FLORIDA OFFICE OF BROADBAND

Established: HB 969 Broadband Internet Service was signed by Governor DeSantis on June 6, 2020, and went into effect on July 1, 2020.

Statutory Authority: Sections 288.9961, 288.9962, and 288.9963, Florida Statutes.

Budget: Currently, the Florida Office of Broadband operates using existing staff/resources.

The Office of Broadband received a nonrecurring appropriation of \$1.5 million from the state's General Revenue Fund for State Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to develop a broadband availability map.

The Governor's FY 2022-2023 Freedom First Budget includes:

- 1 FTE, \$84,000
- \$35,862 Expenses
- \$200,000 Contracted Services to update and maintain the Geographic Information System mapping of statewide broadband Internet availability as required by Chapter 2021-24, Laws of Florida.

BROADBAND AVAILABILITY MAP DIRECTIVE

Established: HB 1239 Broadband Internet Infrastructure was signed by Governor DeSantis on May 7, 2021, and went into effect on July 1, 2021. The state's Broadband Availability Map must be complete by June 30, 2022.

Section 288.9961, Florida Statutes, directs the Office of Broadband to develop a map of broadband internet service availability throughout this state that identifies:

- Where broadband-capable networks exist;
- Where service is available to end users;
- Gaps in rural areas; and
- Download and upload speeds.

BROADBAND AVAILABILITY MAP DEVELOPMENT

Current Status

The first phase of Florida's Broadband Availability Map was initiated in December 2021 when it was made publicly available on the DEO Office of Broadband website.

Crowdsourcing

The second phase involves crowdsourcing. Crowdsourcing is the process to empower individuals to participate and upload the data they have created. This will mobilize every Floridian and provide them with the opportunity to engage and provide input to the state about their internet service access and availability.

About Us

The Office of Broadband works with local and state government agencies, community organizations and private businesses to increase the availability and effectiveness of broadband internet throughout the state, specifically in small and rural communities. Through these partnerships, the Office of Broadband encourages investment in grant funding opportunities for the broadband program that focus on the expansion of broadband.

Florida's Broadband Availability Map and Internet Speed Test

The Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) has developed Florida's Broadband Availability Map to identify broadband internet service availability throughout the state. The Broadband Availability Map identifies a location's speed, connectivity, and access to broadband services. These insights allow the state of Florida to better identify and reach unserved and underserved areas of the state. The map will be an asset to local communities and internet service providers to assist with broadband planning efforts.

As part of DEO's efforts to encourage public participation collaboration and ensure a high level of transparency, the Florida Broadband Availability Map will be continuously updated on this webpage. Please note that the map is not complete and will continue to be updated as more data is added and changes in broadband availability are identified.

DEO is enlisting the help of the public to take an internet speed test to assist in further developing Florida's Broadband Availability Map. Your participation will help the state of Florida identify gaps in high-speed internet service in order to advance the state's overall broadband infrastructure expansion goals. Using your internet connection, the speed test will measure the speed of internet transmission between your device and an outside server. The speed test can be completed using any device that has an internet or cellular connection and takes less than one minute to complete. After taking the speed test, you will receive immediate results from your test. Results will populate the map once you complete the speed test and will include your download, upload, latency, and ping speeds. The data collected from your internet's speed test will be displayed on the Florida Broadband Availability Map in real time.

LOCAL TECHNOLOGY PLANNING TEAMS

Section 288.9961, Florida Statutes, directs the Office of Broadband to build and facilitate Local Technology Planning Teams, which shall work with communities to:


- Understand their current broadband availability;
- Locate unserved and underserved businesses and residents;
- Identify assets relevant to broadband deployment;
- Build partnerships with broadband service providers; and
- Identify opportunities to leverage assets and reduce barriers to the deployment of broadband Internet services in the community.

**The teams or partnerships must be proactive in fiscally constrained counties with identifying grant opportunities and applying for federal grants for broadband internet service.*





STRATEGIC PLAN FOR BROADBAND

Overview: DEO's Office of Broadband is required to create a strategic plan to increase the use of broadband internet service in Florida, per Section 288.9961, F.S. The plan must include a process to review and verify public input on the broadband internet transmission speeds and availability, federal broadband activities, and funding sources.

The Department received a U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration State Planning Grant for \$1 million. The Department has partnered with the University of Florida to fund a study and create the Florida Strategic Plan for Broadband.

The **Florida Strategic Plan for Broadband is due** to the Governor, Florida Senate President, and the Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives **by June 30, 2022.**

FEDERAL FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR BROADBAND

Capital Projects Fund

The Capital Projects Fund (CPF) was established in the American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021. ARPA appropriated \$10 billion to provide payments to states to “carry out capital improvement projects”. Florida was allocated **\$366,036,869**. The CPF funding was included in the Governor’s FY 2022-2023 Freedom First Budget.

Period of Performance: All funds must be expended by **December 31, 2026**.

For a Capital Project to be eligible to utilize Capital Projects Fund grant funds, it must meet all of the following criteria:

1. The Capital Project invests in capital assets **designed to directly enable work, education, and health monitoring.**
2. The Capital Project is designed to address a **critical need that resulted from, was made apparent, or exacerbated by the pandemic.**
3. The Capital Project is designed to address a **critical need of the community to be served by it.**

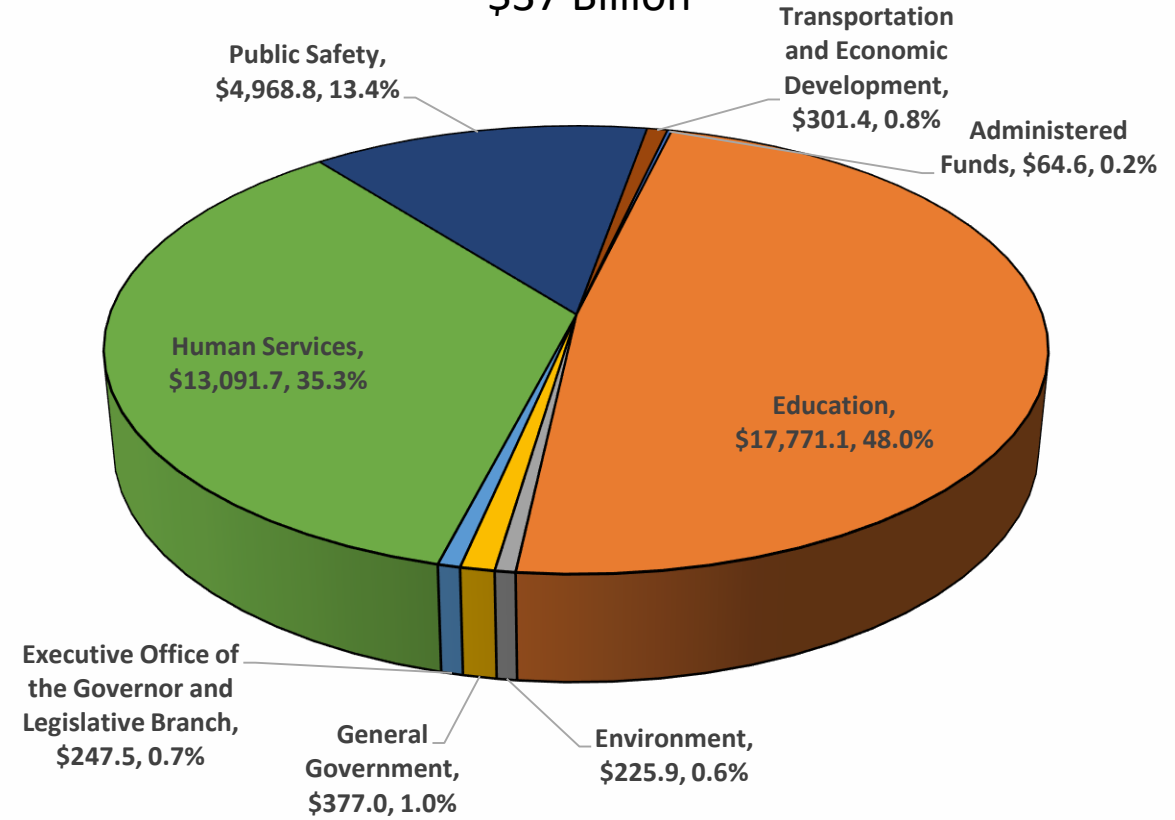
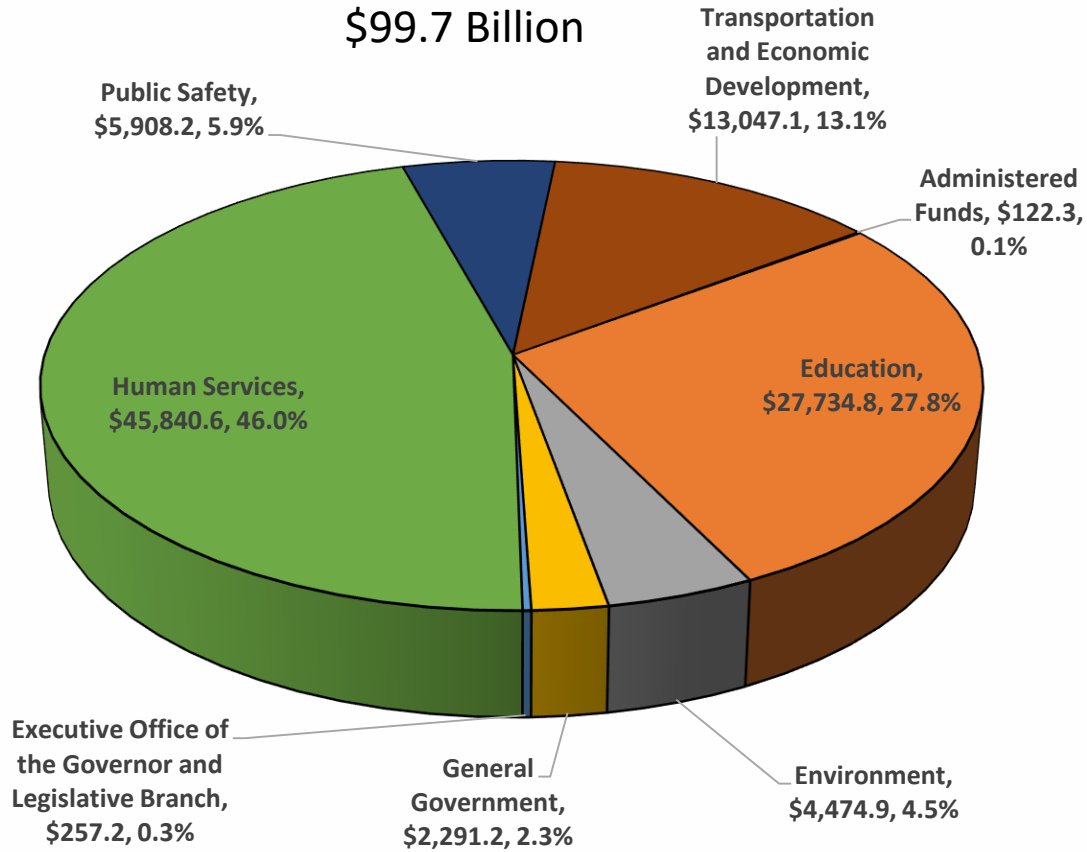

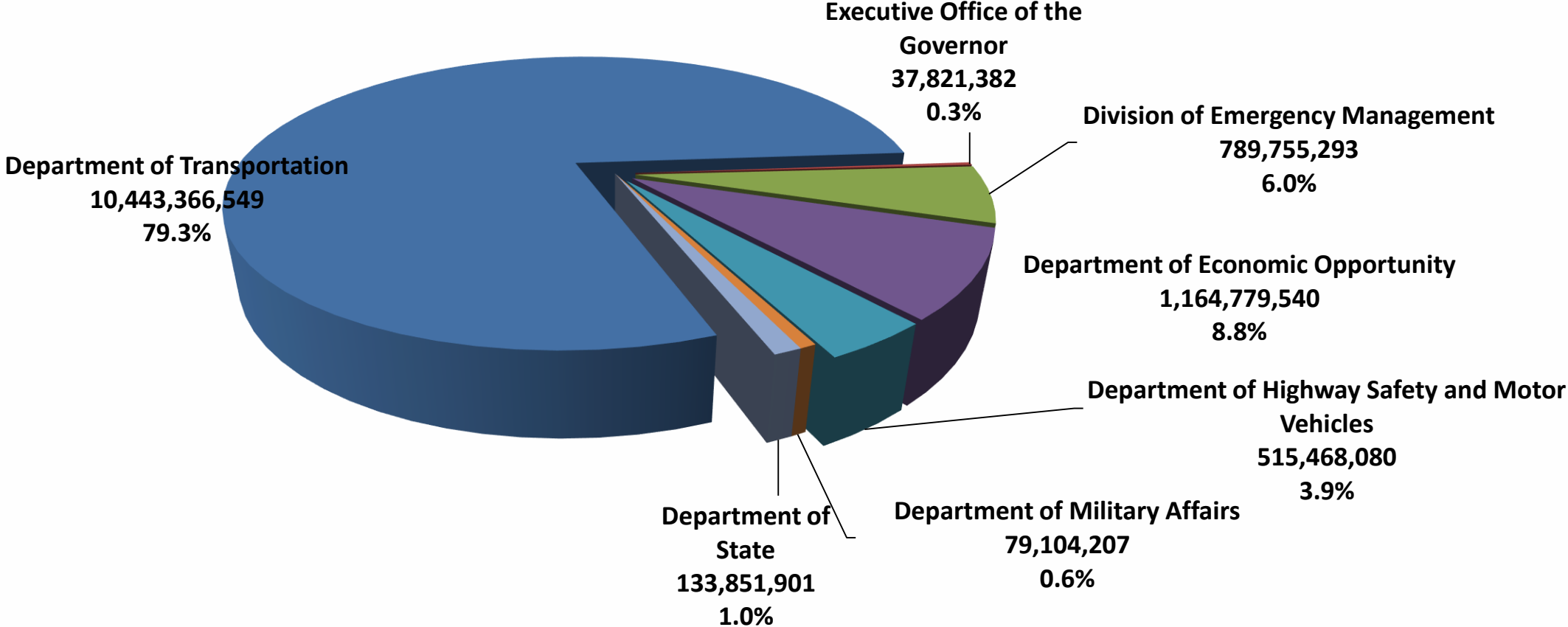
