

State Revenue Outlook








State Revenue Outlook


Major Transportation Revenue Sources












\$10.246 Billion in Transportation Investments






FY 2021-22 Transportation Improvements

- \$9.44 billion Work Program and Debt Service
 - \$2.8 billion for Highway Construction to include 210 new lane miles
 - \$1.0 billion in resurfacing to include 2,682 lane miles
 - \$110.6 million in seaport infrastructure enhancements
 - \$252.9 million for aviation improvements
 - \$73.0 million for spaceports
 - \$515.9 million scheduled repairs of 89 bridges and replacement of 18 bridges
 - \$704.3 million for rail/transit program advancements
 - \$172.0 million for safety initiatives






Five-Year History of Transportation Investments

Recent Legislation - State

SB 100:

- Repeals M-CORES (Multi-use Corridors of Regional Economic Significance)
 - Removes funding for the three corridors
 - Removes funding for SCOP, SCRAP, TD and Workforce Development





Recent Legislation - State

SB 100:

- Creates three arterial highway programs
 - Upgrade Arterial Highways (s. 339.66, F.S.)
 - US 19 Controlled Access Facilities (s. 339.67, F.S.)
 - From end of Suncoast Parkway 2 Phase 3 north predominantly along US 19 to I-10 in Madison County
 - Arterial Rural Highway Projects (s. 339.68, F.S.)
 - At least \$20M/year allocated for this program

Recent Legislation - Federal

- Federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA)
 - \$469.6M in General Fund received in January 2021
 - \$89.1M for urbanized areas
 - \$380.5M for infrastructure projects and offset revenue shortfalls





Recent Legislation - Federal

General Appropriations Act SB 2500:

- Section 152 Federal American Rescue Plan Act, State Fiscal Recovery Fund
 - \$1.38 billion for State Highway System projects over two years
 - \$250 million for port operation grants





Recent Legislation - Federal

- FAST Act extension
 - Short-term continuing resolution through December 3rd
 - Next Transportation Act being debated in Congress
