**1. Title of Project:** City of Pembroke Pines Elevated Rescue Platform

**4. Project/Program Description:**

The City of Pembroke Pines needs a new elevated firefighting platform/elevated rescue vehicle. The current vehicle is 20 years old, has approximately 100,000 miles and is often inoperable due to repair parts being unavailable. The City has approximately 254 buildings three stories or taller. An elevated firefighting platform is essential for effectively fighting fires on upper floors and is crucial for the rescue of trapped individuals in residences over two stories. Pembroke Pines is home to a large number of retirees, many who live in seven story complexes. The vehicle we propose will have a 105 foot reach with a 3 person bucket on the tip and the ability to pump 2,000 gallons of fire suppressing water per minute. Those specifications will insure our ability to either rescue multiple trapped persons and/or apply an appropriate amount of water to extinguish a burning elevated structure in our community, including surrounding cities that we serve through mutual aid agreements.

Purchase a replacement firefighting elevated rescue platform to effectively fight fires in buildings that have two or more floors.

Purchase a replacement firefighting elevated rescue platform with 105 foot reach and 3 person bucket with the ability to pump 2,000 gallons of fire suppressing water per minute.
