10			New	EVERGLADES RESTORATION. - (1) If during the 2018-2019 fiscal year, leases, reservations of possessory estates, or other farming property interests expire on lands owned or controlled by the state or the South Florida Water Management District which have been identified as being necessary for an EAA reservoir project, the district shall execute, renegotiate, extend, or amend agreements, including reasonable notice and termination provisions, so that the land does not sit fallow and provides the maximum public benefit. Any such agreements shall provide that agricultural operators shall be permitted to continue to farm on a field-by-field basis until such time as the agricultural operations are incompatible with site preparation, on-site investigation, or construction for an EAA reservoir project, as reasonably determined by the lessor.
