Advanced traveler information systems are the signs that suggest travelers tune their radio to receive important information such as road conditions or alternative routes. Florida uses these signs along most major interstates and the Turnpike. FDOT commissioned an independent study recently by the University of Central Florida that suggested continued investment in upgrading current sites to be compatible with smart phones and expanding along major evacuation routes would be beneficial to the traveling public. Given the number of storms that the state has recently experienced, and FDOT's shift to Emergency Shoulder Use (ESU), there is a case to be made that this type of communications technology is highly beneficial, particularly along major evacuation routes (I-10 & I-75), and along the Turnpike.
