Funding in the amount of \$400,000 is needed to cover the "last dollar" scholarships and academic assistance for a cohort of 100 students up to \$3,000/student, and for academic support services in the amount of \$1000/student for the 2019-20 academic year. To that end, the program will provide all "Promise" students with an array of academic supports, such as academic advising and coaching, supplemental instruction, tutorial and small group study sessions, and personalized mentoring. 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Edward Waters College expects that "Promise" students will, on average, perform at or above the mean grade point average of their cohort Class of 2023, and will show higher retention rates from their first to second year of matriculation. This, of course will translate into higher 4-year and 6-year graduation rates for this cohort of "Promise" students in 2023 and 2025 respectively.
