### 11. Program Performance:

#### a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

To acquire a 60 acre parcel that is located at the headwaters of the Little Wekiva River. Of the 60 acres, approximately 10 acres is active wetlands necessary for aquifer recharge. This parcel is in immediate danger of being clear cut for development. The alteration of hydrology will affect parcels down river including those adjacent to the Little Wekiva River along Markham Woods Road in Lake Mary, Florida.

#### b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Once the 60 acres is purchased, the parcel will be turned into a nature park to educate low-income children in the surrounding neighborhoods about the necessity of wetlands, how they function, how they replenish the drinking water for the state, how they serve as habitat for many endangered and threatened species. Catwalks will be installed around the wetlands for viewing and peaceful reflection.

#### d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

These wetland headwaters of the Little Wekiva and the Wekiva Rivers are critically important to maintaining the water quality of the Wekiva River and to recharging Wekiva Springs, the Wekiva aquifer, and springshed per scientific findings by state and local agencies. Direct services provided to citizens through the purchase of the Little Wekiva River headwaters include 1) the ability to improve and maintain the water quality of the critically important Little Wekiva River 2) ensuring the existence of one of the few last remaining green corridor habitats utilized by many species of Florida wildlife that people enjoy viewing, 3) protecting groundwater and aquifer recharge water that is critically important to Central Florida citizens, all of whom rely upon the Floridian Aquifer.

#### e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes residents in the Little Wekiva River Basin, the Wekiva Springshed, and the Wekiva Study Area which consititutes over 500,000 individuals and also includes several financially disadvantaged minority neighborhoods that will be served by this project. These minority neighborhoods will be severly negatively impacted if the Little Wekiva River Headwaters and its wetlands are not purchased and protected.

# f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

These Wekiva headwaters are a critically important component of the Wekiva River Basin and Springshed which provides groundwater to the Wekiva springshed and recharges Wekiva Springs and the Floridan aquifer in Central Florida. Per the state, these headwaters are a site where the aquifer recharge areas are most vulnerable and vulnerable. The expected benefit of this project is that the purchase of these Wekiva headwaters will ensure the continued provision of critically significant amounts of water that maintain the water quality of the federally and state protected Wekiva River. They are also sites that replenish Wekiva River groundwater supply and recharge the Floridan aquifer. The educational benefit to the children from low-income neighborhoods surrounding the parcel is immense. This nature park will provide the solace for children



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necessary to develop interaction with their community and see that they themselves are part of an interwoven ecosystem.
