Along with a greater reliability in utilities, the city will be able to protect the Myakkahatchee Creek and Cocoplum Canal from potential pollution, which are City drinking water sources.

 This project will impact more that 200 properties. The overall water and wastewater expansion project is expected to serve 45,000 platted lots.

By eliminating septic systems, citizens of the City of North Port will have access to cleaner water in both their home and community. Further, this project will have positive impact on the City's natural resources and increase fire protection.
