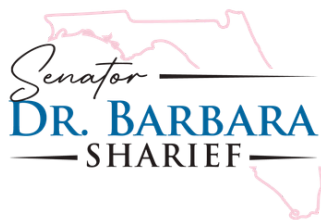

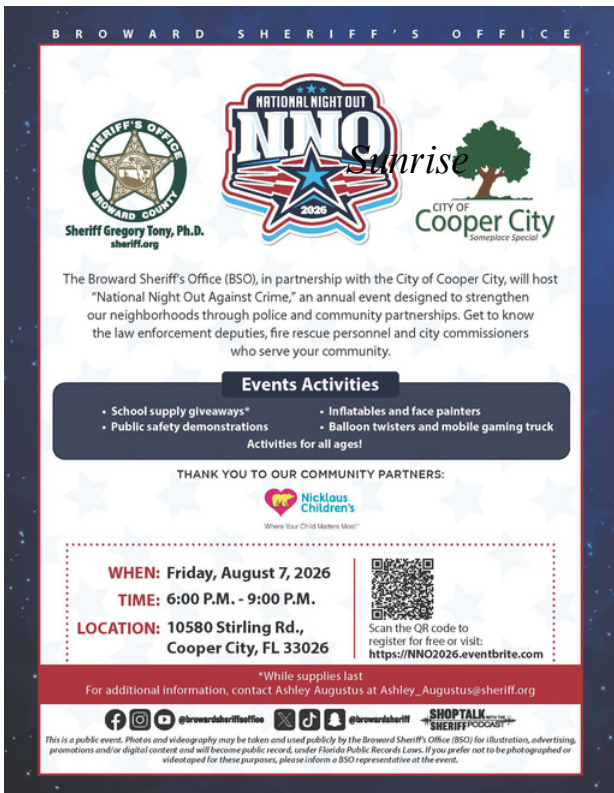

Florida Licensing On Wheels (FLOW) mobile offices provide the following services directly to our communities.

- Original Class E (includes Learner's license and Out of State Reciprocity) (\$48.00) *
- Written/ Skills examinations are not conducted through the FLOW program.
- Renewals (\$48.00 for Class E License - plus \$7.00 per endorsement)
- Replacement license or identification cards services include address/name changes (\$25.00)
- ID cards (\$25.00)
- Original/Renewal Commercial Driver License (\$75.00 plus \$7.00 per endorsement)
- Reinstatements (fees vary)
- Emergency Contact Information Registration (free)
- Vehicle Registration Renewals (fees vary) *
- Disabled Parking Placard Issuance and Renewals (Permanent- free / Temporary- \$15.00)
- Add special designation. (Veterans, Deaf/Hard of Hearing, Developmentally Disabled or FWC) **
