#### **11.** Program Performance:

#### a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Florida Stroke Registry aims to improve quality of stroke care statewide through the comprehensive data collection and analysis of stroke performance metrics, outcomes, and racial-ethnic, sex, and geographic disparities in stroke care performance metrics in Florida.

#### b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Florida Stroke Registry will improve the quality of acute stroke care by providing 1) annual hospital-specific reports and annual statewide reports to track, measure, and benchmark hospital performance measures; 2) customized county-specific reports which will inform transportation policy towards improving Emergency Medical Services to enhance the quality of stroke care; 3) initiatives/interventions to address gaps in quality of care; and 4) education on the use of data-driven best practices.

#### c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Improved quality of stroke care for all Floridians will result through the continuous improvement of hospital systems, and the provision of education, training, and intervention materials for best practices for healthcare professionals.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target populations include: hospital systems of care, health professionals (clinicians, administrators, stroke coordinators, case managers, policy advocates, and academics), stroke patients and caregivers, and stroke advocacy groups. Direct collaboration will occur with over 82 currently participating Florida hospitals.

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e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefits include improvement of hospital performance measures, enhancement of quality of stroke care, and reduced disparity gaps in stroke care among Floridians - all of which could result in a reduction of healthcare costs associated with the disease of stroke. Outcomes will be measured through data-driven results provided as Annual and Regional reports. Annual reports are developed for each participating hospitals to track, measure, and benchmark their quality of care performance. Regional reports are developed to meet the needs to track and measure endovascular therapy which, since 2017, has become the new standard in stroke care. Regional reports will also provide data-driven insight on gaps and improvements at a finer geographic and local (county-wide) focus.
