COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE - Substantial Changes

I. Summary:

CS/SB 90 amends s. 316.305, F.S., to authorize enforcement of the ban on texting while driving as a primary offense. It requires that all penalties collected for a violation of the ban be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit into the Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund of the Department of Health. Finally, it requires that a law enforcement officer who has stopped a person for texting while driving inform the person of the right to decline a search of his or her wireless communications device.

Due to the redistribution of texting while driving penalty revenues, the bill will have an indeterminate fiscal impact to the General Revenue Fund, a number of state trust funds, the clerks of court, and municipalities. See Section V. Fiscal Impact Statement.

The bill takes effect October 1, 2018.

II. Present Situation:

Florida Ban on Texting While Driving Law

Section 316.305, F.S., is the “Florida Ban on Texting While Driving Law.” It bans a person from operating a motor vehicle while using a wireless communications device¹ in specified ways. Enforcement is permitted only as a secondary action when an operator of a motor vehicle has been detained for a suspected violation of another provision of chapter 316, F.S., the “Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law,” chapter 320, F.S., relating to motor vehicle licenses, or chapter 322, F.S., relating to driver licenses.

More specifically, the statute bans operation of a motor vehicle either while manually typing or entering multiple letters, numbers, symbols, or other characters into a wireless communications device or while sending or reading data on such a device for the purpose of non-voice interpersonal communication.² The ban does not apply to a stationary motor vehicle or to a motor vehicle operator who is:

- Performing official duties as an operator of an authorized emergency vehicle,³ a law enforcement or fire service professional, or an emergency medical services professional.
- Reporting an emergency or criminal or suspicious activity to law enforcement authorities.
- Receiving messages that are: related to the operation or navigation of the motor vehicle; safety-related information, including emergency, traffic, or weather alerts; data used primarily by the motor vehicle; or radio broadcasts.
- Using a device or system for navigation purposes.
- Conducting wireless interpersonal communication that does not require manual entry of multiple letters, numbers, or symbols, except to activate, deactivate, or initiate a feature or function.
- Conducting wireless interpersonal communication that does not require reading text messages, except to activate, deactivate, or initiate a feature or function.
- Operating an autonomous vehicle in autonomous mode.

Any person who violates the ban commits a noncriminal traffic infraction. A first violation is punishable as a nonmoving violation, and a second or subsequent violation within 5 years after the date of a prior conviction is punishable as a moving violation.⁴

¹ The statute defines the term “wireless communications device” to mean any handheld device used or capable of being used in a handheld manner, that is designed or intended to receive or transmit text or character-based messages, access or store data, or connect to the Internet or any communications service as defined in s. 812.15, F.S., and that allows text communications.

² This includes but is not limited to texting, e-mailing, and instant messaging.

³ The term “authorized emergency vehicle” is defined in s. 322.01(4), F.S., to mean a vehicle that is equipped with extraordinary audible and visual warning devices, that is authorized to display red or blue lights, and that is on call to respond to emergencies. The term includes, but is not limited to, ambulances, law enforcement vehicles, fire trucks, and other rescue vehicles; it does not include wreckers, utility trucks, or other vehicles that are used only incidentally for emergency purposes.

Drivers convicted of unlawful use of a wireless communications device that results in a crash will have six points assessed against their driver license,⁵ and drivers convicted of unlawful use of a wireless communications device within a school safety zone are assessed an additional two points.⁶

A user's billing records for a wireless communications device or the testimony of or written statements from appropriate authorities receiving such messages are admissible as evidence in any proceeding to determine whether a violation of the ban has been committed only in the event of a crash resulting in death or personal injury.

Texting While Driving Bans in Other States

As of July 2017, texting while driving violations are enforced as a primary offense in 43 states.⁷

Traffic Infraction Civil Penalties

Section 318.18, F.S., provides for penalties for traffic infractions and establishes a penalty of \$30 for a nonmoving traffic violation and \$60 for a moving violation.⁸

Section 318.21, F.S., requires that all traffic infraction civil penalties be paid monthly as follows:

- One dollar from every civil penalty shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit into the Child Welfare Training Trust Fund for child welfare training purposes.
- One dollar from every civil penalty shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit into the Juvenile Justice Training Trust Fund for juvenile justice purposes.
- Of the remainder:
 - Fifty-six and four-tenths percent: shall be divided if the violation occurred within a municipality, with 50.8 percent paid to that municipality and 5.6 percent deposited into the Fine and Forfeiture Trust Fund for use by the Clerks of the Circuit Court in performing court-related functions; shall be deposited into the fine and forfeiture fund for use by the Clerks of the Circuit Court in performing court-related functions if the violation occurred within the unincorporated area of a county; or shall be paid to a special improvement district of the Seminole Indian Tribe or Miccosukee Indian Tribe if the violation occurred there.
 - Twenty and six-tenths percent shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit into the General Revenue Fund of the state, except that the first \$300,000 shall be deposited into the Grants and Donations Trust Fund in the Justice Administrative Commission for administrative costs, training costs, and costs associated with the implementation and maintenance of Florida foster care citizen review panels in a constitutional charter county.

- Seven and two-tenths percent shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit in the Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund.
- Five and one-tenth percent shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit in the Additional Court Cost Clearing Trust Fund for criminal justice purposes.
- Eight and two-tenths percent shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit in the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program Trust Fund.
- Two percent shall be remitted to the Department of Revenue and transmitted monthly to the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation.
- Five-tenths percent shall be paid to the Clerk of the Circuit Court for administrative costs.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill authorizes enforcement of the texting ban as a primary offense.

It also requires that all penalties collected for a violation of the ban on texting while driving be remitted to the Department of Revenue for deposit into the Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund of the Department of Health. Currently, only seven and two-tenths percent of the penalties is deposited in this fund pursuant to s. 318.21, F.S.

Finally, it requires that a law enforcement officer who has stopped a person for texting while driving inform the person of the right to decline a search of his or her wireless communications device.

The bill takes effect October 1, 2018.

Operators of motor vehicles who are texting while driving will have an increased likelihood of being cited for a violation of the ban, with an increased likelihood of resulting penalties.

C. Government Sector Impact:

The Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund of the Department of Health will receive 100 percent of the texting while driving civil penalty amount instead of the current 7.2 percent, and will have an indeterminate positive fiscal impact. The other current recipients will no longer receive any of these penalty revenues, resulting in an indeterminate negative fiscal impact to the following:

- Child Welfare Training Trust Fund;
- Juvenile Justice Training Trust Fund;
- Municipalities;
- Circuit Court Clerks/Fine and Forfeiture Trust Fund;
- General Revenue Fund;
- Additional Court Cost Clearing Trust Fund;
- Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program Trust Fund;
- Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation; and
- Circuit Court Clerks for administrative costs.

I. Summary:

SB 672 revises the eligibility requirement for the agricultural restricted license plate. The bill allows truck tractors or heavy trucks, not operated as for-hire vehicles, engaged exclusively in transporting raw, unprocessed, and nonmanufactured agricultural or horticultural products that operate *within the state*, instead of within a 150-mile radius of the truck’s home address, be eligible for the restricted plate. The annual fee for the plate is:

- \$87.75 if such vehicle’s declared gross weight is less than 44,000 pounds; or
- \$324 if the vehicle’s declared gross weight is 44,000 pounds or more and such vehicle only transports from the point of production to the point of primary manufacture; the point of assembly; or to a shipping point.

The bill is estimated to have a negative insignificant fiscal impact to the General Revenue Fund and the State Transportation Trust Fund. See section V. Fiscal Impact Statement.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2018

II. Present Situation:

Section 320.08(4)(n), F.S., provides a restricted agricultural license plate available for truck tractors or heavy trucks, not operated as for-hire vehicles, engaged exclusively in transporting raw, unprocessed, and nonmanufactured agricultural or horticultural products within a 150-mile radius of its home address. The annual fee for the plate is:

- \$87.75 if such vehicle’s declared gross weight is less than 44,000 pounds; or
- \$324 if the vehicle’s declared gross weight is 44,000 pounds or more and such vehicle only transports:
 - From the point of production to the point of primary manufacture;
 - From the point of production to the point of assembling the same; or

- From the point of production to a shipping point by rail, water, or motor transportation company.

For these purposes, “not-for-hire” means that the owner of the truck must also be the owner of the raw, unprocessed, and nonmanufactured agricultural or horticultural product or the user of the farm implements and fertilizer being delivered. The DHSMV may require any documentation deemed necessary to determine eligibility before issuance of this restricted license plate.

Generally, a truck tractor or heavy truck, which does not qualify for such restricted plate, is required to pay an annual registration fee that can range from \$60.75 to \$1,322, depending on the vehicle’s overall gross weight.¹ Portions of annual license registration fees are deposited into the General Revenue Fund² and the remaining are distributed to the State Transportation Trust Fund as provided in s. 320.20, F.S.

According to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV), in Fiscal Year 2016-2017, 1,608 trucks registered as restricted agricultural trucks. Of those, approximately 60 percent were over 44,000 pounds.³

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill amends s. 320.08(4)(n), F.S., removing the 150-mile radius restriction on trucks with an agricultural restricted license plate. Instead, truck tractors or heavy trucks that operate *within the state* and otherwise meet the criteria for the restricted plate are eligible for such plate. It is likely that the bill will increase the number of vehicles that qualify for the agricultural restricted plate.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2018.

I. Summary:

SB 796 directs the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) to develop a Florida State Beekeepers Association specialty license plate, establishes a \$25 annual use fee for the plate, and provides the distribution and use of fees collected from the sale of the plate.

The DHSMV estimates programming and implementation for a standard specialty license plate costs \$7,680. The DHSMV is authorized to retain revenues from the first proceeds of sales to defray departmental costs.

The bill takes effect October 1, 2018.

II. Present Situation:

Specialty License Plates

Presently, there are over 120 specialty license plates available for purchase in Florida.¹ Specialty license plates are available to an owner or lessee of a motor vehicle who is willing to pay an annual use fee, ranging from \$15 to \$25, paid in addition to required license taxes and service fees.² The annual use fees are distributed to an organization or organizations in support of a particular cause or charity signified in the plate's design and designated in statute.³

In order to establish a specialty license plate, s. 320.08053, F.S., requires the plate must first be adopted into statute. Upon becoming law:

- Within 60 days, the organization must submit an art design for the plate, in a medium prescribed by the DHSMV;
- Within 120 days, the DHSMV must establish a method to issue pre-sale vouchers for the approved specialty license plate; and
- Within 24 months after the pre-sale vouchers are established, the organization must obtain a minimum of 1,000 voucher sales before manufacturing may begin.

If, at the end of the 24-month pre-sale period, the minimum sales requirement has not been met, the DHSMV will discontinue the plate and issuance of the pre-sale voucher. Upon discontinuation, a purchaser of a presale voucher may use the annual use fee as a credit towards any other specialty license plate or apply for a refund with the DHSMV.⁴

The annual use fees collected by an organization and any interest earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of specified United States Armed Forces and veterans-related specialty plates.⁵ Additionally, organizations must adhere to certain accountability requirements, including an annual audit or attestation document affirming that funds received have been spent in accordance with applicable statutes.⁶

DHSMV Costs Defrayed

The DHSMV is authorized to retain sufficient annual use fees from the sale of specialty plates to defray its costs for inventory, distribution, and other direct costs associated with the program. The remainder of the proceeds collected are distributed as provided by law.⁷

Discontinuance of Specialty Plates

The DHSMV must discontinue the issuance of an approved specialty license plate if the number of valid registrations falls below 1,000 plates for at least 12 consecutive months. A warning letter is mailed to the sponsoring organization following the first month in which the total number of valid specialty plate registrations is below 1,000 plates. Collegiate plates for Florida universities are exempt from the minimum plate requirement.⁸ In addition, DHSMV is authorized to discontinue any specialty license plate if the organization no longer exists, stops providing services that are authorized to be funded from the annual use fee proceeds, or pursuant to an organizational recipient's request.⁹

Florida State Beekeepers Association¹⁰

The Florida State Beekeepers Association, Inc. is a Florida nonprofit organization¹¹ with a mission to provide resources for the improvement of beekeeping, to promote the development of practical beekeeping methods in Florida, and to act in the interest of and as a representative of Florida beekeepers in state and national beekeeping affairs. The Association is also committed to having a honeybee research lab in Florida, and estimates such lab will cost \$3.5 million to build.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill directs the DHSMV to create a Florida State Beekeepers Association specialty license plate, with an annual fee of \$25 to be distributed to the Florida State Beekeepers Association. The organization may use up to 18 percent of the fees for administrative and startup costs, and costs for promotion and marketing of the plate. All vendors associated with the administrative costs shall be selected by competitive bid. The remaining funds may be used for honeybee research, education, outreach, and husbandry, to raise awareness of the importance of beekeeping to Florida agriculture. The bill provides that the Association's board of managers must approve and is accountable for all such expenditures.

The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the DHSMV, with the word "Florida" at the top of the plate, and the words "Save the Bees" at the bottom of the plate.

The bill takes effect October 1, 2018.

Section 1. Paragraph (ffff) is added to subsection (4) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, to read:

(4) The following license plate annual use fees shall be collected for the appropriate specialty license plates:

(ffff) Florida State Beekeepers Association license plate, \$25.

Section 2. Subsection (84) is added to section 320.08058, Florida Statutes, to read:

(b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida State Beekeepers Association, a Florida nonprofit corporation. The Florida State Beekeepers Association may use up to 18 percent of the annual use fees for:

1. Direct reimbursement for administrative costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the development and approval process of the license plate. All vendors associated with the administrative costs shall be selected by competitive bid.

2. Promotion and marketing costs of the license plate.

(c) The remaining funds shall be distributed to the Florida State Beekeepers Association and shall be used to raise awareness of the importance of beekeeping to Florida agriculture by funding honeybee research, education, outreach, and husbandry. The Florida State Beekeepers Association board of managers must approve and is accountable for all such expenditures.

Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
