# WASTEWATER GRANT PROGRAM

**\$741 MILLION INVESTED OVER THE PAST FOUR YEARS**



- Created by SB 712 (2020), s. 403.0673.
- Must be in a Basin Management Action Plan (BMAP), Reasonable Assurance Plan (RAP) or Rural Area of Opportunity (RAO).
- Requires 50% match, except for RAOs.
- Septic to sewer, Advanced Wastewater Treatment (AWT) upgrade or expansion, and septic upgrade.
- Solicited on [ProtectingFloridaTogether.gov](https://ProtectingFloridaTogether.gov).

# WASTEWATER GRANT PROGRAM

## DEDICATED FUNDING



- **SB 5212** (2021) provided 5.4175% of a portion of documentary stamp tax distribution to be paid into the **Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust Fund** to be used to fund wastewater grants.
- Annual report submitted to the Senate, House and Governor.



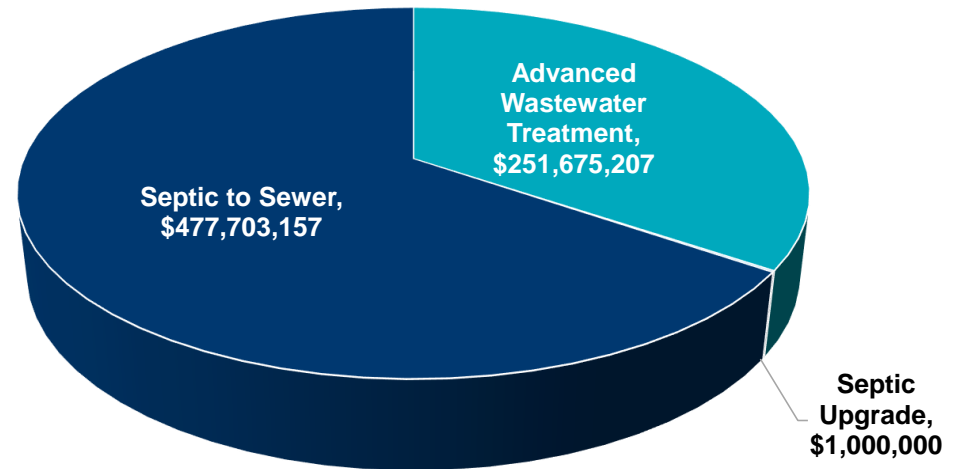

FY 2021-22 and 2022-23

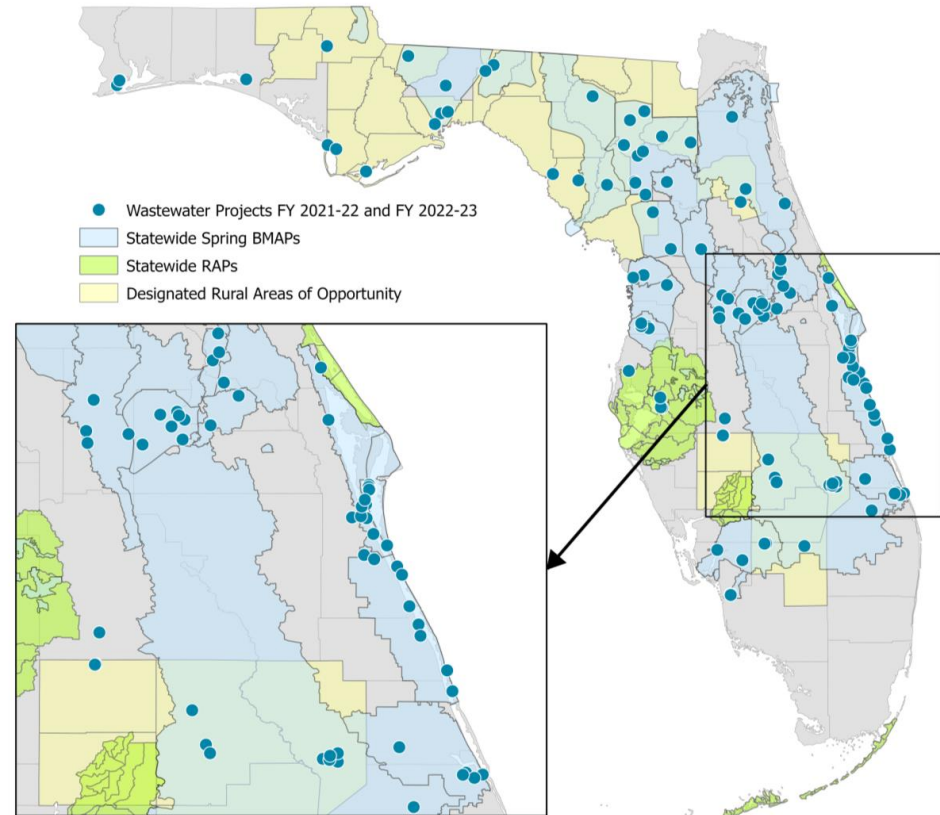


# WASTEWATER GRANT PROGRAM

# WASTEWATER GRANT PROGRAM

## EXECUTIVE ORDER 23-06



Work with the Legislature to expand the existing Wastewater Grant Program to **broaden project eligibility** to also address impacts from **nonpoint sources** such as stormwater and agricultural runoff and address **aging wastewater infrastructure** that increases nutrient loading to surface and groundwater.

Strategically engage with local governments and stakeholders to identify the most effective and beneficial water quality improvement projects.

Instruct all water management districts to annually identify regional projects to improve water quality.

Continue to prioritize grants to local governments for septic-to-sewer conversions and identify ways to minimize the installation of new septic systems in areas with impaired waterways.

Ensure that all wastewater facilities discharging to waterbodies within a BMAP area or discharging to a waterbody not attaining water quality standards upgrade to advanced wastewater treatment by 2033.

### 2021

- "Always Ready Bill" Establishing the Program and s. 380.093, F.S.
- Senate Bill 1954 / House Bill 7019.
- *Unanimously passed in both chambers.*

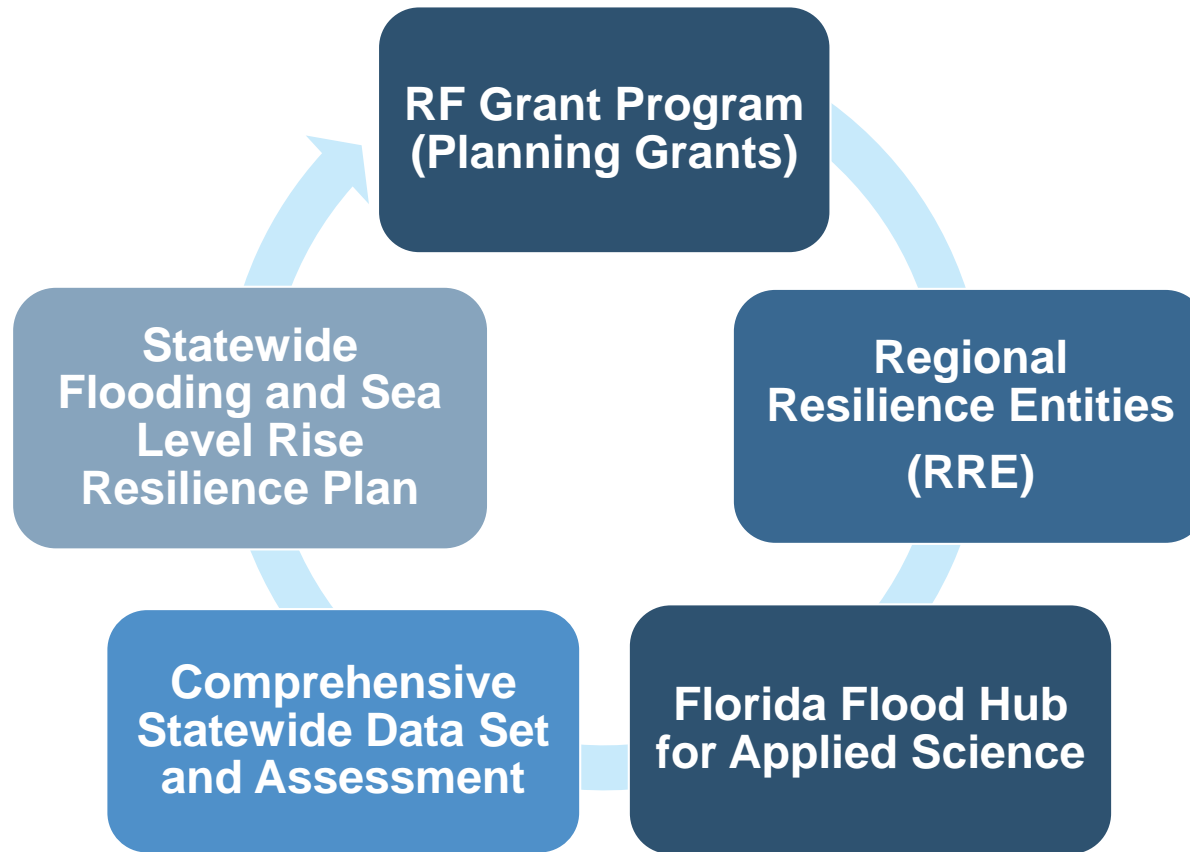
### 2022

- Added or modified definitions, eligible entities, due dates.
- Financially disadvantaged communities.
- Requires some Vulnerability Assessments (VAs) to include specific rainfall analyses.
- Statewide Resilience Plan must include funding amount not less than \$100M.



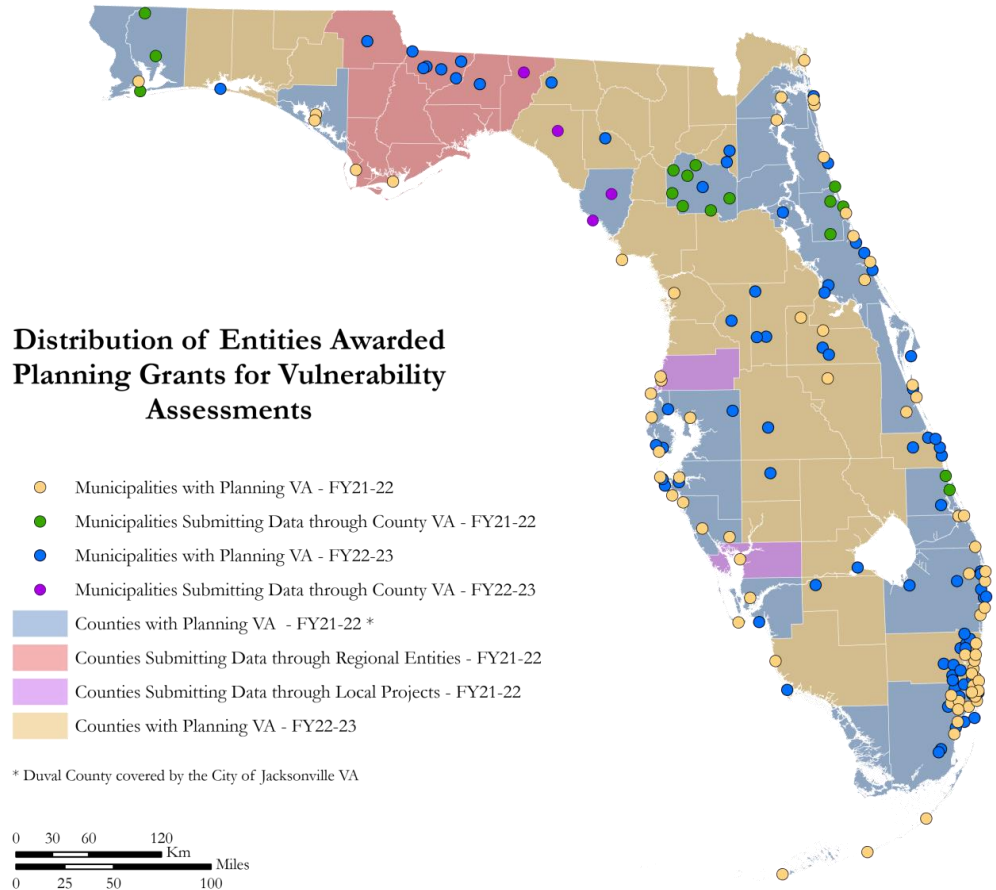

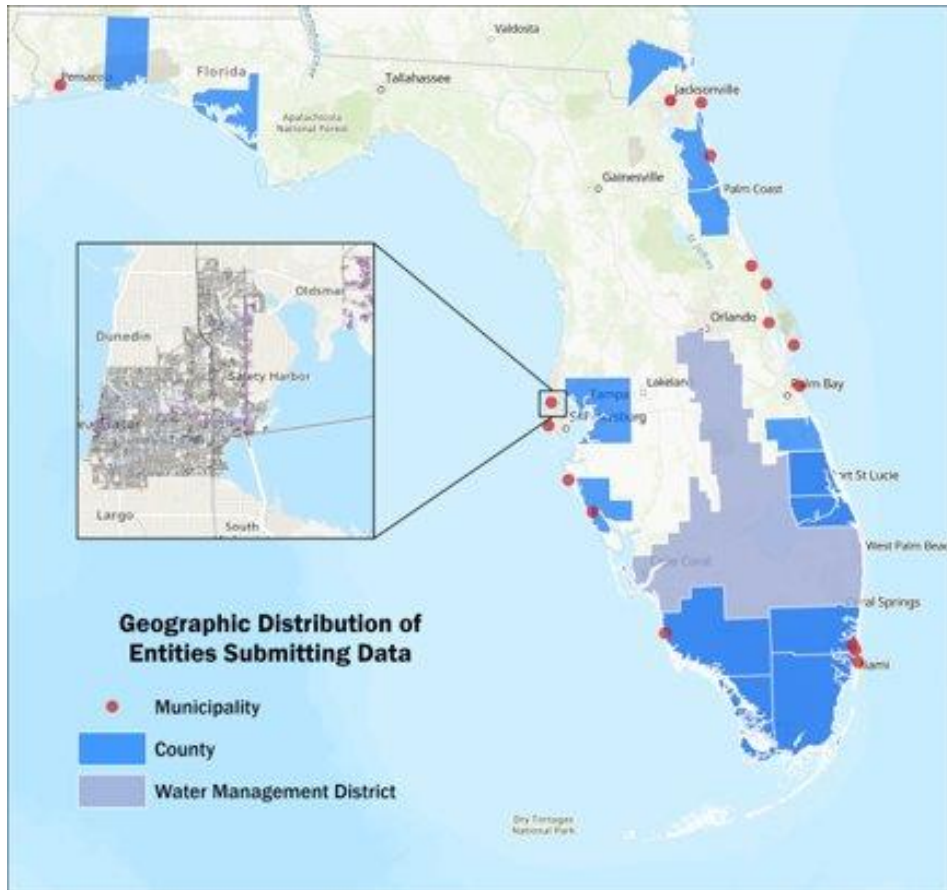
# RESILIENT FLORIDA GRANTS

## FOCUS ON PLANNING



- After Local, Regional, and State efforts to conduct Vulnerability Assessments conclude, all 67 Counties will meet statutory requirements to submit projects for inclusion in future iterations of the Statewide Resilience Plan.
- EO 23-06 calls on Chief Resilience Officer to ensure all 410 municipalities are covered by 2026.

# COMPREHENSIVE STATEWIDE DATA SET AND ASSESSMENT



- Compile national, statewide and local critical asset data.
- Review, organize and classify critical asset data.
- Coordinate with Florida Flood Hub for review and hosting.
- Data will be used to develop statewide vulnerability assessment.
- Data Set - June 2023.
- Statewide Assessment - June 2024.

# FLORIDA FLOOD HUB



- Focused on Florida's most pressing environmental challenges.
- Goal to improve flood forecasting; inform science-based policy, planning, and management.
- Working with the Program, the Flood Hub supports statewide efforts to protect people, businesses, natural resources and coastal infrastructure.

# RESILIENT FLORIDA

## STATEWIDE FLOODING AND SEA LEVEL RISE RESILIENCE PLAN



- Prioritized based on criteria in statute and implemented via rule 62S-8, F.A.C.
- 3-year rolling plan of projects.
- Fully-fund projects to completion.
- Previous vulnerability analysis completed identifying flooding.

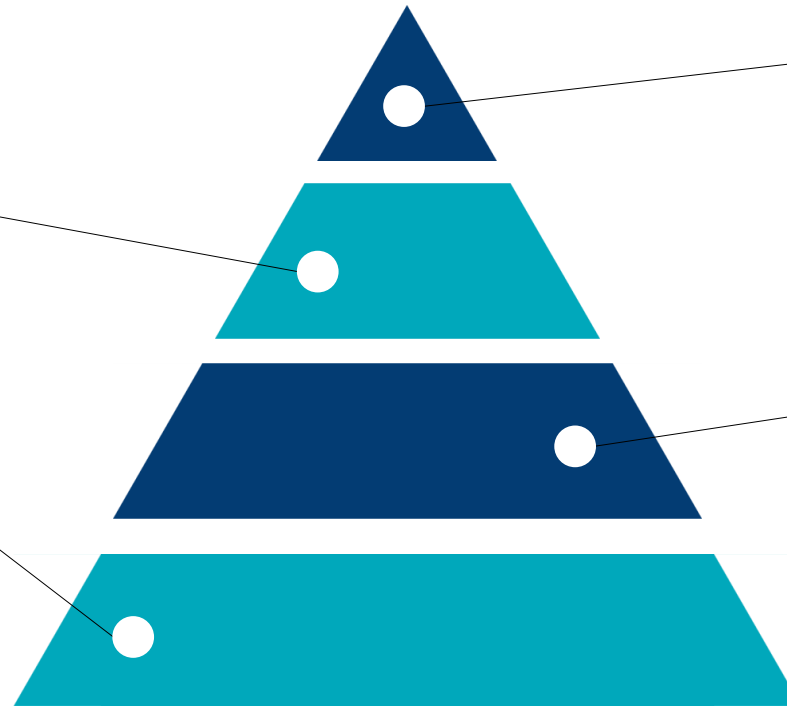
A TIERED REVIEW PROCESS FOR THE PLAN WAS CREATED IN SB 1954 AND CODIFIED IN SECTION 380.093, F.S., AND INCORPORATED IN DEP RULE 62S-8, F.A.C.

### TIER 3 (20%)

Local match, previous commitment and exceeding minimum requirements.

### TIER 1 (40%)

Addressing risks to critical assets and regionally significant assets, as well as existing efforts to reduce upland costs.



### TIER 4 (10%)

Innovation to reduce costs, regional collaboration, and financially disadvantaged communities.

### TIER 2 (30%)

Existing flooding conditions, readiness to proceed, and added environmental options

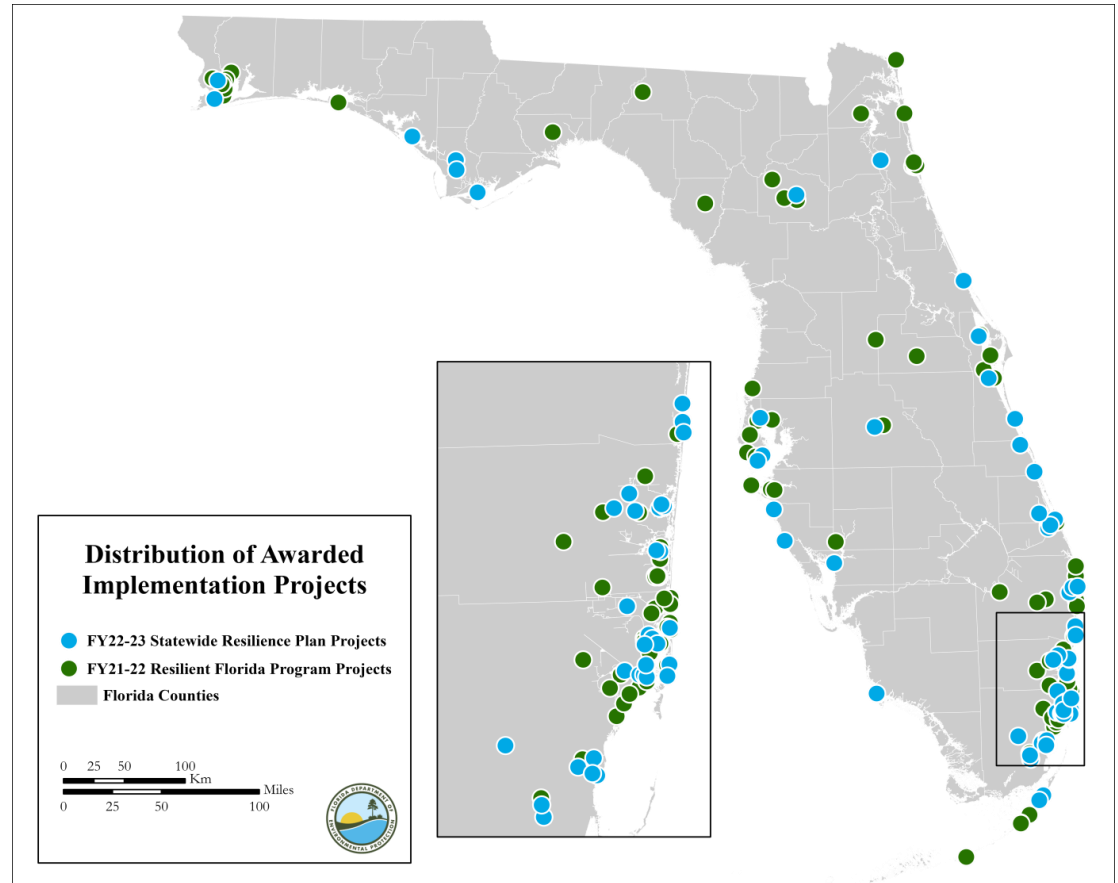

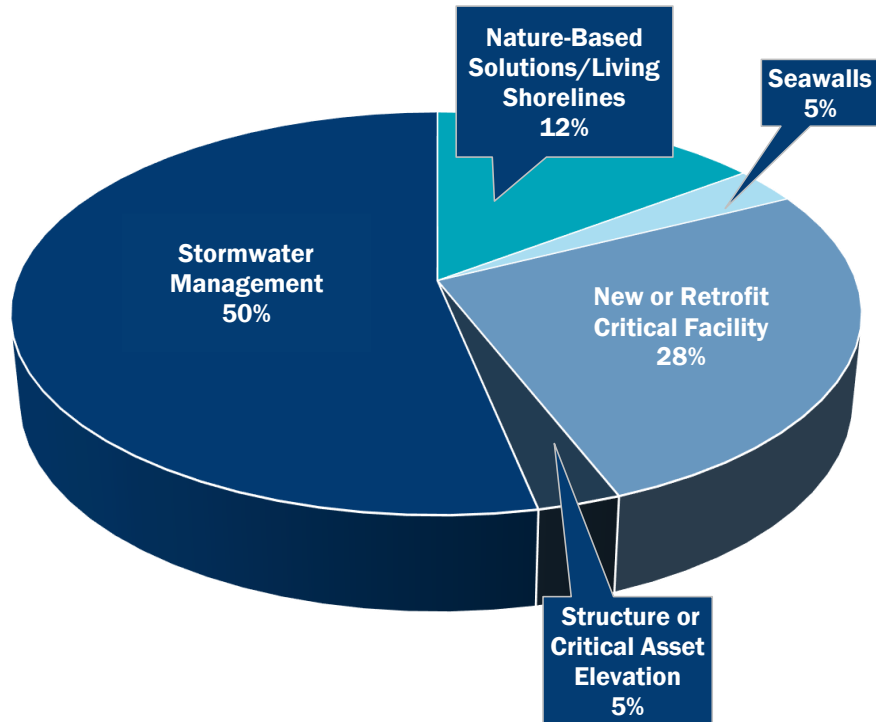

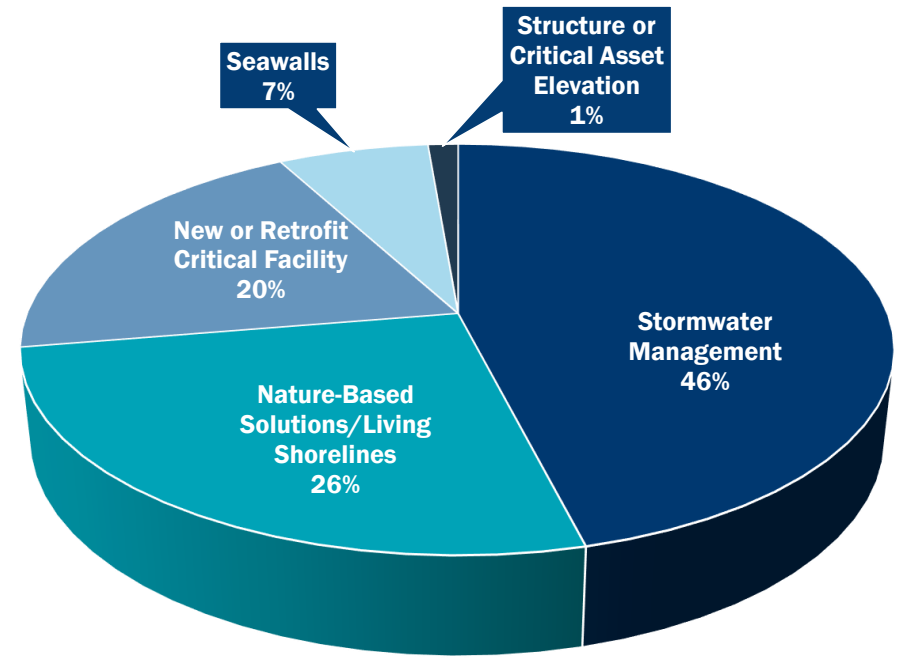
# IMPLEMENTATION PROJECT TYPES

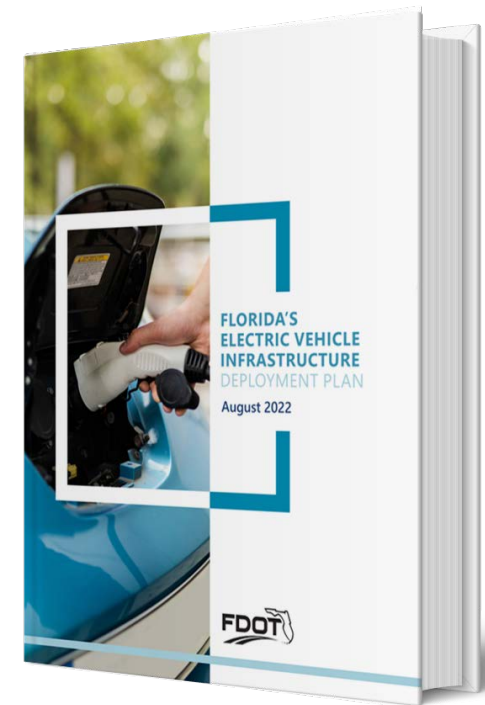

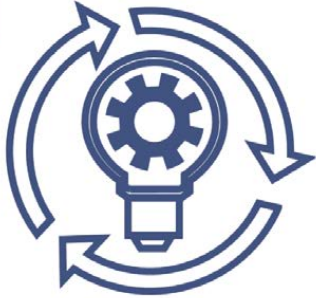

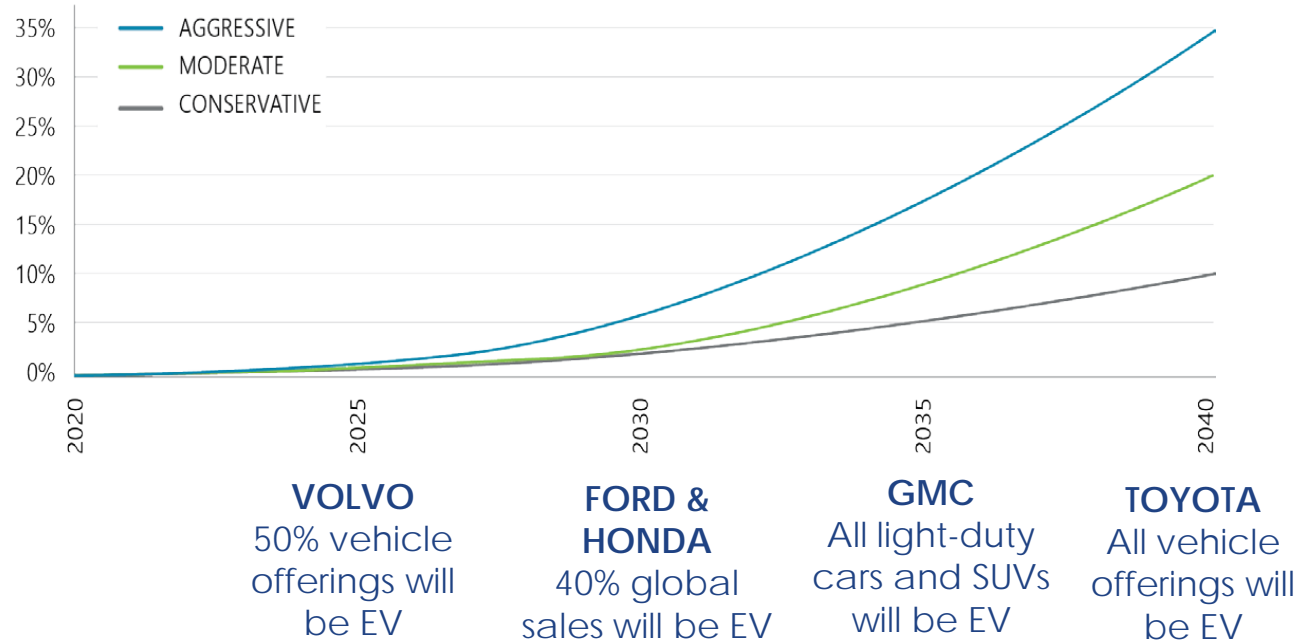

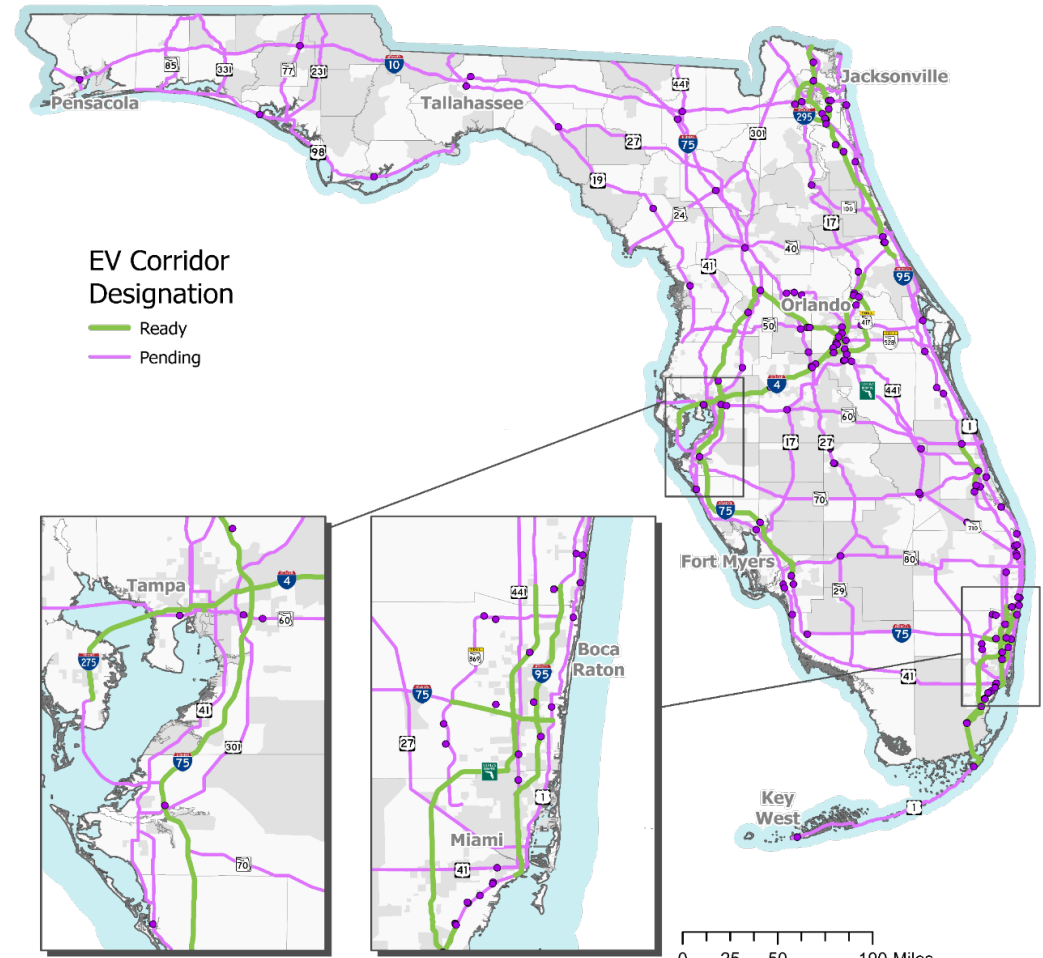

Electric Vehicle Corridor Designations

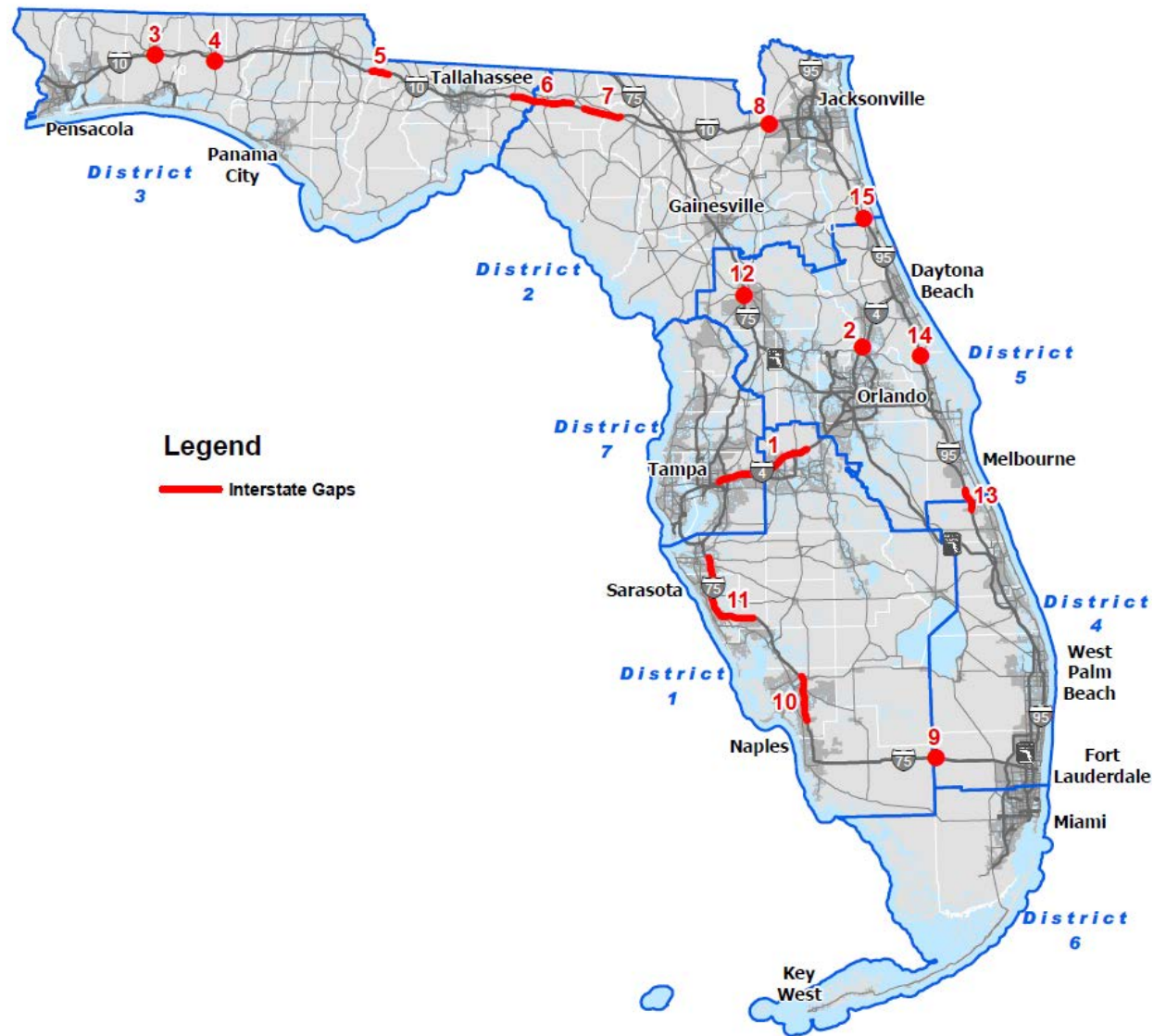

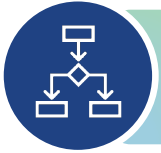

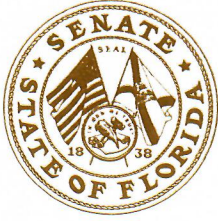
