FLORIDA RANKS 49TH OUT OF 50 FOR LENGTH OF TIME NEEDED TO PAY OUT UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS.

Florida taxpayers paid Deloitte \$77 million to create our unemployment benefit website and it is a complete failure. Now the state is forcing taxpayers to pay Deloitte another \$135 million for a new contract. This senate bill forces corporations to have transparent and competitive contracts that require full accountability and prohibits contracting with any vendor who has clearly failed to do their job.

Diabetic Protection Act

(Senate Bill 786 - Prescription Insulin Drugs)

Insulin is a life-saving drug but because of price gouging by drug manufacturers a \$10 vial can cost a patient up to \$275. This senate bill will cap insulin copays at \$100 a month for all prescriptions to manage diabetes.
