

# The Arrington Articles Session Recap

Hello

As of May 2nd, we officially reached Day 60 of the 2025 Legislative Session, but the work isn't over yet. With legislative leadership still finalizing the state's budget framework, lawmakers will need to return to Tallahassee to complete and vote on the budget for the 2025–2026 fiscal year.

The 60-day mark signals that all legislative bills that were not passed by the end of session have died and will no longer be heard, except for a few designated for special consideration this year. Below is a recap on how some of our bills moved along with insight into some of our budget requests. We will be keeping you up to date on all things budget, so stay tuned!

## **Bill Updates**

We had **two bills** fully pass the House and Senate and **one resolution** adopted. CS/SB 1378 was signed into law this past

- <u>SB 274</u> Transportation Facility Designations/Harris Rosen Way and Geraldine Thompson Way
- <u>CS/SB 1378</u> Leaving the Scene of a Crash Involving Only Damage to Vehicle or Property
- SR 1890 Bob Graham Day

We had two bills pass through all their committee stops and the Senate floor, but they did not have any movement in the House.

- <u>SB 280</u> Candidate Qualification
- <u>SB 1152</u> Specialty License Plates/Florida Wildflower

We had three bills that passed through some of their committees, but ultimately did not have any further movement.

- <u>SB 218</u> Tax Exemption for Disabled Ex-Servicemembers
- <u>SB 336</u> Educational Dollars for Duty Program
- <u>SB 1732</u> Criminal Justice

While we had several promising bills fail to reach the finish line this year, our team is working diligently to workshop these bills for future sessions.

## **Budget Requests**

Although the budget is still being finalized, we're excited to highlight a few key projects—especially one that has already received full funding in both the House and Senate budgets!

#### \$500,000 for Came to Believe Recovery Addiction Recovery Pilot Program

The projects below are currently in **both** versions of the budget, but are funded at differing amounts. With the budget process still ongoing, their funding amount is subject to change.

- Storm Water Improvements for Kissimmee and St. Cloud
- Road Improvements for Columbia Avenue
- Funding for Community Engagement in Kissimmee
- Funding for Hopkins Park Community Center in St. Cloud
- Funding for The Transition House for homeless veterans assistance
- **Research Funding** for the Indian River Lagoon and human trafficking prevention
