLHSMV's new application environment and disaster recovery services.
- **Enterprise Security Operational Support - \$322K**
 - Recurring funding request to continue enterprise security initiatives that reduce the opportunities for unauthorized access or account compromise, and protection of FLHSMV endpoint servers and workstations.
- **Software Operational Support - \$384K**
 - Request for a comprehensive enterprise-wide software license inventory program and automated testing tools.

Deferred Building Maintenance Program – \$4.2M

- Section 152 of Chapter 2021-36, L.O.F. (SB 2500) authorizes the spending of the federal State Fiscal Recovery Tool (Public Law 117-2) authorizes nonrecurring appropriation for FY21-22.
- **Deferred Building Maintenance Program** - \$350MNR appropriated to Administered Funds to address negative economic impacts to the state resulting from COVID-19 Pandemic.
 - Neil Kirkman Building HVAC Upgrades/Air Duct- \$2M
 - Neil Kirkman Building A-Wing Basement Fire Protection/Sprinkler System - \$636K
 - Neil Kirkman Building 4th Floor North Major Interior Renovation and Asbestos Removal - \$1.4M
 - Florida Highway Patrol Cocoa/Mold Remediation - \$132K

#1 R.A. Gray Building Maintenance

Division of Administrative Services

- Request Amount \$10,000,000
- General Revenue
- Replace concrete deck surrounding the R.A. Gray Building which serves as the roof of the Museum of Florida History and the various workshops that support the Museum
- Continued leaks though the existing deck serve to compromise the integrity of the deck and poses both a life-safety issue for the staff and public and to the irreplaceable items of Florida History contained in the Museum

#2 State Archaeological Collections Facility Expansion

Division of Historical Resources

- Request Amount \$13,766,029
- Land Acquisition Trust Fund
- Current curation facility is nearly at capacity, and the Division can no longer accommodate the accession of new artifacts without compromising professional curation standards
- New facility will also allow the Division to increase the security and safety of Florida's artifacts
- Items are irreplaceable, and it is the Division's statutory mandate to preserve, protect and make these artifacts from state lands accessible to the public
- Funding request based on study of the proposed project that was completed in 2017.

#3 Florida Voter Registration System Modernization

Division of Elections

- Request Amount \$4,000,000
- Federal Grants Trust Fund-Help America Vote Act (HAVA)
- Multi-year modernization project for the Florida Voter Registration System (FVRS) and enhancements to Online Voter Registration (OVR)
 - FY21-22 funds appropriated for the hardware upgrades
 - FY22-23 request to upgrade and improve software for FVRS and OVR
- FVRS has not had a major re-write since its deployment in 2006
- OVR enhancements will include user experience upgrades based on voter and Supervisors of Elections feedback

#4 Election Security Grant Funding

Division of Elections

- Request Amount \$8,000,000
- Federal Grants Trust Fund-Help America Vote Act (HAVA)
- \$1M - Subgrant to SOE's for Albert Network Monitoring Solution
 - Will serve to mitigate risks through active monitoring and reporting of threats or suspicious activity
 - One year grant funded process will provide a sum not to exceed \$28,420 per county
- \$7M - Subgrant to SOE's for Voting Technology Enhancements and Voting Accessibility (ADA)



#5 Cultural and Museum Grants

Division of Arts and Culture

- Request Amount \$5,000,000
- General Revenue
- General Program Support- awarding up to \$150,000 for non-profit, tax-exempt Florida corporations.
- Supports organizations engaged in conducting, creating, producing, presenting, staging, or sponsoring multiple cultural exhibits, performances, events, or providing cultural services
- Applications submitted April 1 – June 1 (2021 - 562 applications requesting \$46,161,529)
- Panels meet August – September to score projects, Florida Council on Arts and Culture forward approved projects to Secretary of State in October

#6 Statewide Electronic Filing System (Campaign Finance)

Division of Elections

- Request Amount \$2,000,000
- General Revenue
- Modernize the processes/programs for qualifying candidates, registering political entities, facilitating campaign finance reporting, maintaining public interfacing database
- Replaces legacy systems and create a new, robust and more secure mandatory Statewide Electronic Filing System
- Eliminates the need for any hard copy documents
- Enhances user experience, and provide more transparency in candidate and campaign finance activities

#7 Florida Rules Modernization

Division of Library and Information Services

- Request Amount \$2,500,000
- General Revenue
- FLRules.org's backend has aged to a point that is no longer sustainable resulting in unexpected downtime for users and unresolvable vulnerabilities
- Transition the FLRules.org website into a modern, Cloud hosted system
- Ensure the alignment of FLRules.org with Florida's Cybersecurity Standards
- Bring a more robust and modern user experience for citizens and agencies statewide

#8 Mission San Luis – Rethatch Council House Roof

Division of Historical Resources

- Request Amount \$800,000
- Land Acquisition Trust Fund
- Roof made of palmetto fronds was rotting and falling off structure, causing holes in roof and water intrusion, and had to be removed
- Will be replaced with durable, hurricane wind and fire resistant artificial fronds and have a 30-year lifespan negating need for re-thatching with natural fronds every few years
- Estimate is based on the cost to rethatch the reconstructed historic church at Mission San Luis three years ago

#9 OPS – Increase Staffing for Voter Registration Activities

Division of Elections

- Request Amount \$1,000,000
- General Revenue
- \$1M received in FY21/22 to address staffing needs associated with implementation of Amendment 4 (felon voting rights restoration)
- These funds are required to execute the permanent responsibilities associated with voter eligibility review
- We anticipate requesting a conversion of a portion of these staff to FTE in FY23/24



#10 Acquisition of Research Vessel

Division of Historical Resources

- Request Amount \$164,213
- Federal Grant Trust Fund
- Current vessel is mechanically unreliable and unsafe to conduct archaeological investigations
- Scientific diving and underwater archaeology require a vessel capable of safely supporting crew, along with equipment in a variety of weather conditions
- Jurisdiction extends 3 miles into the Atlantic and 9 miles into the Gulf
