UPCOMING LEGISLATION

As the legislative session gets underway, our office is hard at work advancing a robust agenda, managing 53 bills covering various issues. From consumer protections to public safety, each piece of legislation reflects our commitment to serving constituents and addressing key challenges facing our state. This week, four bills made it past their first committees. On Wednesday, I joined several of my colleagues for a press conference where we addressed the topic of property taxes. SB 852 would require a study to see if property taxes could be eliminated here in Florida.
