

Established dedicated COVID-19 isolation nursing facilities



Developed innovative model of COVID-19 isolation nursing facilities, dedicated to serving patients in need of long-term care services who were also diagnosed with COVID-19.

•Allowed for appropriate isolation and recovery of COVID-19 positive patients


•First group of facilities established in April 2020 – approximately 200 beds available

•Regional resources for any COVID-19 positive patient requiring nursing facility level of care

•Required to accept patients with any type of insurance and patients who were uninsured

By July, the Agency had executed agreements with 23 facilities statewide with the capacity to serve up to 1,500 patients needing COVID-19 isolation.







Florida's Vaccination Efforts

Align Medicaid program policy and operation to ensure vaccine coverage



Established broad coverage policy to ensure all recipients have access to vaccinations. Efforts

include ensuring:



•Coverage of the COVID-19 vaccine for all Medicaid recipients who have full Medicaid benefits



No co-payments



•Medicaid vaccine administration fee is equivalent to Medicare vaccine administration fee



•Medicaid health plans must have open provider networks for vaccine administration



Florida's Vaccination Efforts

Support State of Florida's vaccination efforts





- Emergency rules require nursing homes and ALFs to participate in CDC Pharmacy Partnership with Walgreens and CVS
- Collected vaccine data from hospitals and long-term care facilities that could be used to support vaccine allocation efforts
- Leveraging provider partnerships to respond to needs and questions

March 2020 – Our World Changed

- Long Term Care Centers quickly became a central focus of the state and federal response to the pandemic.
- Pandemic surpassed any previous infectious disease outbreaks in long term care history and scope of experience.
- Facilities have showed extraordinary resilience and commitment to the safety and health of their residents.
- Multiple challenges in complying with local, state and federal requirements often with little time to adjust.
- Managing staff, resident and family fears and expectations became huge hurdle.





Our Demographics Impacted Our Risk

Florida Long Term Care Center Demographics

- 690 Nursing Homes
- 3100 Assisted Living Facilities
- Approx 138,400 Residents / 179,500 Staff

LTC Residents at Increased Risk

Our vulnerable population at high risk, and risk to staff health.

- Average Age of Residents (85)
- Underlying Medical Conditions
- Congregate Setting (Group Dining, Activities, etc.)
- Physical Plant Shared Rooms







Our Response is Saving Lives

COVID Stats

- Today: 97% of Residents COVID-free; 98% of Staff COVID-free
- Average throughout Pandemic: Approx. 98% COVID-free for Residents & Staff
- At Height of Spread: 97% of Residents; 95% of Staff COVID-free

Achieved By:

- Innovative implementation of best practices by healthcare heroes on frontline
- Effective isolation and infection control processes
- Swift action by providers, AHCA and Dept. of Health to quickly address spread in facilities





Facilities Enact Protocols – Call for Help

- Facilities Adopt Screening Staff & Visitors
- Expand Infection Control Safety Measures
- Require Disinfecting/Hand Hygiene

Nursing Homes Have Critical Needs

Supply Shortage Crisis for Personal Protective Equipment

Facilities forced to hand-sew masks, reuse supplies, resort to making gowns out of raincoats and trash bags to protect residents

• Initial Lack of Testing

Delayed test results put residents at risk, resulting in staffing challenges

Staff Carry the Weight

- Existing workforce shortages going into pandemic
- Caregivers working overtime to cover staff who are sick or have childcare issues
- Staff experiencing physical and mental exhaustion, fears of putting family at risk of exposure

AHCA Approves the Personal Care Attendant Program

- 8-hour training allows recruitment of new staff to assist CNAs in daily resident care
- Almost 2,000 new hires since program began; 85% of those who challenged the CNA state exam are now on a career path in long term care
- Priority to advocate during session to make permanent





Caregivers Strive to Meet Residents' Needs

- Work to keep residents and families connected through technology, drive-by parades, window visits
- Host hallway bingo, musical performances, serve as clergy
- Ask community to send flowers, letters
- In-house Barber and Styling salons shut down
 - CNAs provide those services to residents











Financial Challenges

Increased Expenses Due to COVID-19 Response

- Personal Protective Equipment
- Screening & Infection Control Supplies
- Overtime and Heroes Pay for Staff
- Physical Plant Upgrades to Mitigate Spread have doubled provider expenses in many cases

Facilities are Strained -

- Declining Occupancies (down 15%), Medicaid Funding Gap
- \$61 million a month in lost Medicaid Revenue Statewide

CARES Act Funding

- \$605 million in funding from federal government temporary and limited infusion
- Used toward PPE, Testing, Staffing / Heroes Pay, Visitation Stations

DOH Strike Teams work with local centers

Vaccine Rollout

CDC Pharmacy Partnership for LTC with CVS/Walgreens

DOH Vaccine Strike Teams for Nursing Homes in Broward and Pinellas Six South Florida Nursing Homes Pilot In-House Vaccine Clinics; Doses Administered by Their Clinical Teams

- Nearly all Nursing Homes Completed First Dose Clinics
- Second Dose Clinics Underway

ALFs – CVS, Walgreens and State Contract with CDR Health to Administer Vaccines

- First Dose Clinics Scheduled in Vast Majority of ALFs
 FHCA & Members Working to Promote High Vaccination Rate
- 70-80% of Residents Taking Vaccine; 40% of Staff
- Vaccinations Among Staff Are Higher in Second Clinic







Continuing the Response

Strengthened Existing Relationships

- Teamwork with all local, state and federal agencies, to find strategies and solutions to unexpected or unintended issues; reopening to visitors; overcoming vaccine hesitancy
- Takes all partners working together to yield best health outcomes for LTC residents

- Rebuilding public trust and confidence in the Long Term Care Community
- Long term vaccine strategy in 2021 and beyond


Location, Asymptomatic Spread & Testing Availability Factors in COVID-19 Outbreaks

Not Quality Ratings, Infection Citations Nor Staffing

- Continued Screening/Taking Temperatures Before Entry
- Wearing Masks to Prevent Asymptomatic Spread

Facilities Managing COVID Threat More Effectively Through Gained Knowledge

- Proper Use of PPE
- Infection Control and Mitigation Strategies
- Managing COVID patient care with separate wings to mitigate spread or transferring to hospital when appropriate for a higher level of care

Managing Visitation to Ensure Continued Resident Safety

 Following Federal Guidelines, By Appointment with Families, Outside in Some Cases for Safety
