
















Why Grow the FLNG




- As the 3rd most populous state, **FLNG is ranked 53 out of 54** (Guard : Population ratio)
- Florida's population will grow 5M over the next 10 years
- FL is 4th most disaster prone State in the Nation
- We use Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) for nearly every response
 - Hurricane Irma required the most support: EMAC'd over 2,200 soldiers from 22 states
 - EMAC will not be supported for a Pandemic response
- If FSA were "proportional," the FLNG would be **<u>18-21,000 Guardsmen, rather than ~12,000.</u>**
- <u>Current growth is not fast or big enough to meet the demand/requirements.</u>
- <u>High Operational Tempo:</u>
 - <u>COVID</u>: > 2,900 Soldiers & Airmen activated; > 400k man days (9th month 850 pax on duty)
 - Hurricanes: Since Andrew, 48 activations; over 700K man days with 63K personnel
 - o <u>Federal Deployments:</u> Over 22,000 Soldiers & Airmen deployed since 9/11
