## TORNADO SHELTERING TIPS

When a tornado warning is issued, seek shelter immediately and stay in place until the all-clear.



#### **UNSAFE OPTIONS**

Manufactured housing

Large open rooms, such as gyms

In vehicles & underneath overpasses

**Mobile homes** 

#### SAFER OPTIONS

Interior room of a secure structure away from doors/windows

Bathrooms, closets & center hallways on the lowest floor of your home or office

Underneath something sturdy, such as a heavy table

Covered by a blanket, sleeping bag or mattress to protect your head & body from debris

# If you are in an evacuation zone anywhere in Florida, please be sure to bring your pets with you.

- Include your pets in your evacuation/disaster preparedness plans
- Bring them inside
- Locate pet-friendly shelters in your area in case you need to evacuate
- Be sure to have identification documents for your pet including a photo and their licensed tags

#### **First Aid**

#### First Aid Manual

- Sterile adhesive bandages of different sizes
- Sterile gauze pads
- Scissors
- Tweezers
- Moistened towellettes
- Antiseptic
- Disinfectant wipes
- Hand sanitizer
- Aspirin or other pain reliever

#### Clothing

- Rain gear such as jackets, hats, umbrellas and rain boots
- Sturdy shoes or boots and work gloves

#### **Important Documents**

- Insurance cards
- Medical records
- Banking information
- Copies of social security cards
  - Copies of birth and/or marriage certificates

\*Items should be kept in a water proof container

#### **Food and Water**

#### Food

- Nonperishable packaged or canned food and beverages, snack foods, juices, baby food, and any special dietary items to last at least 7 days
- Water
- 1 gallon per person per day
- Non-electric can opener
- Paper plates, napkins, plastic cups, and utensils

#### **Special Needs Items**

Specialty items for infants, small children, the elderly, and family members with disabilities

#### Vehicle

Keep your motor vehicle tanks filled with gasoline

#### Phone Numbers

Maintain a list of important phone numbers

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POWER OUTAGE PREP TIPS

**BEFORE** 



- Have one or more coolers with ice to preserve your food
- Keep a digital thermometer to quickly check food temperature for safety
- Be sure to have your disaster supply kit stocked with enough food & water for 7 days

**DURING** 



- Keep food safe by leaving refrigerator & freezer doors closed
- Use food from the refrigerator first - food in the freezer will last longer
- Turn off & unplug all unnecessary electrical equipment

**AFTER** 



- Do not touch any electrical or power lines
- Be sure you are using your generator safely - outdoors and 20 ft. away from the house
- Keep generators dry and use them on a flat, hard surface

### PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION ACCESS PRIOR TO A DISASTER

Individuals may refill prescription medications in advance for at least a 30 day supply if they live in a county that is:

- Under a hurricane warning issued by the National Weather Service
- Declared to be under a State of Emergency in an Executive Order issued by the Governor
- Has activated its emergency operations center
