



Secret Governor Flights

The Florida Senate passed <u>SB 1616</u> - a public records exemption that will essentially shield all information related to "security and transportation services" for the Governor. Senator Jason Pizzo questioned the bill sponsor about potential impropriety:



"Doesn't the public have the right to know if he (the Governor) hitched a ride on a billionaire's jet who has business before the Legislature?" "If it's for political purposes or for personal purposes - then it's exempt. If it's for official purposes, then we get to know who is involved as long as it doesn't relate to something...that could be used for nefarious purposes."

"Tell me...we're not protecting and covering up the free flights, the favors of donors to the Governor with this bill."

"That's not the reason for this bill."

DEMOCRATIC BILLS ON THE MOVE

LeaderBook's years-long fight for permanent tax exemption for diapers and incontinenceproducts is a highlight of the Florida Senate's tax package!



In recent years, abandoned and forgotten African-American cemeteries have been rediscovered, putting a spotlight on Florida's sordid history of racism and erasure. Senator Powell's SB 430 would create a Historic **Cemeteries Program within the Division of Historical Resources - it passed the Senate Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic** Development unanimously.

On Its Way to the Governor

- SB 130, Greyson's Law, which requires courts to take threats seriously when considering custody arrangements, passed unanimously off the House floor and is headed to the Governor.
- High School Equivalency Diplomas sponsored by over the age of 16 who want to take the GED exam
- Senator Davis's Operation & Administration of the **Baker Act requires DCF to update the handbook**

Passed the full Senate

Senator Stewart's motor vehicle glass bill - <u>SB 1002</u> prohibits "assignment of benefits" agreements and exchanges for anything of value for motor vehicle glass replacement or repair.

Here's a glance at other bills filed by Senate Democrats heard in committee during Week 7:

<u>SB 4</u> - Relief of Maria Garcia by Pinellas School Board - Senator Rouson Claims bill providing relief for Maria Garcia for \$2.8 million. Garcia was struck by a Pinellas school bus in 2018 while walking a crosswalk.

SB 8 - Relief of Leonard Cure/State of Florida - Senator Jones Claimant payment by Leonard Cure for \$817,000 for being wrongfully incarcerated for 16 years.

SB 12 - Relief of Ricardo Medrano-Arzate and Eva Chavez, as personal representatives of Hilda Medrano/Okeechobee County Sheriff's Office Claims bill providing relief for Ricardo Medrano-Arzate and Eva Chavez for \$1.2 million. Medrano-Arzate and Chavez's daughter was struck and killed by Requires the Department of Health to establish a grant program to prevent, care for, and tract sickle coll disease

<u>SB 1046 & 1048</u> - Victims of Reform School Abuse - Senator Rouson

Provides a process for former students of reform schools who were abused to be certified as victims, provides a public records exemption

<u>SB 1292</u> - Parenting Plans - Senator Jones

Creates a rebuttable presumption that equal time-sharing with minor children is in the best interests of the child

SB 1352 - Medicaid Enrollees with Sickle Cell Disease - Senator Rouson

Requires the Agency for Health Care Administration to review if Medicaid enrollees with Sickle Cell Disease are properly covered to meet their needs

SB 1408 - Sickle Cell Program - Senator Davis

treat sickle cell disease

SB 174 - Protection of Specified Personnel - Senator Polsky

Protects justices, judicial assistants, family members, and law enforcement from threats.

SB 528 - Gain-time for Attempted Sexual Offenses - Senator Davis Among other things, eliminates the possibility of gain-time for those convicted of sexual battery.

<u>SB 858</u> - Benefits, Training, and Employment for Veterans and their Spouses - Senator Torres

Establishes the Military Corpsmen and Medics of Florida Program to assist veterans and their spouses

SB 902 & 904 - Safety Standards for Amusement Rides - Senator Thompson Named the "Tyre Sampson Act", requiring inspections on new rides and requiring additional reports and safety precautions for amusement rides

SB 996 - Driver License, Identification Card, and Motor Vehicle Registration **Applications - Senator Berman**

Requires the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to include on the application and renewal forms of a motor vehicle registration, driver license, and identification card an option to make a voluntary contribution of \$1 to Best Buddies International.

SB 1440 - Court Proceedings - Senator Book

Authorizes A/V technology for dependency & delinquency proceedings

SB 1510 - Visiting County and Municipal Detention Facilities - Senator Pizzo Extends current law allowing visitation at correctional facilities to apply to county and municipal detention facilities

SB 1538 - Implementation of the Recommendations of the Blue-Green Algae Task Force -**Senator Stewart**

Requires the Department of Environmental Protection to monitor and reassess their projects

SB 1564 - Year-round School Pilot Program - Senator Stewart Directs the Department of Education to conduct a pilot program relating to the cost and benefits of Year-round School

SB 1578 - Florida Children's Initiatives - Senator Thompson

Clarifies and streamlines provisions related to the Department of Children and Families Florida Children's Initiatives

SB 1606 - Florida Museum of Black History - Senator Powell

Creates a Florida Museum of Black History Task Force and requiring the Division of Historical Resources to oversee the construction of a Florida Museum of Black History

SB 1646 - Commercial Service Airport Transparency and Accountability - Senator Davis Revises legislation enacted in 2020 relating to commercial service airport transparency and accountability
