What is Advanced Air Mobility (AAM)?

- An air-based transportation system primarily utilizing electric vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) aircraft to carry passengers, cargo, or provide services in an urban or regional setting
- This will enable use cases like urban air taxis, simplified air cargo operations, and less expensive air-based emergency services
- These aircraft may operate at "on" or "off" airport locations
- eVTOL aircraft will purportedly be quieter and simpler to maintain than helicopters

Reorganized to an Advanced
Air Mobility Advisory
Committee (AAMAC)

- The FAA recently published new vertiport infrastructure design guidance and pilot certification/operating rules
- Earliest operators are now targeting late **2025** for entry-into-service

- In 2023, SB106 expanded the network to include connections to and through lands of the Florida Wildlife Corridor Act






