The Florida African American Heritage Preservation Network serves as the largest consortium of African American museums and historic sites in Florida, operating as a Network of 35 entities to restore, preserve, interpret and serve as destinations for tourists as well as inspiration places for the communities is which they are located, from Pensacola to Key West. Activities supported by an appropriation enhances the ability of Network staff to revitalize communities through job creation and retention, generate new revenue for businesses through preservation projects and programs and promote Florida as a destination through heritage education and tourism. The appropriation provides direct support to its member sites in the form of technical assistance, professional development, provision of student interns, cultural and historical amenities to develop and present exhibits, maintain collections and engage the public in family oriented cultural programs.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Conducting historical research and publishing tourism user-friendly materials; collecting and caring for collections; collaborating with schools and districts to develop curriculum and lessons that teach African American history; providing Network executives and staff with professional and skill development training; providing student internships and serving as "subject matter experts" to other museums and institutions seeking assistance with African American topics, programs and discussions.

d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Community revitalization through cultural, educational and economic enhancement opportunities; local job creation including hiring and retention of museum staff, provision of internships (student support), consultants, and work for hire contracts. Local businesses will receive new revenue as a result of contracts for services e.g. printing companies, graphic design shops, art material stores, utility companies, transportation businesses, hoteliers (bed nights), etc. The public in general will gain knowledge of the state's history, participate in its manufacturing and promotion and support of state tourism initiatives.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Network programs are targeted to serve tourists in general, state and local residents and other stakeholders through partnerships and collaborations – of Statewide impact. Expected to serve over 530,370 visitors.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

To generate new and return visitors to Florida Network and other Museums, and to historic sites, through ongoing programs and marketing. To help showcase Florida as a model of excellence in combining culture, commerce and community as a viable catalyst for educational and economic growth. To positively impact the local and regional economy through patronage of businesses for goods and services. The outcome will be measured as follows: sign in visitor logs, website visits, consistency of days open and programs provided on a

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continuous basis and the number of dollars in new revenue generated based on a customized survey that captures pertinent data, completed by each receiving museum and extrapolated by a professional research firm.

 Expectation is to fully meet deliverables and performance measures as in prior funded years. The program is audited by the Florida Department of State and quarterly monitoring of financial and program reports are provided to the agency.
