d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Choir rehearsal and study hall take place three days a week: Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from 4:30 until 7:30 p.m. in the Band Room of the Goodwill Shelter Prosperity Center. All services are free to members of the Choir. Upon arrival for rehearsal, each boy has a nutritious snack and begins working on school assignments and projects. If a choir member cannot complete his homework, a college intern or another choir member will help. In turn, this individual is expected to help another who might be struggling in a different area. Through this "pay-it-forward" cascading leadership, members bond in a health way that allows each to experience both roles of leader and follower. The Boys' Choir offers a mentoring program to help develop and maintain positive and helpful adult relationships. This mentor is simply a wise and trusted friend with a commitment to provide guidance and support for the mentee to develop their fullest potential based on their vision for the future.

  Young men ages 8-18 in low-income households; 50 young men.
