This past week I had the opportunity to join the Florida State Parks Foundation and Florida Park Service for a tour of Sebastian Inlet State Park. Surfers from around the world flock to the Park to ride "First Peak" and "Monster Hole," but this park is more than just a surfer's paradise.

The tidal cove is a very popular destination for families, and fisherman can be seen lining the pier to catch snook, redfish, bluefish, flounder, snapper, grouper, and Spanish mackerel. The park houses two museums, The McLarty Treasure Museum which features exhibits and artifacts from the 1715 Spanish treasure fleet while the Sebastian Fishing Museum chronicles the history of the area's rich fishing industry.



Sebastian Inlet State Park had over 92,000 visitors last year

and supports 119 jobs locally. Our state parks are an incredibly important resource for our residents. They are also essential for our marine industries, for recreation, and for the vast marine life that they support. FL Dept of Education Seeks Input on State Standards

The Florida Department of Education (FLDOE) is currently reviewing the academic standards for Florida's kindergarten through twelfth grade students. Recently, the Department released a <u>draft of revised standards</u> for public input. This draft is based on feedback they have received over the last several months from Florida teachers, national experts and the education community.

This initiative follows the <u>Executive Order</u>, issued in January by Governor Ron DeSantis, which outlines a path for Florida to improve its education system by eliminating Common Core and revising standards to ensure high quality academic standards.

"Our team has been working tirelessly on the revised draft, and we truly appreciate all of the input we have received from Floridians thus far," said Commissioner of Education Richard Corcoran. "Success is our standard and we are looking forward to hosting the upcoming listening tour to ensure that Florida has the best academic standards in the nation."

Find It Florida!

This past week Governor Ron DeSantis announced the relaunch and expansion of <u>Find It Florida!</u>, Enterprise Florida's commercial property search tool. *Find It Florida!* is a public database for viewing and uploading available commercial building and site properties across the state. This updated site includes improved functionality and a new layer featuring Opportunity Zones.

"We are always working to make Florida the best place to start and grow a business," said Governor DeSantis. "This tool will continue to assist businesses and now investors find commercial properties and sites in Florida, as well as Opportunity Zones, to encourage long-term investment and job growth in communities across our state."

Find It Florida! allows users to search using dozens of criteria combinations and site overlays for infrastructure, education, broadband technology and more. The site also includes up-to-date demographics and statistics for all 67 Florida counties and nearly 1,000 Florida communities.

The Opportunity Zone Program is a tool that provides several tax incentives when investors reinvest gains in qualified Opportunity Funds. The funds must in turn invest in low-income communities from designated census tracts, called Opportunity Zones. For a list of certified Opportunity Zones visit FloridaJobs.org.

District 17 Highlights

SR-A1A Construction in Indialantic & Satellite Beach

If you travel State Road (SR) A1A, you may have noticed that there is new construction that has begun in the Indialantic/Satellite Beach area. The purpose of this project is to increase bicycle and pedestrian safety along the route by constructing 12 Rapid Rectangular Flashing Beacon crosswalks within the median between US 192 (5th Ave) and Atlantic Blvd (just North of SR 518/Eau Gallie Blvd.)

Construction of the new pedestrian crossings will include signs, rapid flashing beacons, crosswalks, curb ramps, lighting, and pavement markings. Sidewalk additions and sod modifications will also occur within the project limits to enhance beach access.

The project was initiated by the Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization and the local municipalities following concerns over the number of accidents in the area involving cyclists and pedestrians. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) held a public hearing to gain public input on the project in July 2018.



FDOT expects the three inside lanes to be barricaded off for six to eight weeks, followed by the outside lanes for an additional six to eight weeks. FDOT has said that the two mile lane closures will allow the project team to work in a larger area, which will result in a faster construction schedule. The project is expected to be completed in February 2020.

Indian River State College Parent Information Night

Indian River State College (IRSC) will be hosting Parent Information Nights to provide parents and students with more information about their Associate Degree, Bachelor Degree and career-training programs.

Earlier this year IRSC was awarded the 2019 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence. The award is the nation's signature recognition of high achievement and performance among America's community colleges.

IRSC offers 17 bachelor degrees designed to provide students with skills to fill high-demand jobs in the region. IRSC has not increased its tuition in six years, which helped the campus earn the Department of Education's distinction as the third most affordable college in the United States.

At the Parent Information Nights parents of prospective students will be provided with details on costs and how to pay for college—including financial aid and scholarship availability. Representatives from IRSC will also share details on how students can earn credit for qualifying scores on AP and IB exams; successful completion of Dual Enrollment classes and Career Pathways academies; as well as Gold Standard Industry Certifications.
