Advancing Women's Health Research

Governor DeSantis signed HB 327: Uterine Fibroid Research Database & HB 1515: Public Record/Uterine Fibroid Research Database into law on May 22nd and June 11th of 2026.

I was proud to sponsor the companion legislation in the Senate alongside Rep. Dunkley, strengthening uterine fibroid research while protecting women's personal health information.



Preserving Florida's Historic Cemeteries

On May 21st, 2026 CS/CS/HB 425: Historic Cemeteries Program was signed into law by Governor DeSantis. I was proud to sponsor the companion legislation in the Senate alongside Representative Aristide.

This bill will help ensure historic African-American cemeteries have additional opportunities to fund their long-term maintenance and preservation.



Strengthening Child Protective Investigations

Families navigating child protective investigations will benefit from stronger medical safeguards through CS/CS/HB 47, signed into law on June 25th, 2026.

Sponsored in the Senate alongside Representatives Robin Bartleman and Patt Maney in the House. This legislation helps ensure certain medical conditions are considered before they are mistaken for abuse.



Investing in Veterans' Oral Health

More Florida veterans will now have access to affordable dental care through the Veterans Dental Care Grant Program.

I was proud to sponsor the Senate companion to Representative Edmonds' CS/HB 253, and with the Governor's approval of \$500,000 in funding, this program can begin serving more veterans in need.
