Back to School Sales Tax Holiday

During the 2019 Session, the Florida Legislature re-authorized our five-day "back-toschool" sales tax holiday so that families can enjoy savings on necessary school supplies.

From August 2nd - August 6th, Florida law directs that no sales tax will be collected on the following purchases:

- Clothing, footwear, and certain accessories selling for \$60 or less per item.
- Certain school supplies selling for \$15 or less per item.
- Personal computers and certain computer-related accessories selling for \$1,000 or less per item, when purchased for noncommercial home or personal use.

Blue Green Algae Task Force

This past Session, Governor Ron DeSantis set forth his bold vision to ensure the protection of Florida's environment and water resources. As part of his Executive Order, Governor DeSantis established the Blue Green Algae Task Force.

The focus of the Blue-Green Algae Task Force is to support key funding and restoration initiatives, and make recommendations to expedite nutrient reductions in Lake Okeechobee and the downstream estuaries. The Task Force will identify opportunities to fund priority projects that build upon DEP's Basin Management Action Plans. The Task Force will also review and prioritize projects that will provide the largest and most meaningful pollutant reductions in key waterways.

The Blue-Green Algae Task Force will be hosting a meeting on **Thursday, August 1st** from 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM at Florida Atlantic University's Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute in the Johnson Education Center (5600 US 1 North, Fort Pierce).

Stan Mayfield Working Waterfronts 2019 Grant Cycle

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection Division of State Lands will be accepting applications for the Stan Mayfield Working Waterfronts (SMWW) Florida Forever grant program. This program was created by the 2008 Florida Legislature and is obviously near and dear to my heart.

The program acknowledges the importance of traditional seafood harvesting and aquaculture industries in Florida. The SMWW program provides grants to local governments and nonprofit working waterfronts organizations for the acquisition of interests in land for the restoration and preservation of working waterfronts. Grant funds may also be used to acquire lands to promote and educate the public about the historic heritage of Florida's traditional working waterfronts.

The grant application cycle will open on August 5, 2019, and the deadline to submit applications is September 20, 2019. Approximately \$2.77 million is available for SMWW grants in this application cycle.

In conjunction with the opening of the 2019-20 application cycle, Florida Communities Trust will hold an application workshop on August 6, 2019, beginning at 10:00 a.m. at the DEP Southwest District Office, 13051 North Telecom Parkway, Suite 101, in Temple Terrace, Florida. The purpose of the workshop is to help potential applicants navigate the application process. The workshop is free and will be available via Skype for those who are unable to attend in person. FDOT Public Meeting: Babcock Street PD&E Study

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will be hosting a public meeting to discuss the Babcock Street/C.R. 507 Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study.

FDOT Public Meeting: Babcock Street PD&E Study Tuesday, July 30, 2019 5:30 PM - 7:30 PM Knights of Columbus 6725 Babcock Street SE, Malabar

The PD&E Study will address capacity and safety issues on a nine mile stretch of Babcock Street/CR 507, from south of Micco Road/Deer Run Road to Malabar Road/SR 514. Following the meeting, FDOT will consider all input received and decide if they will advance an alternative. Alternatives being considered include:

- Widening Babcock St from two to four lanes.
- Adding pedestrian features such as shoulders and sidewalks.
- Adding bicycle lanes.
- Improving intersections at cross streets and adding safety improvements such as pedestrian signals.
- Implementing access management features like median openings and signals.
- The No-Build or "do nothing" alternative is also being considered.

The meeting will be an informal open house format, during which attendees may view project information, speak with FDOT team members to learn more about the project and provide input.
