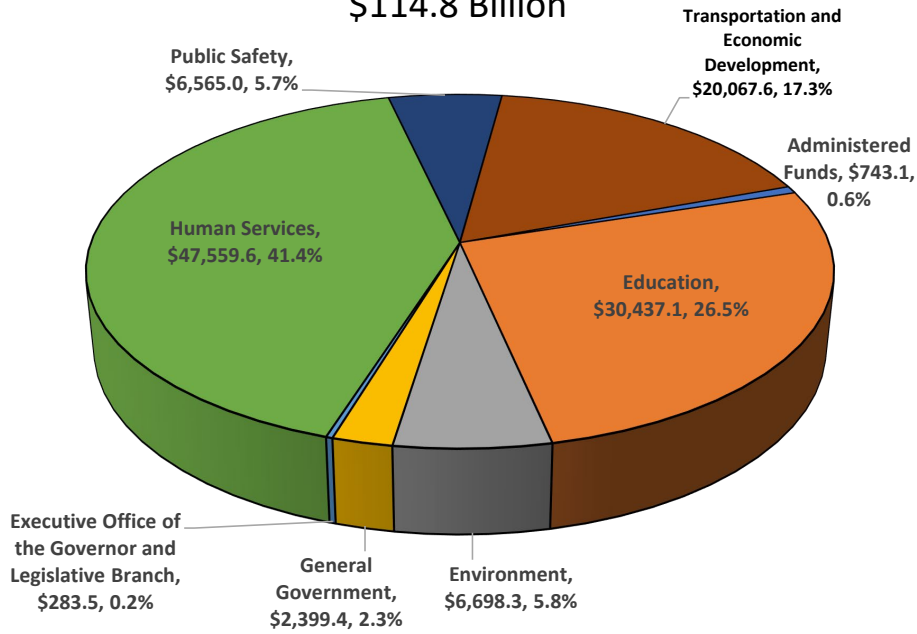

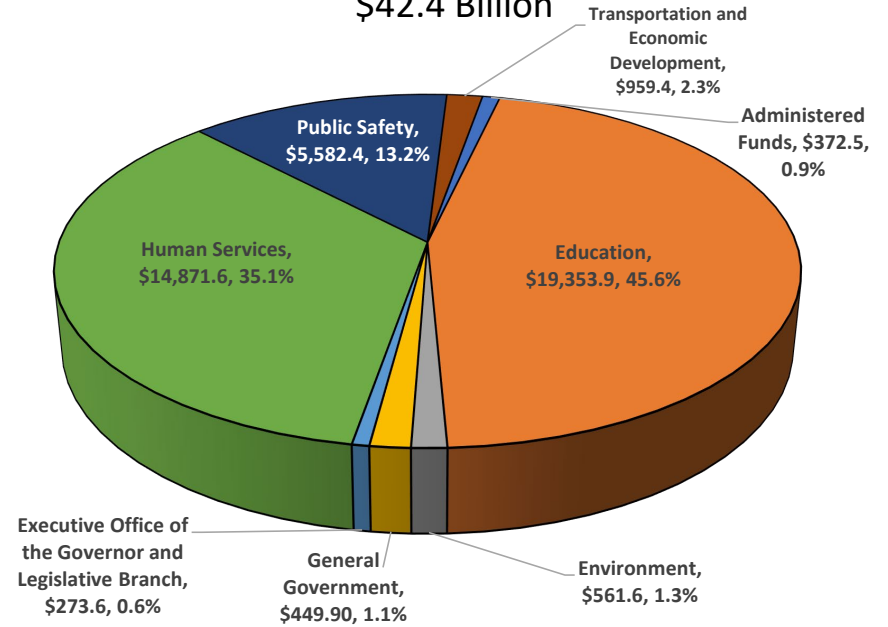


# Framework for Freedom Budget

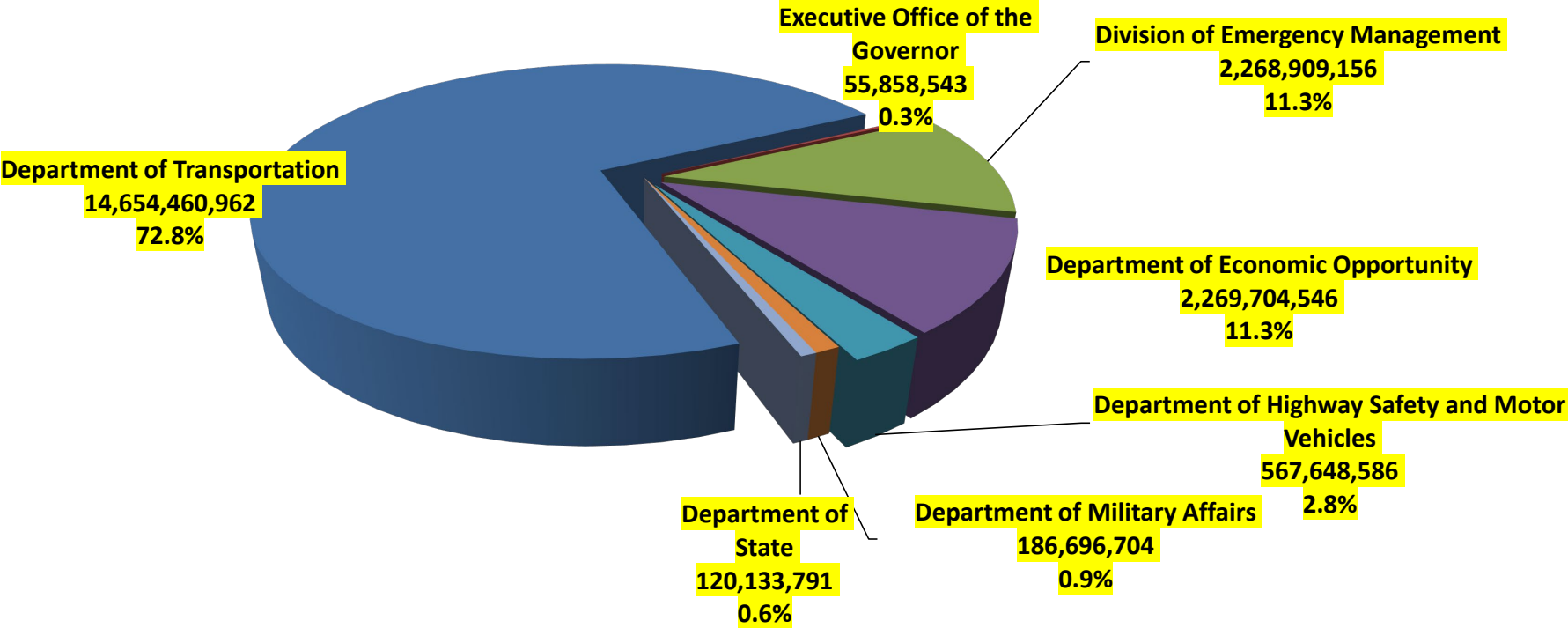

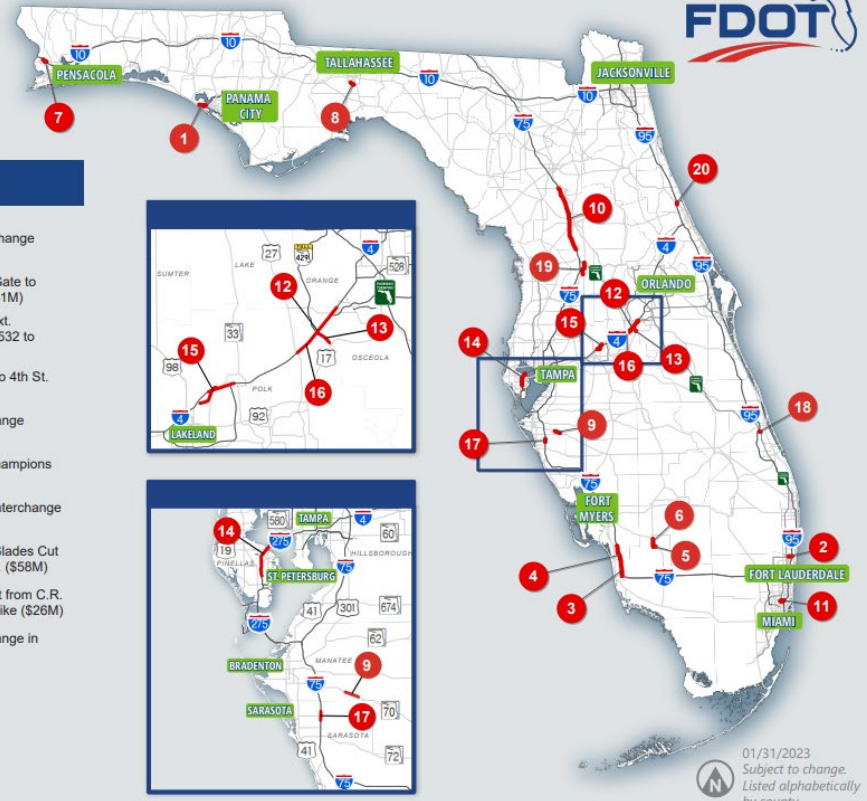
