When Somerset Academy Incorporated was chosen to run the entire school district in Jefferson County it became apparent that there would be some unique challenges to serving the students in a largely rural and economically challenged environment. The bus fleet in the school district is aging and non compliant with state student transportation standards. In order to meet the needs of the students and to provide opportunities for additional before and after-school tutoring, counseling for students and families, academic enrichment and advancement and emergency management transportation for hurricanes a complete overhaul of the student transportation system is necessary. This overhaul will include the purchase of new buses, hiring of drivers, and a new bus coordinator.

To increase student achievement and provide safe transportation and counseling services to children in an economically disadvantaged student population.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities and services that will be provided include: tutoring before and after-school, counseling services for students and families, academic enrichment, activities and sports for PreK-12th grade students and emergency management transportation to hurricane shelter for Jefferson County residents in case of emergency.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Tutoring instruction in reading, math, science, social studies and technology, transportation and face to face counseling.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population will be approximately 850 PreK-12 12th grade students. In the case of shelter transportation and family counseling approximately 250 individuals.

The expected benefit from the project will be improved student achievement measured through the K-12 FLDOE State Accountability System, Family engagement measured through parent counseling and meeting logs and improved transportation to hurricane shelter measured through shelter registration information.
