3	CS/CS/SB 284 Finance and Tax / Governmental Oversight and Accountability / Brodeur (Similar CS/H 1025)	Energy; Revising the selection criteria for purchasing or leasing vehicles for state agencies, state universities, community colleges, and local governments under a state purchasing plan; specifying that, if available, a state agency must use certain fuels in vehicles with internal combustion engines; requiring the Department of Management Services, before a specified date, to make recommendations to state agencies, state universities, community colleges, and local governments relating to the procurement and integration of electric and natural gas fuel vehicles and other vehicles powered by renewable energy, etc. GO 02/21/2023 Fav/CS FT 03/14/2023 Fav/CS FP 03/28/2023 Favorable	Favorable Yeas 19 Nays 0
4	SB 300 Grall (Similar H 7)	Pregnancy and Parenting Support; Requiring the Department of Health to contract for the management and delivery of parenting support services, in addition to pregnancy support services; prohibiting physicians from knowingly performing or inducing a termination of pregnancy after the gestational age of the fetus is determined to be more than 6 weeks, rather than 15 weeks, with exceptions; providing an exception if the woman obtaining the abortion is doing so because she is a victim of rape or incest, subject to certain conditions; prohibiting any person other than a physician from inducing a termination of pregnancy; requiring that medications intended for use in a medical abortion be dispensed in person by a physician; prohibiting the dispensing of such medication through the United States Postal Service or any other courier or shipping service, etc. HP 03/20/2023 Favorable FP 03/28/2023 Favorable	Favorable Yeas 12 Nays 7
5	CS/CS/SB 306 Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice / Criminal Justice / Boyd (Identical CS/H 185)	Catalytic Converters; Designating the “Catalytic Converter Antitheft Act”; prohibiting a person from knowingly purchasing a detached catalytic converter unless he or she is a registered secondary metals recycler; prohibiting a person from knowingly importing, manufacturing, purchasing for a certain purpose, selling, offering for sale, or installing or reinstalling a counterfeit, fake, or nonfunctional catalytic converter; prohibiting a secondary metals recycler from processing or removing a detached catalytic converter from the recycler’s place of business for a specified number of days, etc. CJ 02/14/2023 Fav/CS ACJ 03/14/2023 Fav/CS FP 03/28/2023 Favorable	Favorable Yeas 19 Nays 0

6	SB 508 Rouson (Identical H 1227)	<p>Problem-solving Courts; Revising the responsibilities of coordinators of treatment-based drug court programs; requiring such programs to collect specified data and information for certain purposes; requiring such programs to annually report certain information and data to the Office of the State Courts Administrator; authorizing courts to determine how long a person may be admitted into certain programs; revising admission requirements for certain programs; revising eligibility requirements for voluntary admission into certain substance abuse programs, etc.</p> <p>JU 03/07/2023 Favorable ACJ 03/14/2023 Favorable FP 03/28/2023 Favorable</p>	Favorable Yeas 19 Nays 0
