1	<b>SB 208</b> Burgess (Similar CS/H 801)	Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia Training for Law Enforcement Officers; Requiring the Department of Law Enforcement to establish an online, continued employment training component relating to Alzheimer's disease and related forms of dementia; requiring that the training component be developed with the Department of Elderly Affairs; authorizing the completion of such training to count toward a certain requirement, etc.  CJ     01/23/2024 Fav/CS ACJ FP	Fav/CS Yeas 8 Nays 0
2	<b>SB 232</b> Wright (Identical H 871)	Driving Under the Influence; Prohibiting a trial court judge from accepting specified pleas when a person is charged with the offense of driving under the influence unless specified conditions are met; requiring that a person be told that his or her failure to submit to a lawful test of breath or urine is a second degree misdemeanor or a first degree misdemeanor under certain circumstances; classifying a person's refusal to submit to a chemical or physical test of breath or urine as a second degree misdemeanor or a first degree misdemeanor under certain circumstances; authorizing judicial circuits to create a driving under the influence diversion program, etc.  CJ     01/23/2024 Fav/CS ACJ FP	Fav/CS Yeas 8 Nays 0
3	<b>SB 258</b> Perry (Identical H 317)	Interstate Safety; Defining the term "furthermost left-hand lane"; prohibiting a driver from operating a motor vehicle in the furthermost left-hand lane of certain roadways, except under certain circumstances, etc.  TR     01/10/2024 Favorable CJ     01/23/2024 Favorable RC	Favorable Yeas 8 Nays 0

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4	<b>SB 260</b> DiCeglie (Similar CS/H 39)	Refusal to Submit to a Breath, Urine, or Blood Test; Requiring a person arrested for driving under the influence who refuses to submit to a lawful test of his or her breath to be told that he or she is subject to mandatory placement, at his or her own expense and for a specified period, of an ignition interlock device on all vehicles that are individually or jointly leased or owned and routinely operated by the person; directing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to require placement of an ignition interlock device before issuing a permanent or restricted driver license to a person who refused to submit to a lawful test of his or her breath, etc.  TR 12/13/2023 Favorable CJ 01/23/2024 Fav/CS FP	Fav/CS Yeas 8 Nays 0
5	<b>SB 576</b> Ingoglia (Compare H 601)	Investigation of Complaints Against Law Enforcement and Correctional Officers; Revising the definition of "political subdivision"; prohibiting a political subdivision from adopting or attempting to enforce certain ordinances relating to the receipt, processing, or investigation of complaints against law enforcement officers or correctional officers, or relating to civilian oversight of law enforcement agency investigations of complaints of misconduct by such officers, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Favorable CA RC	Favorable Yeas 6 Nays 2
6	<b>SB 718</b> Collins (Similar CS/H 231)	Exposures of First Responders to Fentanyl; Providing criminal penalties for persons who recklessly expose first responders to fentanyl, fentanyl derivatives, analogs of fentanyl, or mixtures containing such substances and an overdose or serious bodily injury of a first responder results, if the substance or mixture is proven to have caused or been a substantial factor in causing the overdose or serious bodily injury of the first responder; specifying prima facie evidence that a person experienced an overdose or a serious bodily injury, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Fav/CS ACJ FP	Fav/CS Yeas 7 Nays 1

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7	<b>SB 808</b> DiCeglie (Similar CS/H 637)	Treatment by a Medical Specialist; Authorizing firefighters, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, and correctional probation officers to receive medical treatment by a medical specialist for certain conditions under certain circumstances; requiring firefighters, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, and correctional probation officers to notify certain entities of their selection of a medical specialist before beginning treatment, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Fav/CS AEG AP	Fav/CS Yeas 8 Nays 0
8	<b>SB 864</b> Collins (Similar H 829)	Autism Spectrum Disorder Training for Law Enforcement Officers; Providing requirements for training officers for interacting with individuals with autism spectrum disorder; requiring the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to adopt rules requiring such training as part of continued employment training for officers, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Fav/CS ACJ FP	Fav/CS Yeas 8 Nays 0
9	<b>SB 1190</b> Ingoglia (Identical H 1131)	Online Sting Operations Grant Program; Creating the Online Sting Operations Grant Program within the Department of Law Enforcement to support local law enforcement agencies in creating certain sting operations to protect children; requiring the department to annually award grant funds to local law enforcement agencies; authorizing the department to establish criteria and set specific time periods for the acceptance of applications and the selection process for awarding grant funds, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Favorable ACJ FP	Favorable Yeas 8 Nays 0
10	<b>SB 1220</b> Martin (Similar H 1171)	Schemes to Defraud; Providing for the reclassification of certain scheme-to-defraud offenses committed against persons 65 years of age or older or persons with certain disabilities; authorizing a person whose image or likeness is used without his or her consent in a scheme to defraud to file a civil action for damages, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Favorable ACJ FP	Favorable Yeas 8 Nays 0

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11	<b>SB 1222</b> Trumbull (Similar CS/H 549, Compare S 824)	Theft; Reducing the minimum threshold amount for grand theft of the third degree; creating the offense of grand theft of the third degree; providing criminal penalties; defining the term "social media platform"; providing criminal penalties for persons committing certain retail theft acts in concert with a certain number of other persons within one or more establishments for specified purposes, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Fav/CS ACJ FP	Fav/CS Yeas 7 Nays 1
12	<b>SB 1230</b> Bradley (Identical H 1235)	Sexual Predators and Sexual Offenders; Revising the definitions of the terms "conviction," "permanent residence," "temporary residence," and "transient residence"; specifying that, in order to qualify for removal of certain registration requirements, certain sexual offenders must meet specified criteria; authorizing sexual predators to report to the Department of Law Enforcement through the department's online system within a specified timeframe required vehicle information changes after any change in vehicles owned, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Favorable ACJ FP	Favorable Yeas 8 Nays 0
13	<b>SB 1278</b> Martin (Identical H 1337)	Department of Corrections; Providing additional authority for law enforcement officers of the office of the inspector general concerning department and private correctional facilities; providing that correctional privatization contracts are not exempt from specified state contracting provisions unless otherwise specified; removing provisions concerning development of consensus per diem rates by the Prison Per-Diem Workgroup, etc.  CJ 01/23/2024 Favorable ACJ FP	Favorable Yeas 8 Nays 0

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14	<b>SB 1284</b> Martin (Similar H 959)	Health Care for Inmates; Providing for individual dignity and treatment; substantially rewording provisions concerning involuntary examinations of inmates and providing requirements therefor; substantially rewording provisions relating to placement and treatment of an inmate in a mental health treatment facility and providing requirements therefor; specifying purposes for which an inmate's mental health treatment records may be provided to the Florida Commission on Offender Review and the Department of Children and Families, etc.  CJ      01/23/2024 Favorable ACJ FP	Favorable Yeas 8 Nays 0
