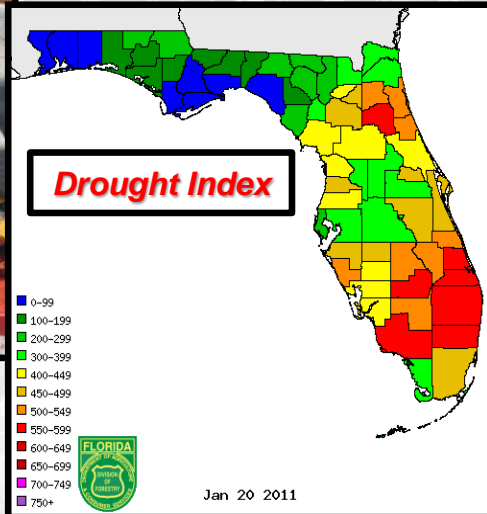
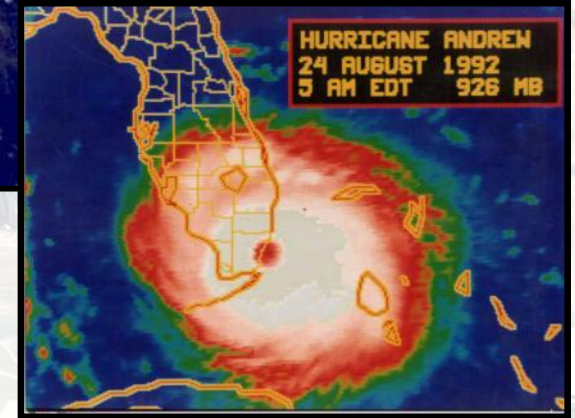

Background & Outlook

Tropical Events

- **Historical Experience:**
 - 35 activations since 1992
 - 1992 Hurricane Andrew (6,266 pers.)
 - 2004-2005 responded to 9 named storms
- **2011 Outlook: 9 named storms (5 major) with 49% landfall probability (above average)**



Wildfires

- **Historical Experience:**
 - 6 Activations since 1992
 - 1998 wildfire season (1,800 pers)
- **2011 Outlook: La Nina persists leading to extreme wildfire forecast (La Nina existed during 5 worst seasons on record)**



Available Personnel & Equipment

- 6,400 Soldiers and Airmen (8,000 projected for 2011 hurricane season)
- 500 member quick reaction force
- Over 2,300 High Wheeled Vehicles
- 14 Rotary Wing Aircraft
- 81% of equipment on hand

Significant Increase from '04 & '05 Hurricane Seasons (42% of equipment on hand)

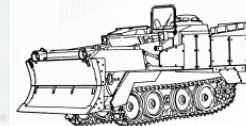

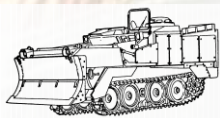
