<u>This project seeks to remove accumulations of Muck from the Indian River Lagoon system by dredging. This</u> <u>Indian River Lagoon Environmental Restoration Muck Dredging project will remove about 2 million cubic yards</u> <u>of muck soils from within the Indian River Lagoon system and associated tributaries. The project will reduce</u> <u>nutrient loading to the IRL system and is essential to protecting and restoring the health of the estuarine</u> <u>network.</u>

Removal of about 2 million cubic yards of muck from the Indian River Lagoon system
